INTERNET REGISTRATION AND UPDATES

All registrations must be completed on the Michigan Crossroads Council Website, there will be no on-site registration the day of the event. Merit Badge completions and partials will be uploaded through the registration site after the event. It may take up to 3 weeks after the event for all data to be uploaded. Remember to follow YPT guidelines for youth emailing adults and copy another registered leader or parent on all communications between youth and adults.

A SCOUT IS PREPARED.

Merit Badge Mania is an opportunity for Scouts to meet with qualified counselors and earn merit badges needed for rank advancement. Each merit badge class has a limited number of seats. Please make sure Scouts are completing their prerequisites before arrival at Merit Badge Mania and not assuming to get a "free pass" when they arrive at class, all requirements will need to be completed before the merit badge will be approved by the counselor. If they do not complete the prerequisites, the counselor WILL NOT sign off on that particular item and the Scout will go home with a partial. Some merit badges have "post-requisites" that will need to be submitted to the counselor after the event in order to earn the completed badge.

Scoutmasters are encouraged to meet with the Scout prior to the event to review and sign off on the "Initial Unit Leader Signature" in Scoutbook. Please remember this is encouraged, but no longer a requirement per the Scouts BSA Guide to Advancement.

The classes at Merit Badge Mania are designed to let the Scout leave with a completed merit badge. The goal is to have no partials at the end of the day (unless post-requisites are required). In order to accomplish this, prerequisites have been assigned.

RIGHT TO LIMIT OR CANCEL CLASSES

We reserve the right to limit registration for Merit Badge Mania or for any course. We also reserve the right to cancel courses or activities as needed. Although we do not anticipate the need to do this, there are limits on the number of participants we can accommodate. Courses may be canceled due to unforeseen circumstances; we will make every effort to place the Scout into another class.

FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED

We have established class size limits to ensure a quality experience for your Scouts. Class attendance must be registered using our official website. Many classes fill up quickly, so the sooner you register and enter schedules, the better opportunity your Scouts will get the classes they want. Register all of the classes for each Scout during the registration process. You can come in and adjust the schedule if the Scout changes their mind until the registration is closed. **There is NO Wait List for this event.** Please remember that due to limited class sizes, Scouts that register but don't show up have blocked a seat for another Scout. Please be courteous.

EAGLE MERIT BADGES

As with all merit badges, please make sure the Scout is prepared and is at the maturity level needed for that particular subject. Many Eagle required badges at MBM will be taught over 2 or more class periods. Merit Badge Mania no longer limits merit badges by rank or age, although we ask that leaders, Scouts, and parents decide what is appropriate for each Scout.

MERIT BADGE REQUIREMENTS

Merit badge requirements are revised from time to time. Merit Badge Mania will use the latest requirements as specified in the most recent publication of the official Scouts BSA Requirements, Guide to Advancement or any update issued by the National Council on changes. Be certain the Scouts of your unit understand their obligation to fulfill the latest requirements and are in possession of the latest edition of merit badge books. We suggest you look at the link on the website

(http://www.scouting.org/scoutsource/BoyScouts/AdvancementandAwards/MeritBadges.aspx) for the most current merit badge requirements. Some merit badges require Scouts to contact the counselor prior to Merit Badge Mania, if listed in the prerequisites. Other merit badges require only at-Mania counseling to successfully fulfill all the necessary requirements provided the appropriate prerequisites are done. Check the prerequisites for each Scout to determine what requirements should be completed before attending Merit Badge Mania. In all cases, please make the prerequisites available to your Scouts when you register them so that they have adequate time to complete the requirements. Scouts should also be aware if the Merit Badge requires post-requisite follow up after the in-person event.

Many Merit Badge Mania Counselors will be available by e-mail, telephone and personally to advise the Scout needing post-Mania counseling. The merit badge counselor will provide the information, if needed.

CONCERNS

In the past, Counselors have expressed concerns that:

- Scouts attending class were not in proper uniform.
- Scouts failed to show up for their class/classes.
- Many Scouts lacked preparation for the merit badges they sought (prerequisites).
- Many Scouts never bothered to obtain a copy of the merit badge book.
- Many Scouts "wandered" into a class for which they were not registered.

To help remedy these concerns, please address the above with your Scouts before Merit Badge Mania and be advised that:

- All Scouts must be enrolled for the merit badges they seek.
- No Scout will be allowed to "wander" into a class for which they have not been previously enrolled.
- Please work with your Scouts to register and prepare them appropriately.
- Consider your Scouts' schedule carefully so changes are not needed later. It is unfair to the Scout that had to take their second choice class because the first choice was full and suddenly someone decides to change classes and a later registering Scout gets the slot.

MIDWAY

There will be Midway displays in the hallways that will have sponsors that will answer questions concerning upcoming Scout opportunities like the National Jamboree, STEM events, council programs and much more that Scouts, leaders, and adults can stroll by during the day.

