

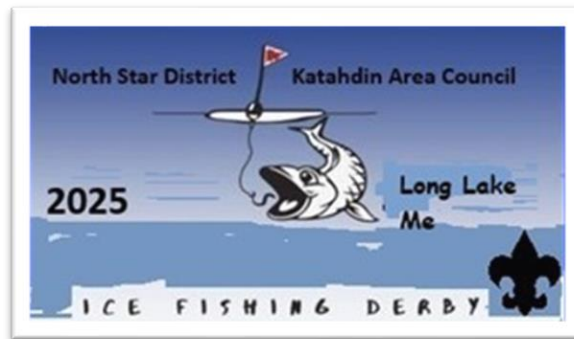

Registration: The registration fee is \$30 per person, which includes fishing gear, bait and lunch. As this is Maine's Free Fishing Weekends (February 14-15, 2026), a fishing license is not required. All Scouts and Leaders are reminded to bring medical forms par A, B1 and B2.

Quick Warm-ups: The Ice Fishing Event will have warming huts available throughout the day. Participants are welcome to come in to warm up.

Toilets: Outdoor toilets are available in the Parking lot of the Long Lake Sporting Club.

Clothing Requirements:

Knowing how to keep dry and warm is critical!

We have seen every kind of weather imaginable during winters in Maine. So, you and your Scouts must BE PREPARED! Please use all Scouting resources, such as the Scouts BSA Field book as your guide in teaching your Scouts to be prepared for winter conditions. If any Scout is not adequately dressed for the weather, he or she will not be allowed to participate in the event.

Winter Jacket

Bring extra Gloves, Hats and Socks

A Thermal layer is recommended

First Aid Station: Immediate first aid for minor injuries is the responsibility of Unit leaders or parents. Medical emergencies require calling 911. Report any injuries to the event coordinator or District Executive.

Weather: Unless the weather reaches critical conditions, the Ice Fishing Event will go on. Call Stephen Hughes at 207-231-4675, if you have any questions.

Meals: A Hotdog lunch will be provided. Hot Chocolate will be available all day. Any additional snacks or drinks will be the responsibility of the Units or leaders

Fishing Gear: All fishing gear and bait will be supplied. If Units and Families have their own fishing gear it is **strongly recommend** that they bring your gear. Fishing gear will be limited.

Packing Information

What Keeps You Warm?

You keep you warm. Your body produces all the heat that you need. Your clothing needs to be designed to hold in the heat that you need to feel comfortable under all conditions we might encounter. Our clothing needs to be loose and layered so that we might regulate our comfort level during various activities. Our clothing should never restrict blood circulation as that is the conduit which takes heat from the core of the body and distributes it to the extremities.

COLD

C= CLEAN

Keep yourself and your clothes CLEAN! Dirt and body oils which build up on clothing destroys its insulation properties.

O= OVERHEATING

Avoid OVERHEATING! Wear clothing so that you might maintain an even body temperature. Stay comfortably cool.

L= LAYERS

Wear clothes loose and in LAYERS!

D= DRY

Keep DRY! Wet clothing removes body heat 240 times faster than dry clothing. Keep Dry!

Personal Equipment List

When packing for cold weather outings consider each part of the body. Insulating clothing should be insulated with man-made fibers such as Thinsulate or made from Polar Fleece (polypropylene) or Wool, as these materials will retain some insulating value even when wet. Leave cotton jeans, sweatpants, sweat shirt, etc. at home. Cotton kills in the winter.

2 Hats

Water Bottle

2-3 pair Mittens and/or Gloves and covers

Eating items (Cup, Bowl, Spoon, Knife all preferable plastic)

2 Sweaters/ Shirts (preferably wool or poly)

Sunscreen, Chap Stick, etc.)

1 Jacket or Coat

First Aid Kit

1-2 Long Underwear Top and Bottom

Sunglasses

3-4 pair Wool Socks

Pocket Knife, Flashlight Pencil, Paper,

1 Ski Pants/ Outer later that is water resistant

Backpack

Warm Boots preferable with removable lining

Handkerchiefs

Scarf's, Neck Gators, Face Masks, etc. *optional
