Since its beginning, the Boy Scouts of America has encouraged outdoor adventures as learning experiences. In that tradition, Kansas Sea Base (KSB), an inland water safety and merit badge program was developed by the Konza District of the Coronado Area Council, Boy Scouts of America. The program is cosponsored by the Blue Valley Yacht Club and the Blue Valley Youth Sailing Foundation. By attending Kansas Sea Base, a Scout can earn a boating merit badge, learning how to operate a particular kind of vessel properly and safely, and have a great time participating in one of the greatest forms of recreation to experience the outdoors.

WHO CAN ATTEND?

Kansas Sea Base is open to Scouts who are least 13 years old and are blue swimmers. The Watersports merit badge in particular will be a good workout for the Scouts taking it on. At least one registered adult leader must be present for every 8 youth. Adults will supervise and be responsible for the youth they have brought to the event. *Due to the nature of our program, we CANNOT accommodate non- participating youth or siblings.*

PROGRAMS OFFERED?

Scouts may choose to work on **Small-Boat Sailing**, **Motorboating**, **Kayaking**, or **Watersports** merit badges. Only 1 class will be available per Scout.

COSTS AND REGISTRATION?

Register online at https://scoutingevent.com/192-84672. All attendees must bring a complete health form to be turned in at check-in on Friday night. Fee includes meals and patch.

Regular though July 7th, 11:59pm - Youth: \$50.00 (Starting July 8th, 12:00am - \$60.00) Adult: \$40.00 (Starting July 8th, 12:00am - \$50.00)

T-shirts are available when registering for an additional \$15.00 S-XL, \$17.50 XXL, \$18.50 XXXL. Shirts must be ordered by July 19^{th} and will be handed out at check-in on Friday night.

MEALS?

Plan to eat dinner Friday *before* arriving at Kansas Sea Base. All three meals and a cracker barrel will be provided Saturday, and breakfast on Sunday. Each participant must bring their own mess kit to eat with. Wash stations will be provided at each meal. Each class will also be assigned to assist the galley with cleaning up after a meal.

LOCATION?

Kansas Sea Base is held on the grounds of the Blue Valley Yacht Club on Tuttle Creek Lake a few miles northwest of Manhattan, KS (7444 W. 59th Ave, Manhattan KS 66503). Scouts and Leaders will be camping in tents following normal BSA policies on sleeping arrangements. BVYC has basic facilities – a shelter and porta-potties – it is not a 5-star resort!

LEADER TRAINING?


Safe Swim Defense and Safety Afloat training will be offered to any adult leaders who would like to take them. Our aquatics instructors on staff will also be available to answer questions about aquatics within the Scouting program.

WHAT TO BRING?

- Health Form
- □ Tent
- □ Sleeping bag/pad
- Mess kit and cup
- □ Water bottle
- □ Toiletries
- Change of clothes

- Insect repellent
- □ Sunscreen, hat, sunglasses
- Water shoes
- □ Merit badge book
- □ Swimsuit
- □ Towel
- Life jacket

We will have extra life jackets on site, but you are encouraged to bring your own (vest style, no inflatables) if you have one. Either water shoes or a pair of old tennis shoes *must* be worn when boating at KSB as the shore and bottom are very rough and rocky where we will capsize and launch boats.



WHAT HAPPENS WHEN?

While at Kansas Sea Base, we will be on "island time" and for the most part the schedule is more like a guideline than a rigid itinerary. However, please plan to arrive by 7 PM if possible so that we can begin on time. Swim trunks should not be worn when uniform is called for - a Scout or Kansas Sea Base t-shirt or other Class B shirt, and shorts for the activity uniform, and your full Scout uniform for Saturday evening flags and Sunday closing assembly.
