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
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Directions to Camp Resolute

Camp Resolute 75 Hudson Rd Bolton, MA 01740

From Route 495 take Exit 70 (old 27) to Route 117 East heading towards Stow. Take the first right which will be Route 85 South. Follow Route 85 2/10's of a mile and turn right at the entrance sign to Camp Resolute.

For Adventure Day Camp proceed another 1/10 of a mile South beyond the above entrance and turn right at the entrance sign to Cub Adventure Day Camp.



Welcome

Welcome to the Webelos/AOL Adventure Meet hosted at Camp Resolute by the Mayflower Council. This event is open to all Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts in the Mayflower Council as well as from other councils.

Short Term NCAP

All Mayflower Council events are run under the guidance of a Nationally accredited Short-Term BSA Camping Administrator. The National Camp Accreditation Program Standards are the set of safety requirements that govern our day and resident camp programs as well.

Registration

All participants must pre-register to attend. Please note that the registration fee is \$15 per youth and \$0 per adult attending. No unit will be allowed to register at event check-in. Early Bird Registration with a \$10 discount closes October 4th and registration closes on October 11th. Although free, all adults MUST register to trigger the health form process.

Health Forms and Permission Slips:

All participants must complete their health forms and permission slips via our CampDoc system. CampDocs linked to your individual registration through the "Link to CampDoc" button. If you have not received an email to set up your CampDoc account, please check your Blackpug event registration to ensure you clicked that button and completed the questions within.

Check In:

Upon arrival, individuals and units are to register at the Administration Building – just inside the front gate. During registration you will need to provide a roster with the names of all the individuals participating with your group. This list must match the names listed on your unit or individual registration and all members must have 100% CampDoc completion. Sample rosters are included in this guide. If you need to make changes to your attendance (replace a participant with another) we can do that at check in.

Check Out:

Please check out with a volunteer at the Administration Building prior to leaving the event. We will have patches for participants at this time.

If you stayed overnight, please ensure all trash has been removed from the site and you have left it in the same condition in which you arrived: Leave no trace.

Cancellation/Refund Policy:

Refunds are generally not available within 30 days of your reservation date. Exceptions may apply in cases of cancellation by the Mayflower Council or as otherwise specified during event registration. For detailed information regarding refund eligibility, please refer directly to the event registration materials. Request a refund.

Adult Leadership:

Each unit must always have two deep leadership on the grounds. These leaders are responsible for the proper conduct of his/her unit and must follow all Scouting America Guidelines.

Equipment Drop Off:

Each unit planning to spend the night will be allowed to park an equipment trailer at their site, but all other vehicles must be kept in the designated parking area. Alternatively, one vehicle can transport equipment for the unit, but the vehicle is also moved to the parking lot overnight.

Parking:

We will be parking cars in the main parking lot, overflow cars can use the public beach parking lot.

Camping:

Units are responsible for reserving any site they wish to use for overnight camping.

Accommodations:

All Mayflower Council events follow the National Scouting America Guide to Safe Scouting guidelines. For further information please follow the link below <u>Guide To Safe Scouting - Accommodations</u> Separate tents and cabins for males and females with separate accommodations for adult males and females as well.

Site Assignments:

If this is a council run overnight event, site assignments will be made by our staff and will be based on your reservation (number of youth and adults) and the availability of space not being used for the program.

Fires:

Ground fires are only allowed in established fire pits or half barrels. Use of accelerants is strictly forbidden by Scouting America. ABSOLUTELY NO OPEN FLAMES IN TENTS. Fires are to be a minimum of 10 ft away from tents or structures and flames no more than 5 feet.

Firewood:

To prevent the transportation of invasive insects, please do not bring firewood to camp. Firewood is available at camp for your campfires. Ask the campmaster or ranger where to find wood.

Fire Extinguishers:

Five Gallon Buckets full of water are required in each site if a fire is built. Remember that you must have the fire in a fire pit. NO GROUND FIRES ALLOWED – only in established fire rings.

Fuels and Stoves:

Stoves & lanterns using propane, white gas, or butane fuel may be used.

Emergency Plan:

If there is a camp-wide emergency, requiring an assembly of all present and an evacuation, we will meet by unit in the Parade Field. We will keep the road exiting camp clear until instructed by incident command to vacate the property. Once instructed, adults will take charge of their units and proceed in an orderly fashion down the road and out to the parking lots.

First Aid:

First Aid Station is in Administration Building. All First Aid needs will be treated at the FA Station as all incidents, no matter how small, need to be recorded.

In the event emergency services are needed, our First Aid Staff will make the call. If there is a minor injury, but needs professional treatment, the closest Hospital is UMass Hospital in Marlborough, and in the event of a serious injury emergency services will be called.

Uniforms:

Class A uniform is requested at arrival on Saturday

Disabilities Awareness:

Do you or someone in your group require special accommodation to attend this event? If so, please contact Mayflower's Program Webelosadventuremeet@gmail.com for assistance. Every effort will be made to provide help.

Restrooms:

The restrooms for events are facilities provided at established camp sites. If weather permits, the adult facilities will be open (April-Oct)

Trash:

Trash must not be left in the campsites or tossed around the Camporee area. Each unit should have trash containers or trash bags for their campsite. All trash must be disposed of in camp dumpsters located between the 2 maintenance buildings in the parking lot.

Lost and Found:

The event lost and found will be at the Administration building Be sure to mark your

equipment and clothing, and please turn in any stray items that you may find.

Pets:

No animals will be allowed unless they are service animals.

Potable Water:

Water should be available in campsites and Dining Hall April to Oct. Nov-March on the side of the director's cabin all year long.

Gray Water:

Gray water must be strained, and food particles thrown in the trash. The water should be spread out a proper distance from the campsite or camporee field.

Smoking:

Cigarette smoking by Scouts is prohibited. Adults are required to use the designated smoking area located outside the camp gate by the dumpsters. Smoking is not permitted inside the gates of Camp Resolute – period! If you must, those adults who smoke, may do so near the dumpster. Butts must be "field stripped" and the filter pocketed. Use of electronic cigarettes, personal vaporizers, or electronic nicotine delivery systems which simulates tobacco smoking, is also prohibited on the property.

Drugs and Alcohol:

NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES,


