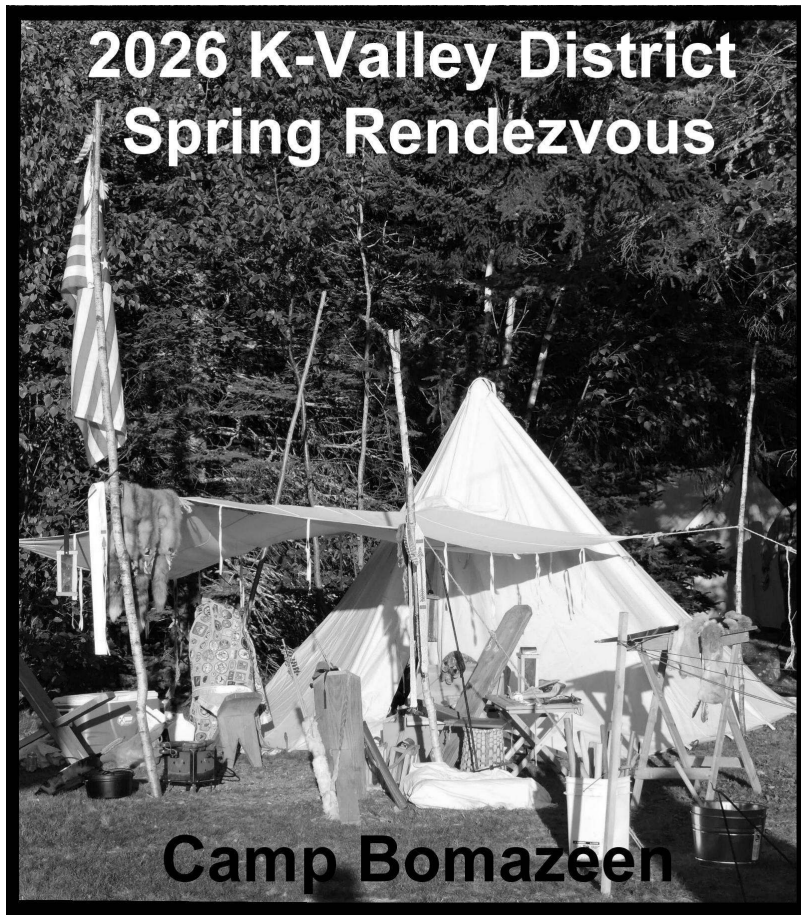


K-Valley District Spring Camporee



Camp Bomazeen

Hosted by K-Valley District and Troop 433 Winslow

Event Rules.

1. Two deep leadership is required for all units.
2. Fires should be "low impact" in nature. Fire pits shall be either metal fire pits provided in the campsite you have or if you have a site without a fire pit, you must provide your own above ground metal enclosure for your campfire. No burning pressure treated wood or woods held together with glues. Campfires may not be left unattended. You must have the equivalent of 10 gallons of water near your fire pit for emergencies. (Two 5 gallon buckets will do)
3. Do not cut any LIVE trees or bushes UNLESS you are instructed to by staff.
4. Drinking water: Camp Bomazeen has water spigots throughout the park with potable water. You may bring your own water if you wish.
5. All Units are asked to register in advance but may register at the event for an increase of \$2 per person.
6. Latrines are located throughout the camp. Please be respectful of the property of the park and help keep them clean.
7. All must practice the "Patrol Method" and live up to the Scout Oath and Law. This goes for leaders as well. Remember the Judging staff will be watching all at all times.
8. Medical. Minor cuts and scrapes may be handled by your Scoutmaster. Major cuts or wounds will be reported immediately to staff. First Aid Staff will respond.
9. Class A or B uniforms or theme related outfits and regalia at all times while on the program trails. You are being judged for your skills and appearance as a Scout. Extra points for teams in Period Correct outfits followed by Class A uniforms. Period clothing and Class A and B uniforms will be acceptable for all other locations through camp.
10. Remember to use the Buddy System.
11. Smile and have fun. =o)



Registration and site reservation

First register first serve.

