General Information

Camp Boundaries

Unit leaders will keep their Scouts within the fence lines surrounding Avondale Scout Reservation. If one crosses a fence, they are trespassing on our neighbor's private property.

Reservation & Fees

Winter Camp is limited to the first two hundred (200) Scouts. The cost is \$225.00 per Scout for discounted (early) price until September 15, 2026. Starting September 16, 2026, the on-time fee of \$250.00 begins until October 31, 2026. Beginning November 1, 2026, the Late Fee is \$275 until registration closes at the end of November 15, 2026. **There are classes with additional fees. These extra class costs are included when the course is selected. Merit Badges will not be saved until full payment is made. Payments via credit card will include a 3% convenience fee (checks have a 1% convenience fee.)**

All adults attending camp must register as an adult leader or as staff (application on-line). **The adult fee is \$85.00 per adult** (\$100.00 starting September 16, 2026; \$120 starting November 1, 2026). Additionally, an adult BSA application must be completed if the adult is not currently registered with Scouting America.

Health Forms

Scouts and adults attending camp must have a current Annual Health and Medical Record Parts A, B, and C. This is necessary to document the current health status and medications, if any, that the Scout or Scouter is taking. Health forms are returned to units at the end of camp. It is recommended that only copies of the health forms be submitted. (The originals should remain with Troop records.)

Prescriptions for Scouts and adults may be kept at the campsite if they are stored in a secure location accessible only to the adult leaders. Non-prescription medicine, asthma inhalers, and epinephrine can be kept on the camper.

Adult Leaders

Two registered adult leaders, 21 years of age or over, are required with current Safeguarding Youth Training in camp at all times. All adults accompanying the Scouting unit who are present at the activity must be registered as leaders.

One-on-one contact between adult leaders and Scouts is prohibited both inside and outside of Scouting.

ONLY registered Scouts are permitted in the camp. Other children should not be brought to camp. Separate tent accommodations will be maintained for male and female leaders. Leaders may rotate, if necessary, but at least two (2) adults must be with the Troop, 24 hours a day. If it is necessary to leave the camp at any time, leaders need to inform the Camp Director and sign in and out at the Administration Building.

Checklist for Troop Preparation for Winter Camp

Preparation for camp is a straightforward process, but it does require planning ahead. As a Unit Leader, you are the most important link in this preparation. The following timetable/checklist is designed to guide you and your Troop Committee in pre-camp planning for Winter Camp at Camp Avondale.

- The Scoutmaster and/or parents should counsel with each Scout to determine which merit badges a Scout should work on and what requirements need to be completed prior to Winter Camp in order to ensure an excellent rate of completion at camp. (See the **Winter Camp – Camp Avondale – Merit Badges Offered** on the webpage.)
- There are badges which will not be able to be completed at camp. Incomplete merit badges should be completed with a Merit Badge Counselor at the Troop, District or Council level. Any requirements which require a Scout to complete activities over an extended period of time should be completed prior to camp.

Attendance

Attendance at merit badge sessions and projects associated with them is necessary to complete the merit badges. Be sure to select only the merit badges the Scout is willing to work toward – limited schedule changes will be made at camp.

If a merit badge does not have a qualified instructor at the beginning of November, it will be dropped from the schedule.

Check-in and Departure Schedule

Check-in

Please plan to arrive at Camp Avondale between 7:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. on Friday, November 20, 2026. Registration begins at 7:00 p.m. on Friday. Upon arrival, a medical re-check will be required of all campers (Scouts and adults). A qualified health officer will review each medical form with each participant. Any Scout or Scouter without a current completed medical form (Parts A, B & C) will be asked to leave camp until he/she can acquire one. Medical re-checks are not physicals.

Insurance Check

All registered adults and youth of the South Louisiana Council are covered under the Accident and Wellness insurance with HSR. If you are a non-South Louisiana Council member, please provide proof of your policy from your local Council. As a policy reminder, all adults staying overnight with Scouts BSA MUST be registered with their Scout Unit.

Check-Out

Campers are allowed to depart on Wednesday, November 25, 2026, starting at 8:00 a.m. and no later than 10:00 a.m. **Gates will not be open before 8:00 a.m. If you plan to pack up or leave before then you will need to hike your equipment out. Vehicles will not be allowed through the Gate prior to 8:00 a.m.**

Tenting

Each unit/individual is asked to bring unit/personal tents to use at Winter Camp. The camp will not provide tents.

Trading Post:

The Camp Trading Post will be open for your convenience. Items such as candy, soft drinks, warm drinks, ice cream, and various sundry items will be available. Assorted handicraft items are offered along with mugs, patches, and literature including merit badge pamphlets for merit badges being offered in the camp program.

Pets

No pets of any type will be permitted in camp.

Knives

No sheath or fixed blade knives allowed.



