Game Design

A note from the instructor:

Dear Scouts, I'm excited to announce that our upcoming Game Design Merit Badge class will not focus on computer game design but rather offer you the opportunity to design your own board games. We understand that not everyone will be able to bring their own components, so we will provide some for you. If you decide to do a computer game, you will need to bring your own computer and accept the risks of damage to your equipment.

Before we delve into the details, please be aware that there are two prerequisites, 1 and 2, which you must fulfill in order to participate. These prerequisites are not optional and must be completed prior to attending the class. Please make sure to have both of them written out and ready.

During Requirement 4 of our class, we will explore various variations of the game "checkers." This activity will help you gain a deeper understanding of game mechanics and strategy.

For Requirement 5, it is crucial that you have your base game rules written out and submitted to the counselor at least two weeks in advance. This will allow us to review and approve your concept before you start creating the prototype. Highlight: Remember that your merit badge counselor's approval is mandatory before moving forward.

To assist you in fine-tuning your designs, I will spend some individual time with each Scout. However, if you are from the same troop, you are welcome to work in groups. Please note that bringing your own components is encouraged but not required. You can use existing board games or even repurpose materials from secondhand stores (like Good Will) or items you have at home.
