Refund Policy

If a Scout needs to cancel their Day Camp reservation before attending, a refund request can be submitted to the council for review. The refund form must be completed and submitted to the Council Service Center no later than 5 days after the end of the camp that was scheduled to be attended.

Refund requests will be reviewed as they are received, and the unit will be notified of the refund decision. If the refund request is approved, the refund will be issued to the registrant. If the registrant is the unit, the unit will be responsible for reimbursing the youth/family. Fees are non-refundable for camp dismissals.

Who Should Attend?

This summer camp experience is open to all Cub Scouts going into 1st through 5th grade.

Parent-to-Child Ratio

Each Pack must provide a minimum of 2 adults for the first 2 scouts at camp, plus 1 additional adult for each additional 4 scouts. The ratio of adults to Scouts must be 1:4, with at least 2 adults to meet the two-deep leadership requirement. **Tigers must have an adult partner with them each day at camp.** If your Pack does not have 2 adults, contact the director, and your Pack will be partnered with another Pack.

Health Forms Required? YES, No Exceptions.

The Official BSA Health Form, Sections A & B, is required for all Scouts and adults and must be submitted during registration on the first day of Day Camp. This form must be completed within 30 days of camp.

The Official BSA Health Form is available online at <https://www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/ahmr/> or as an attachment via the registration link.

You will need to complete Sections A & B of the form and attach a copy of the family's medical insurance card.

Medications and allergies must be noted on the form in the appropriate sections. If your Scout takes medications during the day, please bring them and turn them in to the medical officer with instructions. Day camp is not an appropriate time to stop routine medications. If your Scout has severe allergies to any substance, please bring them to the attention of the medical officer during Day 1 check-in.

What to Bring to Camp?

Each Scout has different needs, but here is what we recommend bringing to Day Camp:

(Please mark all items with the youth's name and Pack number. District/Council volunteers will not be responsible for lost or forgotten items. A lost/found box will be on hand.)

- Cub Scout Day Camp T-shirt (Will receive on the first day of Day Camp)
- If your Scout has any airborne food allergies, please let us know before Day 1 so we can pass the information along as necessary.
- WATER BOTTLE!
- Day Pack or Backpack
- Insect Repellent
- Sunscreen
- Shoes and Socks (no open-toed shoes or Crocs, please)
- Comfortable clothing for the weather
- Health form parts A & B

Health and Safety

Health and Accident Insurance

The Coronado Area Council, Scouting America, currently provides supplemental accident and illness insurance for participants registered with the Council. All accidents and illnesses must be reported to the Day Camp Health Officer, Day Camp Director, and Scout District Executive. The accident or injury must be recorded in the Day Camp Health Log to document care in support of insurance claims. Records will be maintained by the Coronado Area Council Office.

A qualified Day Camp Health Officer will always be on duty.

Weather Emergencies

In the event of severe weather approaching, participants will be notified by the Camp Director to seek shelter. The shelter locations will be announced and identified each day prior to the opening ceremony. In the event of inclement weather, camp may be postponed or even cancelled.

Dress Code

Scouts will be asked to wear their Day Camp T-shirt for the three days of Day Camp. No open-toed shoes or Crocs are allowed. Please dress appropriately for all weather conditions, remember we live in Kansas and at times can experience all four seasons in a single day.

Discipline

The Unit Leader, assistant leaders, and parents are responsible for the discipline and order of their own Scouts. The Camp Staff will not assume responsibility for or interfere with youth discipline unless the issue directly involves the health and safety of Scouts, or the Unit Leaders or parents are not present at the time of the problem. The Camp Director will be notified by the staff member of any problem and will refer the staff member to the parent or the Unit leader. No arrangements may be made to send a Scout home before informing the Camp Director of the situation.

Pets

Pets are not permitted at Camp unless the pet is a Registered Service Animal. If your Scout has an RSA, please let us know before camp starts.

Trash Disposal

Trash bags are provided to help you keep our Camp clean. Dispose of your trash daily by depositing it in any of the trash cans or barrels located throughout the camp. We will leave the camp each day nicer than we found it.

Trading Post

There will be a trading post on-site each day for Scouts to visit. Items include small snacks, drinks, and souvenirs. The trading post will be open during check-in, lunch, and afternoon pick-up. Parents are encouraged to accompany their scout to the trading post.

Frequently Asked Questions

Do we have to pre-register, or can we walk in?

- Please pre-register to guarantee your patch, t-shirt, and enough supplies are available.

We encourage everyone to pre-register so we can prepare for camp and ensure sufficient supplies are purchased in advance.

What age must a child be to attend Day Camp?

- At least 7 years old (or entering the 1st grade in fall 2026) and older. All Tigers (entering 1st grade in fall 2026) must have an adult partner with them at Day Camp. All older children must adhere to the adult-to-child ratio of 2 adults per 8 children.
- Lions (entering Kindergarten in fall 2026) may not attend Day Camp per National BSA policies.

Does a child need to be a registered BSA member to attend Day Camp?

- Yes

Do we sign up for Day Camp as a Pack or as a family?

• Packs/dens are encouraged to register together to ensure adequate adult supervision for their Scouts. If your Pack is not attending Day Camp, you register as an individual Scout, and we will place you with other Scouts from your area.

If we arrive late or leave early, can we still participate?

• Yes, you are welcome to participate anytime but remember that if a presentation or activity is missed, it cannot be caught up on or participated in at another time. Please let the director or your Pack leader know if you will miss time at camp or need early drop-off. Children must be checked in and out of camp by an authorized adult (listed on the Health Medical Form). If you drop your child off, you must pick your child up. This is for the safety of all scouts and families. **No exceptions.**

Can I volunteer at Day Camp?

• Yes! Day Camp is run 100% by volunteers, and we welcome additional assistance. All Day Camp volunteers must be registered with Scouting America, complete safeguarding youth training, and have

background checks completed. If you are interested in attending Day Camp, please email or call the Day Camp director to inquire about what position you could help with.

Can I bring my child under Cub Scout age with me?

- Yes! We plan to establish a tot-lot for children who are not of Cub Scout age but need a place to stay while volunteer parents and their older siblings are at camp. **Please note: This is ONLY for volunteer parents** working at the camp. This is NOT day care. The tot-lot will be available only if we have at least 2 18+ people in charge.