Firearms, Ammunition, and Fireworks

The South Louisiana Council will make firearms and ammunition available as needed. A qualified Shooting Sports Director will supervise their use. Campers are **NOT** to bring firearms or ammunition to camp.

No Fireworks of any kind are permitted in the camp at any time, for any reason.

No Alcoholic Beverages or Illegal Drugs are allowed on South Louisiana Council property.

Any violation of these rules may result in the immediate removal from the camp of all involved!

Conduct and Discipline

All Scouts and adult leaders at Camp Avondale are governed by the “**Scout Law**,” “**Scout Oath**” and “**The Outdoor Code**” and will conduct themselves accordingly. The Winter Camp Staff, Scouts and Adult Leaders will strive to provide a safe, wholesome, and moral atmosphere to allow all Scouts the opportunity to enjoy their outdoor experience at Camp Avondale. Adult leaders will keep the Camp Director and Program Director advised of any problems encountered with their Scouts or Scouts from other units.

The Camp Director retains the authority to resolve all disputes involving disciplinary problems with individual Scouts or problems between Scouts of different units. Sanctions will be decided by the Camp Director and may include, but are not limited to, removal from specific programs or removal from Camp Avondale. Violations of criminal law may result in the arrest and prosecution in East Feliciana Parish under the laws of the State of Louisiana. Your campsite is your home and should be respected. Entering or loitering around another’s campsite without permission is not allowed. **The Scout Leader in camp is responsible for the conduct of the Scouts at all times. TAPS is at 10:30 p.m.** All campers are expected to be at their own campsite by this time. Hazing in any form is not permitted. No smoking is allowed in or near any building on camp. Adults may only smoke and only in the main parking lot. No smoking is allowed beyond the Red Gate or the Brown Gate.

Emergency Procedures

In the event of a camp-wide emergency, an alarm will sound. At that time, all camp personnel, campers, and staff will report to field below the Dining Hall for a head count by Unit Leaders. The Unit Leaders will then report to the Camp Director, Program Director, or Camp Commissioner whether their entire Unit is present.

There will be a demonstration of the alarm during the first 24 hours of camp. If the alarm is heard at any other time, **It Is Not a Drill**. Everyone should report as quickly as possible.

Camp Duties

Units are asked to share camp duties. Senior Patrol Leaders can sign up for their Unit.

Flag Ceremonies

Assignments for Flag Raising and Retreat will be assigned after arrival at camp.

Chapel Service

The Camp Chaplin (or designee) will lead Chapel service on Sunday.

Trading Post Bathroom (adult only bathroom)

The Trading Post Bathrooms will be cleaned daily. Cleaning assignments will be assigned at camp.

Campsite Bathrooms/Showers

Campsite occupants are responsible for the cleaning of the bathrooms located within the campsites. Campsites with multiple units should work out a schedule so that this duty is evenly distributed. There are modern flush toilets and showers at each campsite. In keeping with National guidelines, toilets and showers are in separate rooms. Remember to respect all youth privacy in the showers and in the campsite areas. Leaders should be observant of all activities in and around the bathroom facilities for safety concerns, while respecting the youth's privacy. Toilet paper will be furnished in each Campsite Bathroom daily. Please leave the bathroom/shower facility cleaner than you find them.

Leaders' Meetings

Adult Leader Meetings will be held daily, after breakfast with the SPL's, addressing camp activities. The Camp Commissioner will attend the Leaders' Meeting to assist you with any problems you may have.

Food Service

NOTE: Any special dietary needs should be reported to the Camp Director no later than 4 weeks prior to your arrival at camp.

Lost and Found

Lost and found items will be brought to the Trading Post. Encourage all Scouts to mark all possessions with their name and Troop number. At the end of camp all the items will be taken to the South Louisiana Council office.

Provisional Camping

We believe that a Scout's best Winter Camp experience is with their own Troop with Scouts they already know; if this is not possible, a Scout may attend as a Provisional Scout. Provisional Scouts will camp with a Troop with adequate leadership. Each winter, Provisional Camping proves to be a tremendous success. The Provisional Scout program is offered to assist individual Scouts in coming to camp. It is not intended to relieve a Troop Committee of its responsibility to provide leadership in a long-term camp experience, therefore a maximum of three (3) scouts from a unit may come as Provisional. If there is only one (1) leader with the unit we will assign the unit to a campsite with another unit. We urge you to try to bring both Scouts and leaders to camp for the best results.

Provisional Scouts will be expected to check in at the Camp Administration Building at during designated registration check in times. **Online registration forms need to be checked as Provisional Scout and need to be completed by October 1, 2026.**

There will be a closing campfire on the night of November 24, 2026. Be sure to bring your favorite skits, songs or stories.

