REGISTRATION

Registration is quick and easy. Due to the nature of the event and it being inaugural, all registration must be by unit (Pack, Troop, Crew, Ship, or Post)

On-Site Registration Process

- ➔ Before you arrive, each adult must submit an online registration to gain access to Camp Grayling.
- ➔ Everyone will first check in at the Camp Grayling main gate at 4 Howe Rd, Grayling, MI.
- ➔ You will then check in with Operation Rendezvous staff for directions to your barracks.
- ➔ You will proceed to your assigned barracks and park outside.
- ➔ Registration team members will be at the barracks to direct you to your specific building and floor.

Registration Information Packet: Will include a name tag for each participant, Participant Patches, Map Pocket Guides, and final information for unit leaders. All unit leaders must submit a completed Rendezvous Unit Roster through the online registration system.

Identification

We will identify all Rendezvous 2026 participants and staff with a name tag. Every participant, youth and adult, **MUST** always wear the Rendezvous 2026 name tag. Participant and staff name tags can be picked up Friday night or Saturday morning at the main registration sites.

Name tags will indicate your meal shift and whether you have dietary needs.

Camp Grayling

From Interstate 75 take exit 254 for I-75 BUS toward Downtown Grayling/M-72

Turn left at M-72 W/M-93 S/Fig Street

Turn left onto M-93 S

At the traffic circle, take the 1st exit onto Howe Rd

Stop at the Camp Grayling main gate

Rules

The Scout Oath, the Scout Law, and the Outdoor Code serve as the rulebook for all Scouting events. In addition, the following rules must be observed:

We ask that all leaders and adults assist us in enforcing these rules.

- The Buddy system must always be used.
- Two Deep Leadership always.
- Do not put cans, bottles, trash, garbage, or wastewater into portable toilets.
- Do not interfere with other people or groups using Camp Grayling.
- Climbing, cutting, or disfiguring of any standing trees or shrubs is prohibited.
- No digging at Camp Grayling.
- No alcohol, Marijuana, or illegal drugs/substances allowed.
- No fireworks.
- No pets.
- No sheath knives or explosives will be allowed in Camp Grayling. We will honor State and Federal law and Guide to Safe Scouting related to personal firearms.
- No skateboards, roller skates, in-line skates, power scooters, or similar devices will be permitted.
- Drivers and passengers must always wear seatbelts while riding in a vehicle.
- No person may ride in cargo beds or sit loose in vans.
- Park only where the parking attendants instruct you to park.
- Some areas are off-limits to participants of Rendezvous 2026. Please stay out of areas marked off-limits.
- Personal drone usage is prohibited.
- Units and/or individuals may be billed for any damage.
- Do not interfere with or obstruct military or Rendezvous 2026 staff.
- Failure to comply with any of these rules may result in ejection, forfeiture of camping/attendance rights, and/or prosecution.

Smoking, Chewing Tobacco, and Vaping

We encourage leaders to take one additional step toward setting a good example for the youth of our council. Please take a weekend break from the use of all tobacco and vaping products. Young minds are impressionable, and Scouting youth frequently look to their leaders as role models.

Youth Protection

Scouting America has adopted and implemented policies for the safety and well-being of its members – youth and adults. Following these policies and ensuring the Rendezvous is a safe environment, the following policies will be enforced:

- All adults accompanying a Scouting Unit and Volunteering to Staff activities must be current with Safeguarding Youth Training. (<https://scouting.org/training/youth-protection/>)
- Scouting's Barriers to Abuse will be adhered to such as two-deep Leadership, no bullying, harassment and cyberbullying are prohibited. (<https://www.scouting.org/health-safety/gss/>)
- Safeguarding Youth Training is free online, you do not need to be registered with BSA to complete the course, and SYT certification is valid for 1 year.

Health and Safety Information

Emergency Phone Number – 989-245-7584

There will be a dedicated emergency phone number for the event. It is only used for emergencies.

First Aid

There will be 24-hour Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) coverage at the Physical Arrangements site for the duration of the Rendezvous. There will be a mobile EMT/Medic on a golf cart. On Saturday, the First Aid tent will be staffed with First Aid personnel from 8:00 am - 7:00 pm, along with the mobile EMT/Medic patrolling the entire event area by golf cart. After 7:00 pm on Saturday, the First Aid personnel and mobile EMT/Medic will be in the show area.

All medical care beyond minor cuts and scratches should be referred to the First Aid station. Whenever possible, Rendezvous 2026 participants should advise their unit leader whenever they are feeling ill. All injuries must be reported to the First Aid Station.

Emergency Situations

Warning signals will sound in the unlikely event of an emergency. Please follow the instructions provided if a warning signal sounds.

Medical Emergencies

In case of emergency, either call the Emergency Phone number 989-245-7584 or seek assistance from Rendezvous Staff.

Inclement Weather/Thunderstorms/Lightning Safety

Seek shelter in designated areas.

Tornado Safety

Seek shelter and stay away from windows. Get out of automobiles. Lie flat in a nearby ditch or depression. Avoid flying debris.

Guide to Safe Scouting

All leaders and adults should follow the *Guide to Safe Scouting* at all times during the Rendezvous 2026.

