## Designed for Scouts BSA/ Girl Scouts new to orienteering ( $O^{\prime}$ ). Map skills instructional activities start the day.

A one-day event; however, camping, modern rest rooms are available Fri-Sun. right at the event site. "Orienteering is meant to be a cross-country race with map and compass through unknown terrain, a kind of treasure hunt for strategically placed markers. A good orienteer needs strong legs, a subtle brain, and the ability to exert both at the same time, which is rare."- Outside Magazine. In 2022440 Scouts+leaders from 40 units orienteered; half of the attendees camped one or both nights.

Your troop / Venture unit is invited to BAC's annual day of orienteering instruction \& fun! $\$ 4.00$ cost. Girl Scouts 10 thru 17 \& parents welcome; not Cubs / Webelos. Venture (<18) can come as a unit or merge w/ a troop. Beforehand, try the fun public beginner O' events at qocweb.org -arrive 10:30-12:30; color maps like ours, instruction available, most Sundays.

Brand new color O' maps this year at Pax. R. Park. Also, Broad Creek Scout Res. has permanent practice O' courses: info on the color camp map (sold at camp for \$1; 75申 for >20).

Our self-guided instructional map hikes \& "lost-proof" Route O' start the day. This "more map, less compass" approach has proven to be very popular, much more fun than compass courses, valuable in developing self-reliance \& map skills. We don't sign off requirements, but some of the tougher $\mathrm{O}^{\prime}$ merit badge ones ( $4 \mathrm{a}-\mathrm{b}, \mathrm{d}-\mathrm{f}, 6 \mathrm{c}, 7 \mathrm{a}, \& 10$ ) can be met, + the 1st Class O' requirement. After the ever-popular Score O' we have at $4: 30 \mathrm{pm}$ awards to the top 115 scouts ( $\pm$ patches \& color maps for all who pay (**below.)) After registering, you'll get directions, our schedule, \& what-to-bring. For tips on skills, try orienteeringusa.org/resources/training/ or the merit badge pamphlet.

Easy-to-use color O' map for everyone:


Scouts orienteer in "younger" or "older" pairs. "Older": Everyone 14 to 17, plus those 13 with the $1^{\text {st }}$ Class O' requirement (\#4a) passed. All others are in the "younger" category (all 10 to 12 year-olds regardless, plus some 13 year-olds.) We can makes switches easily on Sat.

Bring lots of scouts; troops with more than 13 scouts get to drop their lowest score in the troop competition, 17 or more their two lowest, etc! At_the event additions over your total registered can still be added for $\$ 5+\$ 2 / n t$. camping. No refunds at the event. Patches, maps only to paying** participants with us all day. To earn a troop award in our main category, you need at least ten scouts, but with less you still do all events \& compete for all 115 individual awards.... But it's more fun \& challenging to combine with another unit for the p.m. (SM's of troops w/ $<10$ will do this Sat.)