All Scout units must provide a filled out registration form. Please note that site reservations will be based on when you register. Some troops have been doing this event a long time and have preferred campsites. You may request a specific site but we do not promise you will get that site. Sites based on registration times and group sizes.

Check-in Procedures

- * Friday Night: Upon arrival to the event, please report to the registration tent with the following information.
- * Complete Unit Roster (on page 9)
- * All participants(including dependents and visitors) must have a BSA med form with Part A and B.
- * Parental Consent or Permission slip forms for each Scout

Check-out Procedures

Check out on Sunday morning is completed through the camporee director, unless other arrangements have been made with the camporee director. Units can only leave after your campsite has been inspected for cleanliness and "Leave No Trace" by a staff member. Units, please leave your campsites better then you found it. Once a staffer has approved your site, the SPL or SM may stop by the HQ to pick up out going paperwork and participation patches. Extra patches may be purchased after the event or specified in your registration form before the camporee.

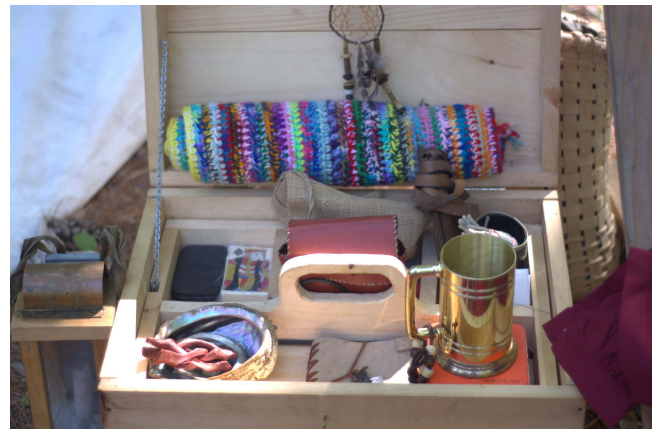
Parking and Traffic

Feel free to load into your campsite. Once your group has unloaded all vehicles and trailers, all vehicles and trailers must be parked in designated parking lots unless a leader requires special handicapped parking permission. Please get this at HQ. Please try to minimize vehicles in campsite while unloading on Friday and Loading out on Sunday.

Cracker Barrel

Cracker Barrel will be held Friday night at 9:00 pm at HQ. A Senior Patrol Leader and Scoutmaster must attend to discuss the schedule of events and answer last minute questions and/or changes of program and times.

Theme this year: “SPRING RENDEZVOUS”

What is a Rendezvous?



In the 1840s mountain men and other frontier types would gather to trade furs for new supplies at the Rendezvous. These supplies would allow the fur trappers and mountaineers to go out for another period of time into the wilderness and survive while trapping critters.

All Scouts are highly encouraged (and it is worth more points) to dress the part of a person who would live on the frontier in the 1840s. First thing to remember is Earth colored clothing. Second thing to remember. The tech was 1840s and simple. You can find simple garb by visiting thrift stores and rummage sales. Straw hat, wool pants and a plaid shirt. Perhaps a rope belt. You can even embrace a more indigenous look should you have indigenous lineage. Ladies, long ankle dresses/skirts that are ankle to shin high with calico blouse and perhaps a wide brim hat or bonnet fits the bill for your garb.

Take the time to research the look.



Event HELP: We will need at least one leader from every unit to help at a station. Or be prepared to bring an activity.

Special Activities for Youth.

Patrol Rotations - Each Patrol will rotate through each of the activities. At each activity you will get a score.

Patrol with the highest score gets something cool at the end of the weekend. All Patrol Activities run on Saturday from 9:00am to Noon and 1:00pm to 5:00pm. Patrols with Scout spirit traditionally score higher.

