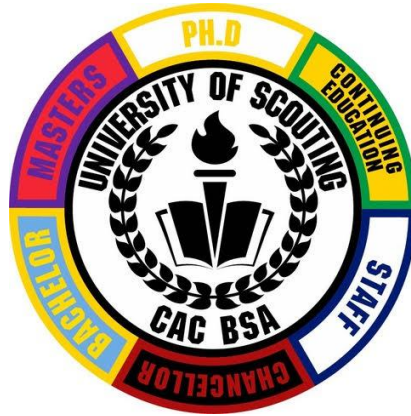




2026 University of Scouting Track Schedules by Period

Learning Tracks at the University of Scouting

Courses are organized into learning tracks to help participants focus on areas that match their role and interests in Scouting. Each track groups related sessions, making it easier to follow a path that builds knowledge and skills in a structured way. Participants are not required to take every course in a track, these are suggestions to simplify registration. When registering, tracks are offered as *bundles* to make course selection more convenient.

Doctoral Candidates Track
