Equipment List (read carefully) Put scout name on everything **Report to camp in Full Field Uniform.**

- Flashlight (batteries) Neckerchief Slide
- Beach and Shower Towels O/A sash (if applicable)
- Clothing for Rain & All Temps
 Insect repellant
 Sunscreen
- Soap, Wash cloth, Hair Brush— Camera is optional
- Toothbrush, toothpasteCabin shoes/slippers
- Shower only foot ware Undergarments
- Rain Gear and/or Umbrella Laundry bag
- Swimsuit (Pack on top) One-piece swimsuit is strongly suggested for females. All scouts will report to Med. check in a swim suit.
- All scouts will report to the waterfront with swim tags. If choosing not to swim, discuss this with the waterfront staff.

Bring to Camp for Sunday check in – Paper copy of BSA Health Form - check all sheets for dates and signatures. Health and Safety Information (emailed in June) - Medications in original container (8 day supply). **Please make sure the bottle states dosage and times given are accurate with what the scout receives daily at home.** Instruction sheet will be emailed with the Health and safety forms .

Wilderness Survival - Pocket knife (Totin 'chip) Lighter/Fire starter needed at class daily.

Horsemanship - Jeans, 3" blade knife (Totin 'chip) - Long sleeve shirt - Hard sole shoes with heal, NO steel toe shoes.

Water ball - Regular shorts (or swimsuit) - T-shirt, shoes, beach towel

Merit Badge Classwork – *Current Merit Badge book* for each class - Backpack, notebook, paper, pen, pencil, Merit Badge Pre-requisites completed - Notes, Collections, Projects, Reports, etc. If book states Show – Demonstrate bring to camp.

Eagle Troop cap, I. D. lanyard (worn at all times), and neckerchief will be given to you at your TTE troop cabin bring a slide.

Foot Ware - Close toe shoes MUST be worn at camp. (Sandals, Flip Flops or Crocks, only at the shower, or Aquatics area). CELL PHONE-Strongly suggested not to be brought to camp, TTE isn't responsible if lost or damaged at camp

DO NOT BRING TO TRAIL TO EAGLE

Valuables – Jewelry - Knives (unless taking Horsemanship & Wilderness Survival) Firearms of ANY kind - Bicycle – Fireworks – Mace

TTE has final say on Troop color placement, color choice is a preference. We can't always put friends together.

The Michigan Crossroads Council encourages our campers to dress comfortably while they are at camp. Campers should use their best judgement to dress appropriately and not wear anything that would make other campers feel uncomfortable.

When packing for camp, the following dress code items should be adhered to:

- Clothing should not include profanity or images that do not support the Scout Oath and Law
- Proper undergarments should be worn
- Pants and shorts must completely cover undergarments not allowing exposure of the buttocks Stay up without the use of hands.
- All shirts must have wide straps or cover the shoulders no "spaghetti straps" not be see-through or expose the side of the body.
- Close toe shoes must be worn at all times around camp except in the aquatics area, and shower. At no time should a camper be barefoot anywhere on camp property. Sandals, Flip Flops or Crocks (shower or waterfront use only)
- Swimwear must be modest and appropriate.
- For males, tight fitting swim briefs or swim bottoms short enough to allow for exposure are not allowed NO speedos
- For females, one-piece swimsuits are appropriate.

TTE is not responsible for any electronics due to damage, theft or lost.

• Report to all TTE meeting and camp check in wearing a complete "Field Uniform".
