Refunds: The Refund Request Form must be used, and this written request must be submitted to the Council office not later than 30 days following a unit's camp session. The Refund Request Form must be filled out in its entirety and must be signed by the Scoutmaster. Leader fees are refundable under the same conditions as Scout fees. If a unit leader (Cubmaster, Scoutmaster and/or Unit Treasurer only) feels their unit is owed funds from overpayment of registration fees, non-credit for popcorn and/or council camperships, special credit offerings from the Coronado Council, and not limited too. They must submit the Refund Request Form to the Council office not later than 30 days following their unit's camp session. Requests after 30 days following their unit's camp session will not be reviewed for consideration.

Reminder!! Requests can be made directly to the Coronado Area Council, but not later than 30 days following their session. **ALL** refunds will be issued by August 31, 2023. Camperships & Popcorn Scholarships will be deducted prior to the 50% Refund be figured.

In an emergency, it may not be possible for a parent(s) /guardian to sign the release. In this event, sufficient information must be recorded attesting to the telephone call or means of communication by which word arrived, asking for the release of the youth. This information should document the person from whom the call was received, and give detailed reasons for the requested release.
