



CREW REQUIREMENTS

- Crews will consist of a captain and 8 sailors
- The maximum occupancy of the boat is 9 people.
- Everyone must be able to pass the Swimmers Test
- Scouts must be 13 to participate

LEADER REQUIREMENTS

- Your crew needs at least two registered adult leaders.
- If there are any female crew members, there must be at least one registered adult female leader part of your crew.
- **At least one person in your crew needs to have Wilderness First Aid training.**
- **At least two leaders from the troop participating need to take a drug test before the trip.** These two adults will be considered crew by the Coast Guard and a drug test is part of this requirement for the trip. This allows more Scouts to participate. As soon as you can, contact Captain Gordon Ringberg and he will get you started on this process. 262-422-0607

TRANSPORTATION TO BAYFIELD

Troops are responsible for providing transportation to Bayfield. There is a parking lot at the marina that you can park at.

FOOD PROVISIONING

While on the boat, the troop is responsible for providing the food, cooking the food, and cleaning up afterwards. Tuesday Supper through Friday Lunch will be on the boat. This provides a great opportunity for three Scouts to complete requirement 4 or 5 of cooking merit badge. There is a stove, small refrigerator, sink and counter for preparing meals. Camp will send you with paper plates, ketchup, mustard, and any other condiments. There is silverware and cups aboard. You should plan an afternoon snack since supper won't be until 7pm or later.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

As you explore the Apostle islands you can view shipwrecks from the surface, swim at beaches, explore sea caves, kayak, snorkel, and visit a lighthouse. These are weather dependent activities and you won't have time to do all of them.

SLEEPING ACCOMODATIONS

- 4 Scouts in forward bunks
- 2 Scouts in aft bed
- 1 adult on couch in galley
- 1 adult and captain on cockpit benches

Sailors should bring a sleeping bag and pillow. Adults can bring additional sleeping pad for extra comfort.

BATHROOM ACCOMODATIONS

There are two flush toilets (heads) on board.

COMMUNICATION

There is limited cell service around the Apostle Islands. However, if there is any need to reach you or if there is an emergency on the boat we will have a satellite communication device and radio to communicate with shore.

PIKE'S BAY MARINA