FOOD & LUNCH

CLASSROOM REFRESHMENTS

Only water will be allowed in the classrooms, except the computer labs. No food will be carried into the classrooms other than the designated lunch areas.

LUNCH

Merit Badge Mania will NOT be providing a lunch for participants but we have set aside a lunch period (11:00 am to 11:40 am) for Scouts to eat their lunch that they have brought for themselves. There are many fast-food restaurants in the area. There are vending machines at the college, but we cannot guarantee they will be operational or stocked. Please Be Prepared with a refillable water bottle.

WHAT SHOULD I BRING?

CLASS PASS

NOTE: The instructor has the option of asking a Scout to leave if it is determined that the Scout does not have all the materials needed to actively participate in the class (i.e. no prerequisites)

Prepared prerequisites and the merit badge book are required for entry into a class. The Scout Motto is BE PREPARED. "*I forgot it*" or "*I did not get one*" are not acceptable excuses. It is the Scout's responsibility to have:

- ✓ Official BSA Field Uniform (Class "A" Uniform) is highly encouraged, this allows our staff to easily recognize Scouts on the campus.
- ✓ Pens, Pencils, Paper, loose-leaf binders and any other school supplies needed for advancement and merit badge classes.
- ✓ Merit badge book each Scout should have their own copy with them in the room (digital copies are acceptable).
- ✓ Completed prerequisites, including any projects, collections, or items that must be presented.

PRIOR WORK

Please be certain that your name, address and Troop number also appears on your work.

Study the merit badge pamphlet(s) carefully prior to coming to Merit Badge Mania. You should know the information required of you before attending. These classes are to discuss what you have already learned by completing much of the work in advance. If you have questions, contact the counselor in advance. Questions can also be sent to mcc.merit.badge.mania@gmail.com and will be forwarded to counselors and staff. Please be sure to follow all YPT communication policies when sending emails between youth and adult members.

So that your Scouts receive credit for work already done, any requirements that instruct you to "BRING," "COLLECT," "WRITE," or "DISCUSS" should be brought with you neatly prepared, legibly typed or written and proofed for accuracy. Requirements for activity participation or that require a specific location, or a result that is not transportable, may alternately be certified by a note from your Scoutmaster or parent, unless noted otherwise in the prerequisites.

EQUIPMENT

In order to Be Prepared for each Merit Badge class, Scouts should have the Merit Badge Booklet for the class they are taking. Although a physical booklet is not required, it is highly encouraged and will make the class session much easier to follow along if each Scout has their own copy.

Given the number of Scouts enrolled in each class, we are unable to provide individually needed equipment. Scouts need to review the requirements for the merit badges they seek and bring whatever special equipment is needed.

BLACK PUG AND ADVANCEMENT REPORTING

Merit Badge Mania will be utilizing the Black Pug online registration system for registering and reporting completions and partials after the event. Merit Badge Mania staff will need to process all the reports from the Merit Badge Counselors and upload that into Black Pug. We ask that units give the staff 3 weeks to upload all the completions/partials into the system. At that time, the individual registering the Scouts should be able to go back into the system to download the completions / partials or transfer all data into Scoutbook and print blue cards if so desired.

Arrival & Check In

Each unit must provide one (1) copy of the Wayne County Community College form that the college requires to be filled out IN ITS ENTIRETY for their insurance purposes. The form includes the name and address of EVERYONE in the building. Any person planning on entering the building must be listed on this form. If anyone does not wish to provide this information, they will not be allowed to participate and will have to leave the premises. This is a requirement of WCCCD. **Please have all the forms ready to be turned in at Check In.**

BSA Health Forms, Parts A, B1, and B2, will be required for all participants. Forms must be physically checked during check-in.

Each unit will assign an adult to be the Troop Representative who will check in their unit. They will receive a troop packet with class schedules and patches for each registered participant. There will be several lines at check-in where the units are sorted numerically. Look for the line where your Troop number falls and send one representative to pick up your packet. **Please have your Scouts wait in one of the wings as a troop and not in the Central Atrium**. You may tell your Scouts to meet you in the North, East or West hall downstairs or the North or West hall upstairs. Please make sure your Scouts know where to go *before* they get there as the staff will have no idea where you have designated your meeting place. The first session of classes will begin promptly at 8:00 am, please plan to arrive on time.

Parking

- All vehicles MUST be parked in the EAST parking lot. After entering the College drive way, follow the road to the RIGHT at the T-intersection.
- Please do not park anywhere there is not a painted parking spot. NO PARKING ON THE GRASS OR SIDEWALKS at any time.
- Vehicles that are improperly parked are subject to towing, at the owner's expense.

