

INDIANAPOLIS CROSSROADS AIR SHOW Unit Encampment**Frequently Asked Questions**

Q: Who is eligible to register for the Air Show Encampment?

A: Scouts BSA, Venturers, Explorers, and their registered adult leaders may register for the Encampment. Cub Scouts cannot participate in the Encampment but are encouraged to be a part of the Air Show during the day.

Q: When and where is check-in for unit Encampment participants?

A: Check-in for the Encampment will take place on Friday, October 27, 2023 from 2:00 PM to 8:00 PM at Camp Belzer.

Q: Our unit can't make it to Belzer by 8:00 PM on Friday. Can we check-in later?

A: Later arrivals will be accommodated within reason. Units arriving after 8:00 PM need to notify the Encampment staff advisor at Aaron.Vikemyr@crossroadsbsa.org or (317) 813-7078

Q: Where is the Encampment site?

A: Camp Belzer Activity Field. Parking will be in the main parking areas of camp. Additional overflow parking will be at the Golden-Burke Scout Center - Crossroads of America Council, BSA.

Q: Will we be able to drive to the Air Show from the Encampment site?

A: No. Traffic must be kept to a minimum as a courtesy to the town Air Show/Attendees. The only exceptions will be for disabled persons. Prior permission must be granted in writing by Air Show staff.

Q: How do we get to and from the Encampment site to the Air Show?

A: All transportation to and from the encampment site will be provided. During Air Show hours, however, transportation to and from the Encampment area will be limited.

Q: Can our unit request a specific area to tent in?

A: No, unit tenting areas will be assigned on a first-come, first-serve basis and based on the space requirements of each unit. Time spent at the Encampment is very limited.

Q: Do we need unit camping gear, like dining flies or cooking equipment?

A: No. Meals are provided, so no cooking equipment is required. All gear must be walked-in to tent sites once on Encampment grounds, so each individual should only bring enough gear that he or she can carry.

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Q: Are encampment participants expected to help at the Air Show? Doing what and how long?

A: Yes. The particular tasks and duration will depend on the needs at the time of the Air Show. Units will be assigned their jobs and times at encampment check-in, and units that have signed-up to run concessions are covered. Don't worry; participants will have plenty of time to enjoy the Air Show.

Q: Are fires allowed?

A: No. This is a low-impact and "Leave No Trace" event.

Q: How does my unit register for the encampment?

A: Registration for the encampment must be done online through [crossroadsbsa.org/crossroads-air-show/encampment/](https://www.crossroadsbsa.org/crossroads-air-show/encampment/) Only one person from each unit should be responsible for registering for this event.

Q: Can participants register individually for the encampment?

A: No. Registration for the Encampment is done on a unit basis only.

Q: Can we add participants after our unit has done an initial online registration?

A: Yes. The person responsible for registering your unit for the encampment must have an account which enables him or her to edit an existing registration when logged-in. To edit an existing registration, click the link at the bottom of the main registration page.

Q: Are there any late fees and when does registration for the encampment end?

A: No. Registration for the Encampment ends September 29, 2023.

Q: I'm an approved volunteer for the Air Show for the entire weekend. Can I camp at the encampment site, do I need to pay a fee, and how do I register?

A: There is no cost for your unit to camp at the encampment. If your unit is planning on staying at the encampment, please have your unit register you for the encampment online. Other volunteers will need to express their interest to stay at the encampment to Aaron Vikemyr at Aaron.Vikemyr@crossroadsbsa.org or 317-813-7078

Q: Are medical forms required for the encampment?

A: Yes, a completed BSA Annual Health & Medical Record (Parts A & B) is required for each participant (youth and adult) and copies will be collected upon check-in. Part C of the form (the physical examination) is not required but recommended. All forms will be returned on Sunday when the unit checks out.
