KLONDIKE DERBY 2019 This year's Klondike Derby will focus on basic Scout survival and teamwork skills. Each Patrol or "Expedition Group" will follow a course as instructed to the Expedition Leader. The course will take you around our two towns.

All activities must be visited to gain the most points. Scouts should also be prepared to answer Scout knowledge questions to earn additional points.

Scouts shall "be prepared" for cold weather and general first aid, knots, and team work. Bring a Klondike sled, or wagon. There just might be a survival pop-quiz, where you will need to build a shelter using

ONLY what you bring on your sled/wagon, SO BE PREPARED! Expeditions can be groups of up to 8 expeditioners. Any Scout who is deemed to not be properly dressed for the weather will not be allowed to participate.

Campsites we will be using the Hopi Camp site and Kanza Campsites for this weekend.

Who can attend the Klondike Derby? Reference to the Guide to Safe Scouting all Scouts and Leaders registered in Boy Scout Troops may participate in the Klondike Derby. Webelo Scouts may also participate in the Klondike Derby.

Meals

A Cracker Barrel will be provided for leaders, before event starts.

Troops are required to provide their own meals for Saturday Lunch, and Sunday Breakfast. Hot Coco and water will be provided at the Dining Hall during the day, but each Scout and Leader is encouraged to bring their own thermal cup.

Commissioner's Soup, Saturday Dinner for dinner Saturday night we will be having a chili cook off. Each troop is to make their own version of chili, be sure to make enough for your troop plus 4 judges that will be picked at random. Winner will be awarded at the Award Ceremony afterwards, troops can finalize their 60 second commercial over survival, to be to be performed at the awards ceremony.

Town 1 Snow Blind Obstacle Course ·10-8-6-4

Mush Team will be blind folded and will pull their sled through the obstacle course.

Town 2 Log Cutting 10-8-6-4

Each team will cut a piece log with the sawbuck. Scouts will be timed on how long it takes the patrol to cut off a 1" thick

Town 3 fire building 10-8-6-4

Each team will demonstrate their skill at starting and maintaining a fire.
Flint, steel or hand/bow drill. You must bring your own-----cannot use a farris rod.

Town 4 Slingshots

Each team member will see how far they can sling a ping-pong ball, all lengths will be averaged together for a team score!

Town 5 Tomahawk throw

Each member will get to, safely, throw a tomahawk at the target 3 times, the highest score will count. Scores from each scout will be added and averaged!

Team will use tarp to toss nuggets over horizontal rope and catch it in bucket. They will be given 3 tries. 15 tosses- most out of 15

Town 5 Create TV Commercial

10-8-6-4 Team will create 60 second commercial about survival skills. It will be performed during the Award Ceremony.

Town 6-----Winter Survival 10-8-6-4

One member of your team has fallen and broke his leg. Mend the injury and carry them to safety.
