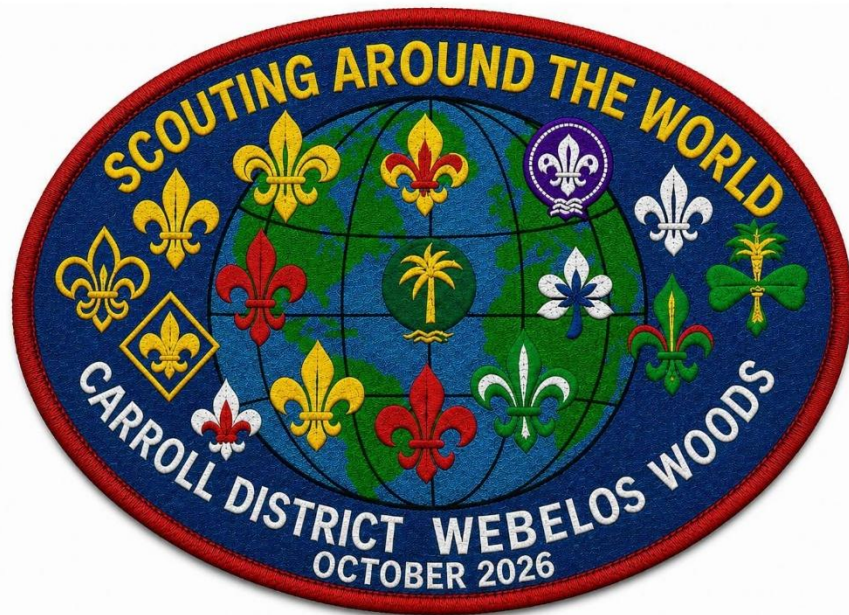

This booklet contains information for the 2026 Webelos Woods. Please share it with your Pack/Troop.

Health Forms are required of ALL Scouts & Leaders, Parts A and B only.

Each Unit will be responsible for their unit's paperwork during the event. Each unit will need to have a roster of people attending, health forms, permission slips, and any other pertinent information required by Scouting or your units charter. Webelos Woods staff will not be maintaining any of the attending units paper work. We ask that a roster of who is attending be sent to CarrollWebWoods@gmail.com prior to the event with your skill station (Scout Troops), Country you will be showcasing (Scout Troops), and skit / song selections (ALL Units), to assist with the event planning.

Make sure that your Health Form are Up to Date.

DATES

The event will be held October 9th, 10th, and 11th, 2026

REGISTRATION & FEES

REGISTRATION for this event must be completed online **no later than September 27th, 2026 at 11:55PM** (midnight). No new or additional registrations will be accepted after the deadline for any reason.

Email rosters, scout skills, showcase county, skit, and song selections to CarrollWebWoods@gmail.com . Even if the registration page has a place to insert those items, please email them also!

WEBELOS WOODS is open to all Webelos, Arrow of Lights, their parents, and Scouts BSA Troops. All other cub scouts and siblings are asked not to attend this event (unless circumstances prevent doing so).

REGISTRATION FEES

The fee for Webelos Woods has been set at **\$20 per person at the Pack level** and **\$10 per person at the Troop level**. This covers the cost of materials needed for the programs, events, facilities, patches, and other incidentals. No refunds will be given.

Theme

This year's theme will be Scouting around the World. We ask that each unit pick a Scouting program from another part of the globe and present a showcase (at campsite entrance) for that county (packs and troops can participate). Troops, plan a desert from that county for the Saturday after lunch Dutch oven cook off.

If you can do a scout skill based on another county's scouting program, bonus points (on your units Scout Sprit scoring sheet)!

PACK AND DEN LEADERSHIP

Adult Leadership must always be two deep. As with any Scouting event, two-deep adult leadership is required in every unit, twenty-four hours a day, for the entire weekend. The BSA defines two-deep leadership as two registered leaders or a registered leader and a parent having a child present. Youth should not be allowed to walk around the event grounds unescorted. **(TWO-DEEP LEADERSHIP AND BUDDY SYSTEM AT ALL TIMES)**

The den leaders oversee each attending den throughout the event and all Cub / BSA Scouts must be in uniform during the opening and closing campfire each day.