Dutch Oven Cookoff Competition

Cook a delicious Dutch Oven meal in your campsite and bring the entire Dutch Oven to be judged to the campfire ring. The winning entry will be announced at the campfire. Bring your Dutch ovens, charcoal, and your favorite ingredients. Competition will be held on November 23, 2026. (Location and other details will be discussed at the Leader meeting.)

Patch Trading Event

This year for Winter Camp we will be continuing our Patch Trading event. The event was a hit in previous years so be sure to bring your patches to trade. Do you not have a collection yet? No worries! This will be the place to get started. We will have patch trading gurus on hand to help you get started patch trading. Patch trading will occur during Cracker Barrel activities.

Program

Winter Camp has Something for Everyone!

Each year, we are made aware of the unique needs our Troops bring to Winter Camp. Troop needs, Patrol needs, and the needs of each Scout have helped us plan this year's program. Camp Avondale provides the best outdoors for your Troop. We have a wide array of camp-wide events and activities for your enjoyment.

Rougarou Wrangler: First-Year Camper Program

Specially designed for newly bridged Scouts or beginners to Scouting, our First Year Program, Rougarou Wrangler Program (RWP), provides an easy transition into leaving home for Scout winter camp without the preparation that may be too much for a newly bridged youth. Scouts learn the Patrol Method, and provide time for the first year Scout to earn Merit Badges and participate in activities outside of the RWP area. Tuesday 6 am to 8 am, RWP staff host an optional 5-mile hike (Second Class 3b). Rougarou Wrangler Program Scouts are welcomed, but not required, to participate in this scenic hike. Adults and other Scouts are welcome to participate! We request your troop assign at least one adult to actively work with their Scouts in RWP. This includes observation, assistance with safety, discipline, and participation on the five-mile hike. This is an excellent opportunity for adult leaders to forge a bond with their new Scouts that will last throughout their Scouting rime and well into life.

These hikes will be open to all to participate in and the first hike will be mandatory for our Rougarou Wrangler Crew! The first hike is one (1) mile, the second is three (3) miles and the third is five (5) miles!

Merit Badges

Advancement is one of the methods of the Scouting Program. It teaches new skills, inspires learning, and builds self-confidence and self-esteem. At Winter Camp, merit badges also provide the Scout with the opportunity to make decisions on the amount and type of activities in which they will participate.

As you know, certain merit badges will require either advanced work before camp or follow-up work after camp. Other merit badges will be completed at camp. There are a couple of things we wish to point out to you as you assist your Scouts in their planning.

1. Please Do Not Let the Scout Over-Schedule. Younger scouts come to camp extremely ambitious, and quite often are so wrapped up in the merit badges or advancement programs they forget to have fun! We want the Scouts to go home with a smile on their face and a well-rounded Scouting experience. Remind them that **having fun is a key part** of Winter Camp. We recommend that a Scout sign up for no more than four sessions. This leaves one session available to study, rest, play volleyball or tennis, visit with friends, and visit the Trading Post.
2. Have your Scouts review the merit badge book and the requirements before they come to camp. Once in a while, a Scout chooses a merit badge to work on and finds out too late it is not what they thought it was! Make sure they are prepared and know what to expect before they come to camp. Each Scout should have a merit badge book for each merit badge they select if they expect to complete that merit badge.

Merit Badge Summary

To have a successful merit badge program, your Scouts must begin prior to attending camp. There are badges which can be easily earned in a camping period while others take much longer. Encourage your Scouts to start working early before camp. For every merit badge, the Scout should read the entire merit badge pamphlet so that they are ready to tackle the badge while at camp.

Museum Docent Program

Volunteer opportunity/training to help at the Scouting Museum. Want to help extend the resources at the Scouting Museum at Avondale Scout Base?

During the mornings at Winter Camp, Scouts or adults can work with our museum team to become a guide at the museum. Training is available during morning blocks 1-3.

The Camp's Museum is trying to grow its volunteer staff and help share the history of Scouting in the South Louisiana Council. The Museum Guide (Docent) program will teach museum basics and let the Scout or adult walk through the images and stories of the past. They will teach them the ways to catalog, display and tell stories of the history of Avondale and the South Louisiana Council. For those interested in learning how to set up, run and Staff a museum, this program is for you. Open to youth and adults.

<u>Chess:</u> No pre-requisites, will be earned at camp.
<u>Citizenship in the Community:</u> 13 years old; read merit badge book, bring pre-printed map of the community and govt org chart for your area; #8 completed work sheet can be emailed to counselor after completion, following Safeguarding Youth guidelines. Note: Requirements 5 and 7 are not covered at camp.

<u>Citizenship in the World:</u> No pre-requisites.

<u>Cooking:</u> There are 4 pre-requisites, #2c, #4a-f, #5d-h and #6
<u>Crime Prevention:</u> 2 pre-requisites - #3a and #3b