CLASS VENUES

A Wayne County Community College Site map will be available in the Central Atrium. Classrooms are assigned an N(orth), E(ast), W(est) or S(outh). Rooms 200(+) are located on the second floor.

TROOP REPRESENTATIVE RESPONSIBILITIES

There MUST be at least one adult representative per troop who remains onsite for the **ENTIRE** event. Please be sure that the troop representative understands this and has accepted the responsibility of your Scouts. The responsible adult leader for your unit should have possession of the health forms and emergency contact information for all Scouts in attendance from your unit.

- Please have it be someone that is not teaching a class so that, in the event of an emergency, we have the least amount of disruption for the Scouts as possible and should have a copy of emergency contact numbers for the Scouts in their unit.
- Make sure an approved adult picks up all Scouts by 3 pm.
- Adults may register online for adult training and informational classes. Adult classes that are offered are similar in style to those that would be offered at a University of Scouting program. Adults may also sit in the back of a merit badge session and observe, serving as a second adult in the classroom.

CONDUCT & DISCIPLINE

CODE OF CONDUCT

The Scout Oath, The Scout Law and the Outdoor Code shall be the code of Merit Badge Mania. Scouts and Scouters are to respect the privacy of others.

As with other Scouting events, the use of alcoholic beverages, firearms, illegal drugs, marijuana, tobacco, and fireworks are **STRICTLY PROHIBITED!**

Remember that we are guests of Wayne County Community College. There shall be NO LITTERING and NO DEFACING or DESTRUCTION of property in any way.

A Scout whose conduct is not consistent with the Code of Conduct will be referred to their Unit Leader for appropriate disciplinary action. Scouts and units found to be violating the Code of Conduct may be referred to the WCCCD Police Authority on campus and may be asked to leave the program without refund.

PROPERTY DAMAGE

Each unit and its Sponsoring Organization shall be liable, in the full amount, for theft and/or property damage caused by its Scouts and Scouters. Scouting America and Michigan Crossroads Council does not provide insurance protection to units or sponsoring organizations for theft and/or property damage.

UNIFORMS

The uniform is an important part of the thrill of Scouting. It helps build spirit in the patrol, the troop and promotes the camaraderie of Scouting. Proper dress affects the appearance of Merit Badge Mania and encourages participants to act in a manner expected of good Scouts. Uniforms will be worn throughout Merit Badge Mania.

The uniform of the day will be the Field Uniform, also known as the Class "A" uniform, for several reasons: one, because it is the right thing to do at a Scout function; and two, because the college is open to the public, it also allows us to keep track of the Scouts more easily.

The Field Uniform consists of the Scout shirt, shorts/trousers, belt and socks.

HEALTH & SAFETY

SECURITY

Wayne County Community College will be open to the public during our event. Please be sure to secure personal effects and valuables. Please be vigilant with your units.

Scouts are expected to be in uniform to help with their identification and safety

Please report any incidents to the Merit Badge Mania registration desk in the Central Atrium.

FIRST AID STATION

Any and all illnesses or injuries must be reported to the registration desk. Serious illness or injury will be referred for medical attention, as required. All accidents or injuries requiring first aid must be reported at the registration desk.

In all instances involving emergency first aid, the adult leader at the scene shall dispatch a runner to the registration desk for additional assistance. The Health Officer will take charge upon arrival at the scene. Under no circumstances should a seriously injured person be moved without proper assistance.

DEPARTURES

Please make sure that all youth are picked up by 3 pm at the latest (The exception to this is the Scouts in Space Exploration which should be picked up by 3:30 pm.). Troop representatives should BE PREPARED to stay after the event to ensure that all youth in their troop have been picked up.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

COATS, BAGS AND STORAGE SPACE

There will be no place to leave coats, bags, etc. Scouts will be expected to carry everything with them from class to class.

LOST AND FOUND

There will be a lost and found bin at the Merit Badge Mania main desk located at the Central Atrium.

LIFE TO EAGLE SESSION FOR LIFE SCOUTS

RANK REQUIREMENTS: LIFE SCOUT

The process of getting a Scout from Life to Eagle Scout can almost seem as difficult for the troop's Advancement Chair as it is for the Scout.

The Advancement Committee has developed a presentation designed for Life Scouts. This presentation covers the Eagle Scout Rank requirements, the Eagle Scout Leadership Service Project, the Eagle Scout Rank Application, This course will outline the steps from "Life to Eagle" including the Eagle Scout requirements, service project, rank application, (including the local council processing procedure), Board of Review, and Court of Honor.

BSA OUTDOOR ETHICS / LEAVE NO TRACE - OPEN TO YOUTH & ADULTS

This course is a general introduction to Leave No Trace ethics and skills. The course is designed to help youth and adults at all program levels understand the general principles of Leave No Trace and how to apply them in the general BSA outdoor program.