Health Forms

An Annual Health and Medical Record is required for all youth and adult participants in a Scouting activity such as the Rendezvous. Leaders should keep their unit's health forms on-site with their unit. The information will provide helpful information to the onsite medical team in the event of an illness or injury while also providing emergency contact information. The information contained is respected and treated as confidential.

Parking

Parking will be at the assigned barracks. Others will be directed to parking upon arrival at Camp Grayling

Policy on Traffic Safety

Pre-Approved motor vehicles be used to transport materials, supplies, and certain personnel throughout the Rendezvous 2026. It is in the best interests of all participants to respect the following guidelines.

Pedestrians

- Walk on the left shoulder of the road facing traffic and carry a flashlight at night.
- Walk on sidewalks as much as possible.
- Stay off the roadway and cross only at established crossings.
- Give emergency vehicles (with flashing lights) the right-of-way.

Motor Vehicles

- Use of motor vehicles on the Rendezvous 2026 site is by approval only.
- Always “buckle up” your seat belt; **insist passengers do likewise!**
- Travel slower than the posted speed limits, as this is a highly congested area.
- Truck beds must not be used for transporting passengers.
- Give the right-of-way to all pedestrians.
- Give the right-of-way to emergency vehicles with flashing lights.
- Both vehicle and pedestrian traffic rules will be rigidly enforced.

What to Bring and Wear

Food for Participants

Meals will be served in assigned shifts at the Camp Grayling mess hall. Name tags will indicate your assigned shift. Please adhere to this time.

Personal Gear

The following list is provided to help campers select their personal gear. Refer to your Scout Handbook for additional assistance.

The following list is provided to assist Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, and Venturers in the selection of their personal gear and is intended to be supplemented by Unit Equipment for Troops and Crews.

• Completed Medical Release Form (including signed photo release page) • Uniform: Cub Scouts / Scouts BSA / Venturers and can wear activity (Scout t-shirt) during the day. BSA Field (Class A) uniforms are recommended for Sunday religious services (but not required). Appropriate clothing for weather conditions – including proper shoes • Scout Hat for shade • Towel • Sleeping Bag	• Sleeping Pad • Sunscreen • Insect and Mosquito Repellent • Rain Gear • Toiletries • Sunglasses • Personal First Aid Kit • Small flashlight • Camera • Money (Trading Post will be open)
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Housing Information

All participants will sleep in assigned barracks. The Guide to Safe Scouting does allow mixed sleeping arrangements if necessary. Units will be assigned areas together with adults and Scouts sharing space. Participants may wish to bring sheets to tent in their bunks for additional privacy.

Restroom Facilities and Showers

Each barrack has restroom facilities. Due to facilities, restrooms will be assigned by gender. Adults and Youth restrooms will be assigned or will have hours for youth and adults. Each barrack is set up differently, so participants will be briefed upon check-in.

Access to Electricity

Electricity is available in the barracks. Please use proper multi-outlet surge protectors and do not daisy-chain extension cords.

Care of Valuables

Each Troop should make arrangements for the safe storage of members' valuables. Do not wear or carry any more valuables than necessary with you while out on Rendezvous 2026 activities. We cannot be responsible for lost or stolen items. However, there will be a Lost and Found area at the Event Headquarters (HQ). If items are lost, please check the Event HQ before leaving Rendezvous 2026.

Policing of Grounds

One of the big problems in connection with the operation of the scope of Rendezvous 2026 is maintaining orderly and neat conditions in heavily used areas. All Scouts and leaders are asked to see that all trash is deposited in the containers provided. Consistent leadership in this regard will help prevent a major problem. Every Scout and leader should make it a practice and a tradition not to pass by trash—pick it up and put it in the proper container.

On Sunday, units will be expected to clean their barrack space per the guidelines set by the National Guard. We will share these guidelines at check-in.

General Information

Uniforms

Cub Scouts, Scout BSA, Venturers, Sea Scouts and their leaders are encouraged to wear the Scout Activity Uniform (Scout T-shirt and Scout Pants).

Note: Participate in challenge courses in clothes that can get dirty and possibly stained. Several courses will result in participants getting wet and/or muddy.

Trading Post

The MCC Scout Shop will offer general Scouting goods as well as Rendezvous 2026 branded items on-site during the event.

Patch Trading

Patch trading is allowed and encouraged throughout Rendezvous 2026.

Golf Carts

Golf Carts are for **staff use only**. Except in emergencies, participants may not ride in or on golf carts or Gators.

Order of the Arrow Service Corps

Order of the Arrow members of Mishigami Lodge #29 (<https://mishigami.org/>) will be on-site throughout Rendezvous 2026. All OA Service Corps members should always wear their Sash during the event for additional identification.

Order of the Arrow Service Corps members will sleep in the barracks and eat in the mess hall.

Lost and Found

A lost-and-found department will be located near Rendezvous 2026 Event Headquarters. People seeking lost articles should report to the lost-and-found area and fill out an identification card describing the missing item. To prevent the loss of valuables, everyone should mark uniforms and personal equipment with their name, home address, and phone number.