TRADE BLANKETS

In the 1840 rendezvous there were people trading. At this camporee we are going to highly encourage the same. Each youth who wishes to participate in trading should bring a red blanket and stuff to trade. Your red blanket is your trade blanket. Your blanket most likely will be on the ground when trading so make sure it is a blanket you don't mind getting dirty.

The items you bring to trade should be items that are period correct to the 1840s. Example of some period correct trade items: Regular candles, rabbit pelts, dream catchers, walking sticks, fur hat, earth colored beads, string, leather, tin cups, necklaces as just a few examples.

Other acceptable trade items for your blanket can be anything Scouting America related such as Scout patches, Scout pins and Scout books.

There will also be some cool stuff at the Sutlery. The Sulter is an mid 1800s outfitter who had lots of trade items. (Like a trading post).



All youth activities and patrol competitions gain you points to your overall score.

Patrol Morning and Day time rotations activities to include:

1. Rifle Range The Rifle Range will be open
2. Archery Range The Archery Range will be open
3. Tomahawk Range The Tomahawk Range will be open
4. Primitive fire building Scouts will learn about flint and steel fire building
5. Kims Game A game of memory and strategy
6. Voyageur games A series of games of strength
7. Frying pan toss. Tossing for distance
8. Hoop and Stick It's a hoop and a stick....how complicated can it be?
9. The Great Rabbit hunt. Be wavy wavy quite....I'm huntin' wabbits
10. Three, Two, One, Tripod. In 3, 2, 1.
11. It's Knot a race Every pun intended here.
12. The little smithy Lets melt some metal.
13. No event because 13 is an unlucky number
14. The great Blanket Trade (location TBA at cracker-barrel). Bring your trade blankets to the great trade and do some fun trading. All trades must be sealed with a hand shake. Please be fair with each other. Adults may trade with youth. Again please be fair with each other. (location TBA at cracker-barrel). Specialty after dinner evening events Youth (Optional but may involve a cool prize)

* **Blanket Prize range and target** - Ranges which are open at during this event will require a blanket prize from you to enter. Your blanket prize can be anything from your trade blanket. Rules will be explained at the time of the event. Due to the volume of Scouts and the limited time Scoutmasters are asked to only allow 2 scouts from your unit to participate on behalf of your troop during this event.

* **Checkers competition.** Double Elimination style.

Specialty after dinner events Adults (Optional but may involve a cool prize)

* **Dutch oven desert competition** (page 8 for rules)
All deserts must be cooked in a dutch oven. All Deserts must be submitted on time to HQ. A list of ingredients, name and troop number must be included with the entry.

Specialty after dinner events Adults (Continued)

Oh....and you must somehow incorporate only ingredients you would have been able to find in New England during the 1840s. Submission at HQ by 6:15pm.

- * **Match Lighting competition.** I would like to ask you if you have ever struck a match before?



Special Patrol Competitions.

- * **Gateway competition**
Build a gateway to your campsite. Your gateway must embrace the theme of Rendezvous
If your gateway has anything a person must walk under to get through, it must be at least 8 feet of clearance from the ground.
- * **Bragg Ragg Competition**
Make a Bragg Ragg. This is a fur pelt or leather stretched on a large hoop by string. On the Bragg Ragg must be your Troop number and the Patrol(s) name. On the other side should be a list of amazing things your troop has done or prizes you have won in the past. The Bragg Ragg must be hung from your gateway or if you are not building a gateway it should be hung from a tripod.
- * **Primitive Camping Competition**
Before there were nylon LLBean and Ozark Trails tents there was Canvas. We are challenging all troops to camp primitively this year. This is like all of the events and competitions, optional, but here is your chance to show just how 1840s your unit is. We would love to see any troops try using those old military canvas half shelters, or those old wall tents or those old Baker style tents. Yes. Dirt floors are awesome.

