Health Forms

Please check out the Health Form policy below:

Effective January 1, 2010 the only health form that we are allowed to accept is the BSA Annual Health & Medical Record.

Parts A, B (both sides), and C must be completed including ALL required signatures for anyone (youth or adult) staying in camp longer than 72 hours. Sports physicals and/or any other physical forms will not be accepted. Participants arriving without the proper health form will be expected to complete the proper form at their expense to be able to remain in camp.

Adults without Part C will not be permitted access to the waterfront or be allowed at camp longer than 72 hours. Adult leaders will also be required to go through a health check with the unit at check-in.

Any camper arriving to camp, who does not possess a valid BSA Health Form, will not be admitted onto camp property. There will be no refunds for anyone who is not admitted to camp due to an invalid health form.

All health forms must be renewed annually for both youth and adults. The BSA Health Form is valid until the last day of the month one year after it was issued (i.e. if your health form is dated June 6, 2017 - it is valid until June 30, 2018).

Per State of Michigan policy, all Health Forms must be kept on file at Camp - HEALTH FORMS WILL NOT BE RETURNED - please bring a photocopy to camp - we are not able to provide a copy of your Health Form to you.

Get everyone to get their physical soon.

Parking

Parking is limited to the number of adults registered for your troop. If you register 3 adults you will get 2 parking passes since one vehicle will remain in the campsite attached to your troop trailer. If more adults come who have not pre-registered, we may be unable to accommodate their vehicles and they may need to park on the other side of the river. On-site parking is only guaranteed for those registered to park in the main parking lot.

DHHS Central Registry Clearance

EVERY adult 21 and over coming to camp, whether camping or just visiting, MUST have a clearance form on file with the camp. This form needs to be requested every year. It is no longer once and done.







Beast Feast

You may be a veteran Beast Feast participant or you've just heard about it. Monday is the very popular Beast Feast at Outdoor Skills. Beast Feast is Scouting's largest outdoor cooking demonstration.

On your Monday night at camp, our camp staff is preparing a monumental meal to satisfy any campers' taste buds! Bring your mess kit and a big appetite!



The highlight of Beast Feast is the cooking contest. Units are asked to bring a dish or dishes to share and also enter the cooking contest in any of the five categories: Appetizer, Side Dish, Main Dish, Vegetarian, Dessert, and Beverage. There will also be a special award for the most outstanding theme and façade presentation at your station including table display and costuming.



Can't decide which category to enter? That's okay! Units can enter as many dishes in as many categories as they want! Remember that two dishes must be entered in the contest for your Honor Unit Award. Please have a list of ingredients for each dish so that campers can avoid foods that they may be allergic to.

To enter the contest please bring 10 samples of each of your dishes to the First Year Camper Pavillion where the judges will judge your dish. These can be turned in at ANY point during the feast, but we recommend turning them in while they are still warm/cold.

Be prepared with the name of your dish and the category you are entering it in when turning in your dish. We recommend turning your dishes in with a paper with the information including the category, dish name, and your unit number.

The USA Archery Level 1 Instructor certification course provides graduates the necessary tools to maintain a high level of safety both on and off the archery range for camps and beginner archery programs. To successfully complete the requirements for this certification, students must successfully pass the USA Archery Level 1 Instructor Certification online course, including the online exam and register for and complete the "in-person" USA Archery Level 1 Instructor practical course to officially receive a USA Archery Level 1 Instructor certificate of completion.

The USA Archery Level 1 Instructor will learn about range safety, range setup, the steps of shooting, equipment and repair, programs and lesson plans and is well prepared to teach beginner archery programs to people of all ages and abilities in a variety of disciplines.

Certification Period: Three years from the date of the course completion

PREREQUISITES: Minimum Age: 15 (A student who is 14 years old and within 30 days of his or her 15th birthday may take the Level 1 Archery Instructor Certification course. However, the instructor may not submit the Applicant Data form until the student turns 15 years of age.)

Click on your Personal Account; Click Courses on the far-left side of the screen; In the menu of courses that appear, search for the appropriate USA Archery Online Instructor or Coach Certification Course you are looking for; Click Enter; After reading the course information, scroll down and click Next

Click Add New Entry; Click the green Add button next to the appropriate name and then click Next;

Proceed through the registration form and Checkout.

To access the online course, return or log in to your Personal Account. In the menu of options under your Profile, scroll down and select Access USA Archery Education Hub. You will be automatically directed to the USA Archery Education Hub where you will complete your online course.





Friday evening arrival encouraged – Instruction starts early Saturday morning

Why: This course goes far beyond basic First Aid. Participants will learn how to assess, treat, and contain emergencies within the scope of their training. Adult and Youth scouts over the age of 14 are invited to participate and earn their certification. Additionally, units leading CCB High Adventure trips must have at least one adult certified with WFA.

Topics Include: Patient assessment, Chest Injuries, Shock, Head and Spinal Injuries, Bone and Joint Injuries, Infection, Hypothermia, Heat Conditions, Lightning, Altitude Illnesses, Submersion Incidents, Allergies and Anaphylaxis, and other emergencies.