Adult leaders, parents and Den Chiefs are urged not to assist their dens throughout the weekend at the events.

Den Leadership: Den leaders will be expected to perform their leadership functions during all activities and in their campsites. Each den should plan on working together as a team.

LOCATION

Carroll District's Webelos Woods is being held at Sykesville Freedom District Fire Department Fairground field in Sykesville, MD. The address is 6680 Sykesville Rd, Sykesville, MD 21784. We will be using the **field only**. **No Scouts** will be allowed to enter the firehouse building and we will not be able to park vehicles and/or trailers on the asphalt parking lot (field parking only).

We will be utilizing the field roadway as a One-Way road again this year with the entrance closest to the baseball field and the exit closest to the fire house.



Also, please note the key areas for HQ (Event Base), water spigot, and first aid –

ARRIVAL

Gates will open at 4:45 p.m. The drive aisle will be one way only. The entrance closest to the fire house will be **EXIT ONLY** and the baseball side of the field will be the **Entrance**! Please follow the directions from the Order of the Arrow personnel with sashes directing traffic. There will be no driving from the grass into the roadway and vice versa. All vehicles must use the entrance and exit.

Troops with trailers will have one parking spot at the site for the trailer and truck. All other vehicles will need to be parked in a designated area. Gear can be dropped off and will need to be carried to the campsites. If you or your party requires special arrangements, please let us know prior to the event.

We would like everyone to have campsites set up by 7:45 p.m. on Friday night or between 7:00 am and 8:00a.m. Saturday morning.

CHECK-IN

There will be a pop-up tent at the entrance to the field. The first person arriving for each unit must check in at the Event Base with the entire unit's necessary paperwork (in their possession) upon entering the camp. We will ask how many people are arriving to attempt to keep a head count of all attendees.

Also, an event map and Scout Scoring sheet will be distributed to the first person arriving from each unit.

CHECK-OUT

Find a staff member to inspect your camping / skill station area prior to leaving the event (sign off on the scout skill scoring sheet. We will attempt to keep a head count of attendees so please let staff know if you or your unit is leaving the event.

VEHICLES

Parking spaces will be limited, it may be necessary for us to limit the number of vehicles at the site. Carpooling by each unit is strongly encouraged. Parking is on the field only. There will be no BSA parking in the Firehouse's asphalt parking lot. Overflow parking will be available on the opposite side of the baseball field. If that area becomes unusable due to weather, we ask everyone to use the park and ride along Route 32 next to the National Guard armory and shuttle within your unit.

UNIT EQUIPMENT

Each unit will be responsible for their own equipment. Please plan accordingly when selecting pop-ups and dining flies to bring to the event. The best-size popup for an event of this type is one that is around 10' X 10'.

TRAILER: Units utilizing trailers to carry their equipment are permitted and a parking spot will be available for the trailer and truck at the site. NO TRAILERS WITH SLEEPING ACCOMMODATIONS ARE ALLOWED AT THE EVENT. ONLY CARGO / EQUIPMENT TRAILERS ARE ALLOWED AT THE EVENT. RVS, CAMPERS AND POPUP TRAILERS WILL BE TURNED AWAY.

CAMPSITES

Units must check in at the entrance to the field from Freedom Avenue upon arrival. At that time someone will direct you to where your unit should set up at your campsite. We will have designated camping areas for each unit.

No fires are allowed unless you are bringing an above ground portable fire pit. All portable firepits must be sturdy, required to have legs that must be at least 6" long to prevent scorching of the grass. All burnt wood, ashes, and charcoal must be taken with you! Fires must always be adult supervised and must be completely doused before going to sleep. Fires must have proper fire suppression (bucket of water, fire extinguisher, etc.) close by, and burned ash must be taken home. Please be respectful to our host.