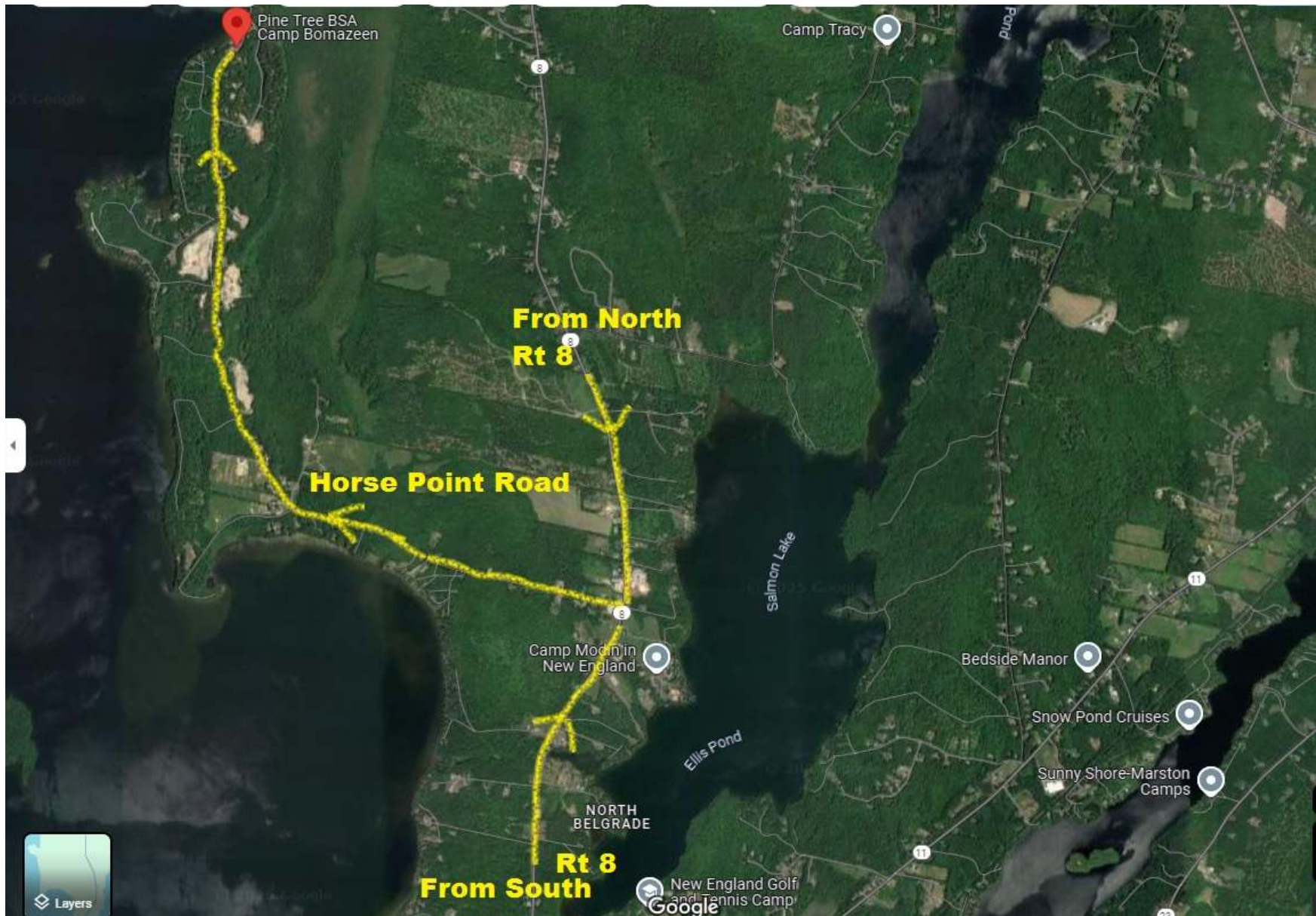

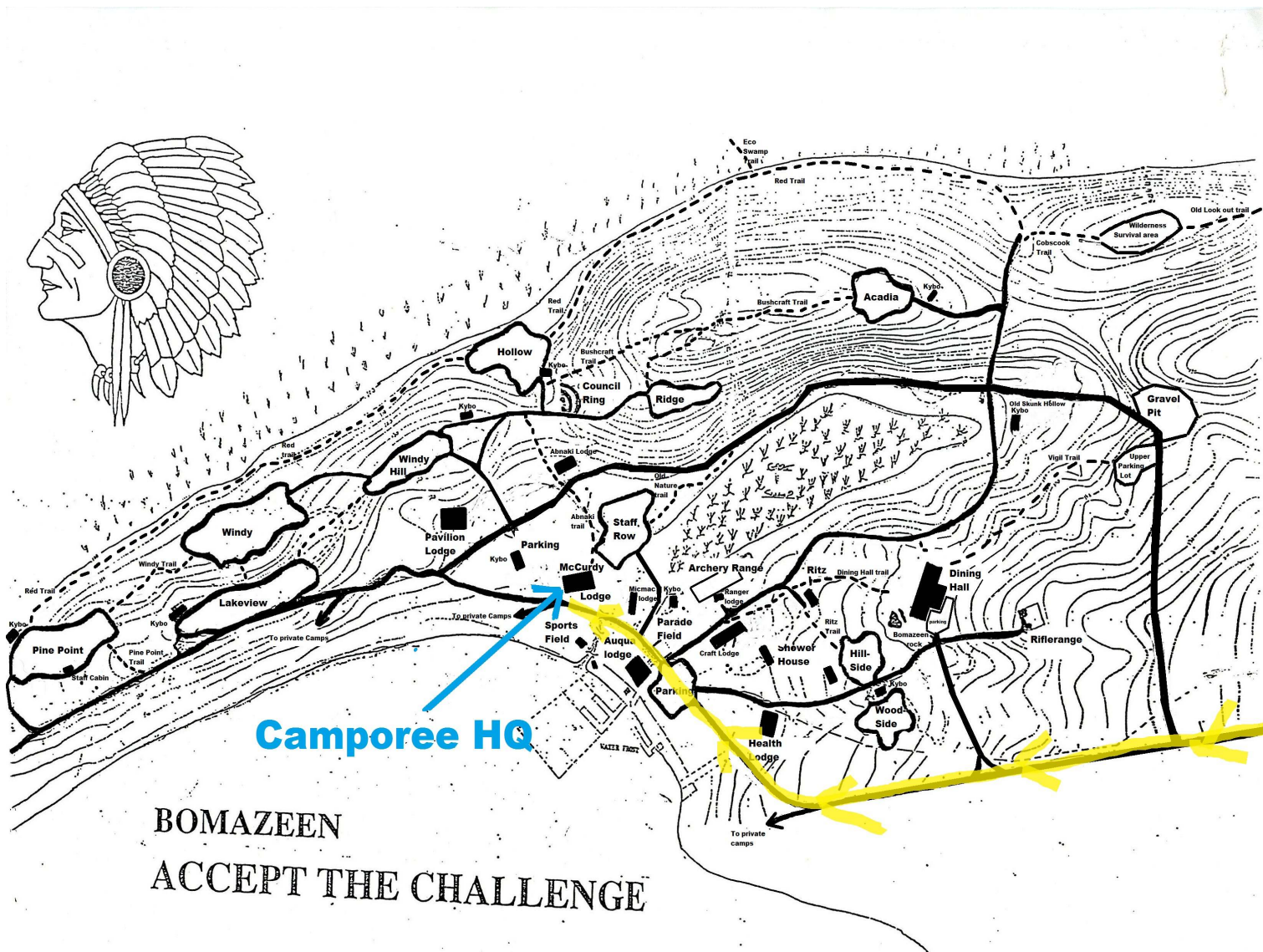


