Competition Events

Event 1: Make a Fur Stick 1pt

This must be completed before fire starting.

Event 2: First Aid Using BSA Neck Scarf

5 events worth 1 pt for each correctly done.

- Bandage on arm using square knot.
- Tourniquet on arm.
- Knee
- Ankle
- Head

Event 3: Log Toss

Distance:

10' 1 pt

20' 2 pts

30' 3 pts

40' 4 pts

50' 5 pts

Add patrol score divided by 5= avg. points awarded on avg.

Event 4: Log Cutting Relay

Each Scout must saw for a minimum of 30 seconds.

Must cut 6 inches into the log.

Score based on fastest time.

Event 5: Knot Tying

Scored based on fastest time and number of correct knots.

- Square Knot
- Clove Hitch
- Taut Line Hitch
- Two Half Hitches
- Sheet bend

Event 6: Fishing

Fishing: Fishing poles, bait, and equipment will be provided for this event. (This is Catch and Release)

- Fish 1pt
- Length 1pt
- Mishandling fish -1pt

Event 7: Set Up Tent

Timed event. Fastest time and tent set up correctly.

Event 8: Fire Building

- Timed event
- Fire must burn 2 minutes on its own after being started.
- Can only use what can be found or provided to start fire. No fire kits
- Use fur sticks that were made to start fire.

History Behind This Event

The Peshewa Competition Camporee, Is named to pay respect to Chief Peshewa also known as “Wildcat” or (Jean Baptiste Richardville). Born 1761 Kekionga (Now Ft. Wayne)- Died Aug 13, 1841. The richest Indian at that time in the region, that later became Indiana.

What makes this area so important is that you will be camping on his tribal ground and all events will take place their also. You are not far from his home, 7 Pillars where the Miami still perform ceremonies today.

Remember this is an area the Indians, French, and English pioneers played games.