If you are doing Dutch oven cooking, please use utility pans (**on bricks or some other surface** to prevent scorching of the grass) that can be purchased at the Tractor Supply Store:

No holes or drainage ditches are to be dug. Garbage and trash must be disposed of properly by taking it with you at the end of the event. There should be no dumping of trash or food waste in the woods or in the firehouses dumpsters.

EVENT GEAR

Items that you are required to bring to this event:

RAIN GEAR: If rain or inclement weather is in the forecast please plan for the weather and be prepared. The event will take place in rain or shine.

WATER BOTTLE OR CANTEEN: We want to make sure that you are hydrated.

SCOUT SPIRIT: A positive attitude, a little bit of patience and teamwork.

WEBELOS SUGGESTED PERSONAL EQUIPMENT LIST

It is strongly recommended that all personal equipment be labeled with the participants' last name and initial.

Field uniforms (formerly called Class A) are a must for youth and adult leaders.

SUGGESTED UNIT EQUIPMENT LIST

Food

Friday evening please arrive fed and have snacks for your unit.

On Saturday morning we will need at least one **adult volunteer** from each **troop** to help with breakfast for the Webelos / AOLs.

Webelos / AOLs and their parents – Breakfast Saturday morning is included and will consist of sausage, egg and cheese breakfast sandwiches, for those who do not want breakfast sandwiches there will be a limited number of individual cereal boxes. Everyone is also welcome to bring/cook their own breakfast, if they prefer.

For lunch, Webelos and AOLs have the option of having a meal provided consisting of two hot dogs or a burger (a vegetarian option will also be available) with chips, drink and dessert for \$TBD. The deadline for orders is September 27th. Extras will be offered for cash sale after orders are fulfilled. (ALL Lunch related questions should be directed to WebelosWoods417@gmail.com.) The order form will be provided closer to the event.

Dutch oven dessert (country themed) contest samples will be provided to the Webelos / AOL scouts on Saturday afternoon.

If you stay for dinner and camping both nights, (which is strongly encouraged), ask a troop to have dinner with them. Lastly, Packs will be on your own for breakfast on Sunday morning.

Troops – Units are responsible for planning and cooking all your own meals during the event. Additionally, Troop units will be cooking the Dutch oven dessert (country themed) cracker barrel Saturday afternoon for the participating Webelos and judges. Final Webelos attendance counts will be given to troops no later than Friday evening before the event.

There will be Webelos / adults / others attending with tree nut, peanut, egg, and gluten allergies. Troops, for the Dutch Oven Dessert Cracker Barrel please provide a highly visible label that your dessert either directly contains these if they do or if there are ingredients that were processed in a factory that also processes any of these allergens. Also, please make sure any servers are aware of the inclusion of possible allergens. Also, please invite Webelos, AOLs and their families to have dinner with your Troop and plan to have extra food for that reason.

Campfire Program

All units (Packs and Troops) should be prepared to perform at least one skit and song for the campfire program on Friday and have an extra one in case one is needed Saturday night. Adults and leaders are requested, welcomed, and encouraged to perform a skit or song as well on Saturday.

Please let us know at check in what skit(s) or song(s) you would like to perform.

If any scouts working on the Communications merit badge and willing to be our **Master of Ceremonies**, please let us know as soon as possible.

Scouting Heritage Museum

Mr. Ryan Losonsky will be back with his scouting heritage museum and Mr. Don Correll will have something cool from one of his collection for display. Mr. Don (DonCorrell20@gmail.com) is a merit badge counselor for Scouting Heritage. Scouting Heritage can be attained during the weekend. It would be better to contact him prior to the event and have a blue card in hand.

Packs / Troops, please visit the museums during lunch or breaks.

Scout Skills

Webelos and AOLs will cycle through stations throughout the day run by different Scouts BSA troops throughout Carroll District. These stations will teach scout skills they will learn as they transition into a Scouting America Troop. Make sure you also ask each unit about their troop. Ask the Scouts what their favorite activity is and what their plans are for the year.
