Leader Guide

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Konza District Webelos Woods

The Konza District Webelos Woods will be held September 25-27, 2026, at **Tuttle Creek State Park, River Pond Campgrounds at Tuttle Creek Reservoir, Manhattan, KS**. The fee for the weekend is \$15.00 per Webelos or Arrow of Light (AOL) Scout and \$10.00 Webelos or AOL leader, pack leader, parent, or guardian, if registered by 11:59 PM on September 18, 2026. Add \$5.00 for registrations after September 18, 2026. Walk-in registrations will be available and handled at check-in Friday night.

All Campers should arrive between 6:00 PM and 8:00 PM on Friday, September 25. Camp teardown should be completed by 11:00 AM on Sunday, September 27. Scouts are encouraged to conduct a brief, non-denominational Scouts' Own Service on Sunday morning.

Webelos Woods is a Webelos and AOL-to-Scouts BSA transition program. It will be an exciting experience for any registered Webelos or AOL Scout. Webelos and AOL Scouts, their leaders, and their parents will have an opportunity to interact with different Konza District Scouts BSA Troops in a camping setting. Webelos and AOL Scouts will work alongside Scouts BSA youth in patrols and participate in hands-on programs activities such as fire building, knots, and cooking. A list of Webelos and AOL Adventure requirements completed can be provided upon request.

Webelos and AOL leaders, parents, and guardians are strongly encouraged to attend a Webelos and AOL-to-Scouts BSA transition session where key differences in the Cub Scouting and Scouts BSA will be explained. Scouts BSA experts will be on hand to answer your transition questions.

Essential Information

We anticipate that approximately 150 Webelos, Scouts BSA, and adults will participate in Webelos Woods. For this reason, it is essential that individuals follow these guidelines.

TWO-DEEP LEADERSHIP IS REQUIRED – At a minimum, two registered adult leaders, age 21 or older, are required in accordance with current Scouting America Youth Protection policies. However, as important transition information will be provided, parent or guardian attendance is encouraged. The weekend is designed as a joint “Scout/Parent or Guardian” experience. A parent or guardian should plan on participating in and observing the activities with their Webelos or AOL Scout the entire weekend. Only registered scouts may participate.

CAMPSITE INFORMATION – Webelos Woods is a two-night program focusing on Webelos and AOL to Scouts BSA transition. Each pack will be assigned to a campsite with a host Scouts BSA Troop. Aside from check-in and a Cracker Barrel (evening snacks) with one of the troops, no formal program activities are scheduled for Friday night. This is the time to set up your camp and have a good time together while getting to know some of the Scouts BSA Troops. You will have the opportunity to engage with different Scouts BSA Troops during the course of Saturday’s activities.

Webelos and AOL Scouts may share a tent together. Webelos and AOL parents or guardians can only share a tent with their child. BSA policy prohibits non-parent/guardian adults and youths sharing tents. BSA policy also prohibits Webelos and AOL Scouts from sharing a tent with Scouts in a Scouts BSA Troop. Webelos and AOL leaders who need tent accommodations should coordinate with their host Scouts BSA Troop prior to the event.

The buddy system will be used. Each Webelos or AOL Scout needs to be accompanied by his or her scout “buddy”, parent, or guardian at all times.

Packs should register as a group, where possible. Supplies for the weekend will be purchased based on registrations. For this reason, refunds cannot be issued to those unable to attend. Substitutions will be allowed, however.

Webelos Woods Meals

All meals are on your own. Please bring appropriate cooking gear. If you need assistance check with your host Troop.

PACKING FOR WEBELOS WOODS

Things each Webelos and AOL Scout MUST bring:

The Annual Health and Medical Record Part A & B must be completed for each attendee and be available at Webelos Woods check-in. This includes all adults.

- ☐ Extra shoes (a good idea if it rains)
- ☐ Field Uniform (Class A Webelos/AOL Scout Uniform) for opening & closing Flag Ceremony
- ☐ Activity Uniform (Pack or other scouting t-shirt) for Saturday's Activities
- ☐ Weather-appropriate outerwear
- ☐ Insect repellent
- ☐ Sunscreen

- ___ Mess Kit
- ___ Water bottle / canteen
- ___ Folding Chair
- ___ Toothbrush, comb, etc.
- ___ Medications (if prescribed) in original containers
- ___ Webelos/AOL Handbook