2026 K-Valley District Spring Camporee “Spring Rendezvous”  
Event Map

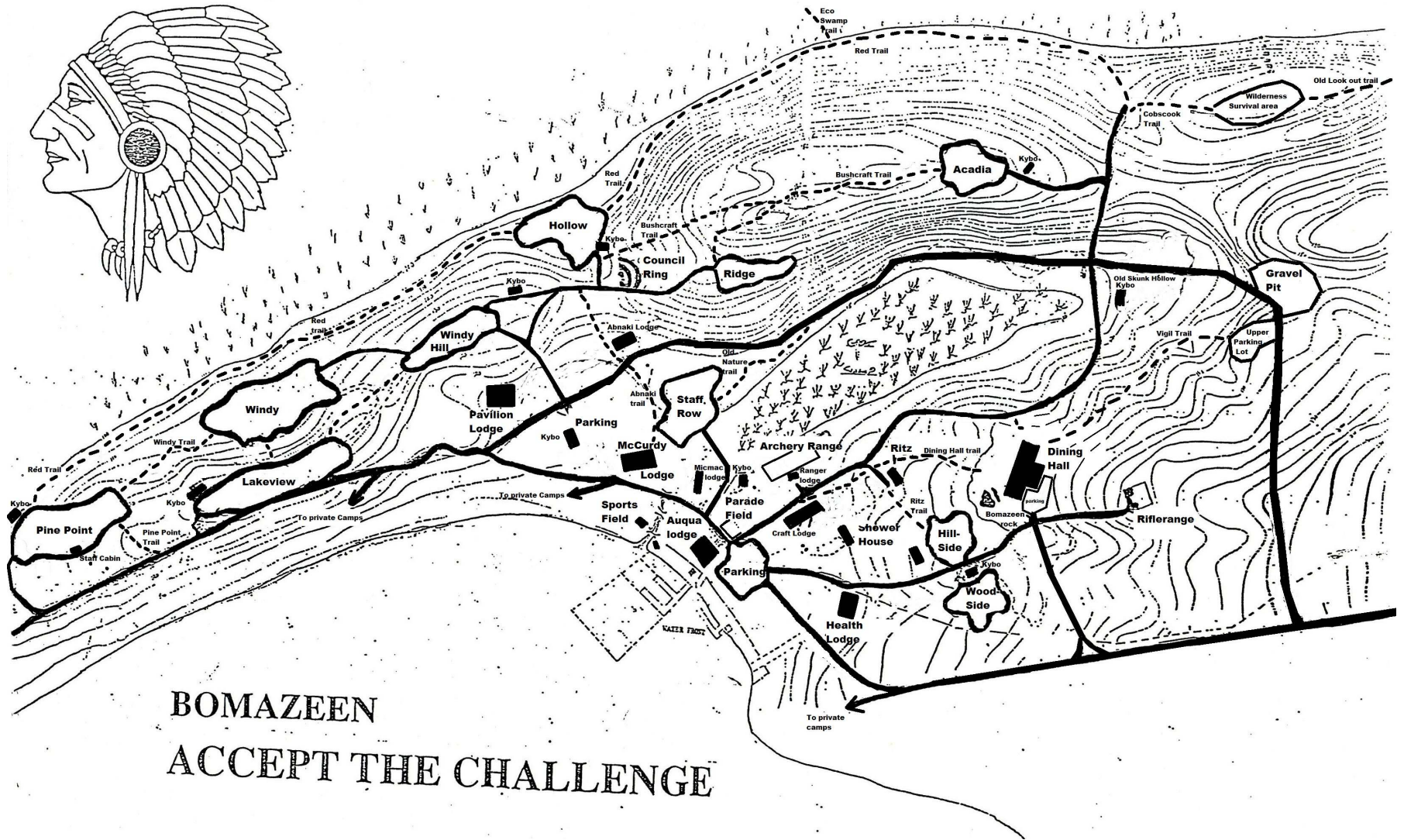
The Highlighted Yellow line is where you need to go.
