Welcome to base camp:

Here you will discover the wonders of what lived before us. You will find treasures in the ground that haven't been discovered until NOW. Will you unearth a new species of dinosaur or explain the reason for extinction? You may learn some new skills and have lots of fun.

Arrival:



Depending on which direction you come from you will always turn onto Horse Point Road then travel about 3 miles. Turn **RIGHT** onto Horseman Way and follow the dirt road until you see the parking lot on the **LEFT** across from the gravel pit.

To expedite check-in, send a representative to the table with the medical forms for drop off and a medical staff will review. Have all members of the unit arrive at the same time. Once everyone is checked in, you will receive a pass to drive your gear to the campsite. It is best to combine everything into one load if possible. If arriving later than 6:00 pm please let us know so there is someone to greet you.

Coffee with the Cubmaster Meeting:

Saturday 8am at McCurdy. Bring your coffee mug and meet the camp directors. You will receive a final schedule and updated information to share back with your unit.

Medication: Pine Tree Council makes a concerted effort to comply with the State of Maine and Scouting America laws and regulations on this subject. With that in mind, all medications brought to camp by campers, leaders, and staff **MUST** be stored in a locked box under adult supervision at **ALL** TIMES. These may be kept in the campsite or in the Health Lodge. This includes prescription and nonprescription items. The health officer is available 24-hours a day to administer medications as needed. There is also a medication refrigerator available. If a lock box is required, please pick it up from the Health Lodge and return it on Sunday.

Uniform: Show off your pack pride! Activity uniforms or scout related t-shirts are worn the majority of the time. This is a relaxed weekend. Leaders have final say about Class A. If you want to dress appropriately to the theme, join in the fun.

Dens: They will be created with no more than 20-25 people. We will do everything to keep packs together. We may combine units together for activities.

Meals: Units are responsible for meals on Friday and Saturday. All meals will be cooked in their campsite. Please plan accordingly to cook either on an open fire or cookstove. Units will need to plan for keeping food at safe temperatures from Friday until Sunday. We suggest lunch be an easy meal. If you have dietary needs, please inform your unit. The dining hall will not be open for meals.

SUNDAY - in the past we have gathered as a whole group to make and eat in the dining hall. This year, we are cooking at McCurdy campsite style. Please send someone from your site to help prep, cook and clean up. We will have on the menu Pancakes, bacon, sausage, fruit, eggs, syrup, butter, condiments, juice and coffee. If your unit wants to contribute something, please contact Julie.

Safety: Each station will be equipped with a basic First Aid Kit. See the closest staff member and we will contact medical staff to make the necessary arrangements for anything more than basics. In case of bad weather, buildings are marked for storm shelters and staff will advise when necessary to relocate. Weather will be monitored for up to date conditions. If there is a lost camper, notify the station manager. DON'T PANIC! If you hear the siren sound, everyone reports to the parade field for roll call and hears directions. Wild life surrounds us... Don't feed the wildlife, just observe from a safe distance.

What to Pack: Label it all- Lost and found will be at McCurdy.

- Clothes scout t-shirts, pants/shorts etc...
- Sleepwear
- Rain gear– Program runs rain or shine
- Tent per family/person, camping gear
- Bedding - Pillow, sleeping bag or blankets. Night can be chilly.
- Modest Swimsuit, swim shirt and towel
- Water shoes - for safety (we have fresh water clams)
- Sunscreen protection (No aerosol sprays)
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- Jacket or sweater
- Toilet articles (No aerosol sprays)
- Insect repellent (No aerosol sprays)
- Refillable Water Bottle
- Laundry bag
- Bible or prayer book
- Musical Instruments
- Mess Kits
- Food & Cooking gear
- YOUR SMILE
- Cash for Trading Post

What NOT to Pack:

- Firearms
- Pets - Licensed Service animals with paperwork ONLY
- Fireworks
- Electronics - campsites only, leaders discretion.