Photo Releases

The Michigan Crossroads Council (MCC) would like to use photos and videos taken during the Rendezvous 2026 for promotional and marketing purposes. Photographs will be used only in MCC print and electronic materials, such as brochures, flyers, presentation slides, and the website.

The MCC respects the privacy of all our Scouts; therefore, we will not publish names when using photographs in printed and electronic media.

Photo Release forms are Part A of the BSA Health Form required for any Scouting activity.

Friday Night Events

Opening Ceremony

The opening ceremony will be held at 9:00 AM on Saturday at the parade field east. Each Scout unit should designate two flag bearers for the ceremony. One for the unit's flag and one for the unit's country flag.

Saturday Night Show

The Show will begin at 7:00 pm on Saturday night. There is no formal "march" to the show.

Note: Please be advised that we will be sitting on the ground. Stadium seats or ground cloths that do not raise your body above ground level are permitted. For those attending who would like to use chairs, you will be

asked to sit in the back so as not to obstruct anyone's view. We do suggest that you dress for the weather and that you plan to bring water to keep yourself hydrated.

Operation Rendezvous - Schedule and Activities

Operation Rendezvous 2026 has a multitude of activities and challenges. Most program areas are *not* split by age, rank, or program level within Scouting America; rather, any scout, participant, or visitor may attend any area. All areas have activities that all age groups can use, but **not all ages may participate in each activity**. (.22 Long Rifle Range is for Troop Scouts and older) **Scouting America Age-Appropriate Guidelines and the Guide to Safe Scouting govern minimum ages on certain events.** <https://www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/gss/>

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) about Rendezvous 2026

What is Operation Rendezvous?

Operation Rendezvous is a premier event of the Michigan Crossroads Council in partnership with the Michigan Army National Guard. It is designed to create a pinnacle experience for Scouts and Scouters, build enthusiasm for Scouting, and introduce our program to others in our community. The program will focus on Scouting activities.

Scouting America Sponsored Activities:

Activities include but are not limited to the following:

1. Scout Night Hike and Glow Frisbees – Friday Night at the Grandstand
2. Adventure Point - Climbing Tower and Inflatable Archery Ranges, Inflatable Bounce Houses,
3. Range and Target Activities (RATA) on a Military Range Complex- including BB Guns, Archery, and Sling Shots, .22 Long Rifle Shooting Opportunities for older TROOP SCOUTS ONLY, sorry No Cub Scouts on the .22LR Range)
4. STEM Activities Area – Indoor and Outdoor STEM Activities!
5. Water Rockets – Bring some 2 Liter Bottles to Build and Fly a Rocket!
6. Mini STEM Drones – Build and fly your own mini STEM Drone (no personal drones are allowed, please) - Sign up for a Drone educational Saturday time slot when you arrive on Friday night
7. Monkey Bridge Test your Balance and cross the bridge
8. Native American Display
9. Patch Trading – Bring and Show, Buy and Sell
10. Fly Fishing Demo - Fly Tying and Fly Casting and much more (see Appendix E). In addition, there will also be an exhibit
11. Live Music at the Grandstand Saturday Night!

1. Humvee Rides around Camp Grayling – Ride Along in an Army Humvee!
2. Military Equipment Displays on the Parade Field – Check out The National Guard's military vehicles!
3. “Practice” Army Fitness Test Demonstration and Tryout – Are You Tough Enough to Be a Soldier?
4. Inflatable Obstacle Challenge Course – Run a “Kid-Friendly” Obstacle Course
5. Military Simulators – EST 2000 – Shoot on an Electronic Military Range Simulator!

How does my family, Pack, Troop, Crew, or Ship register for the Rendezvous 2026?

We encourage all Packs, Troops, Crews and Ships to pre-register online using the Rendezvous 2026 web site: <https://scoutingevent.com/272-OperationRendezvous>. Registration is quick and easy.

At Rendezvous 2026, everyone must submit a unit roster form. If you enter actual scout names during pre-registration, we will create a roster during onsite registration. If you enter dummy names during pre-registration, you must update your registration online when you arrive with the actual names of participants. Computers will be available at the registration tent for you to update your online registration.

Once registered, all individuals 18 and older must complete an additional form to access Camp Grayling. What is the appropriate attire during the Rendezvous 2026?

All Youth and Adults who plan to participate in fitness challenges should wear activewear/clothing that can get muddy, wet, or stained. Otherwise, you may wear the activity uniform or field uniform.

Is the Rendezvous 2026 open to Scouts from other councils and countries?

Yes, Scouts from other councils and countries are encouraged to participate in the Rendezvous 2026.

What if it rains?

We'll do what Scouts frequently do – go full speed ahead! Please check the weather forecast and Be Prepared.

Are Health Forms required for Scouts to participate in the Rendezvous 2026?

An Annual Health and Medical Record is required for all youth and adult participants in a scouting activity such as the Rendezvous. Leaders should keep their unit's health forms on-site. Individual families participating should have the forms in their possession. This information will help the on-site medical team in the event of an illness or injury and will also provide emergency contact information. We respect and treat the information contained as confidential.

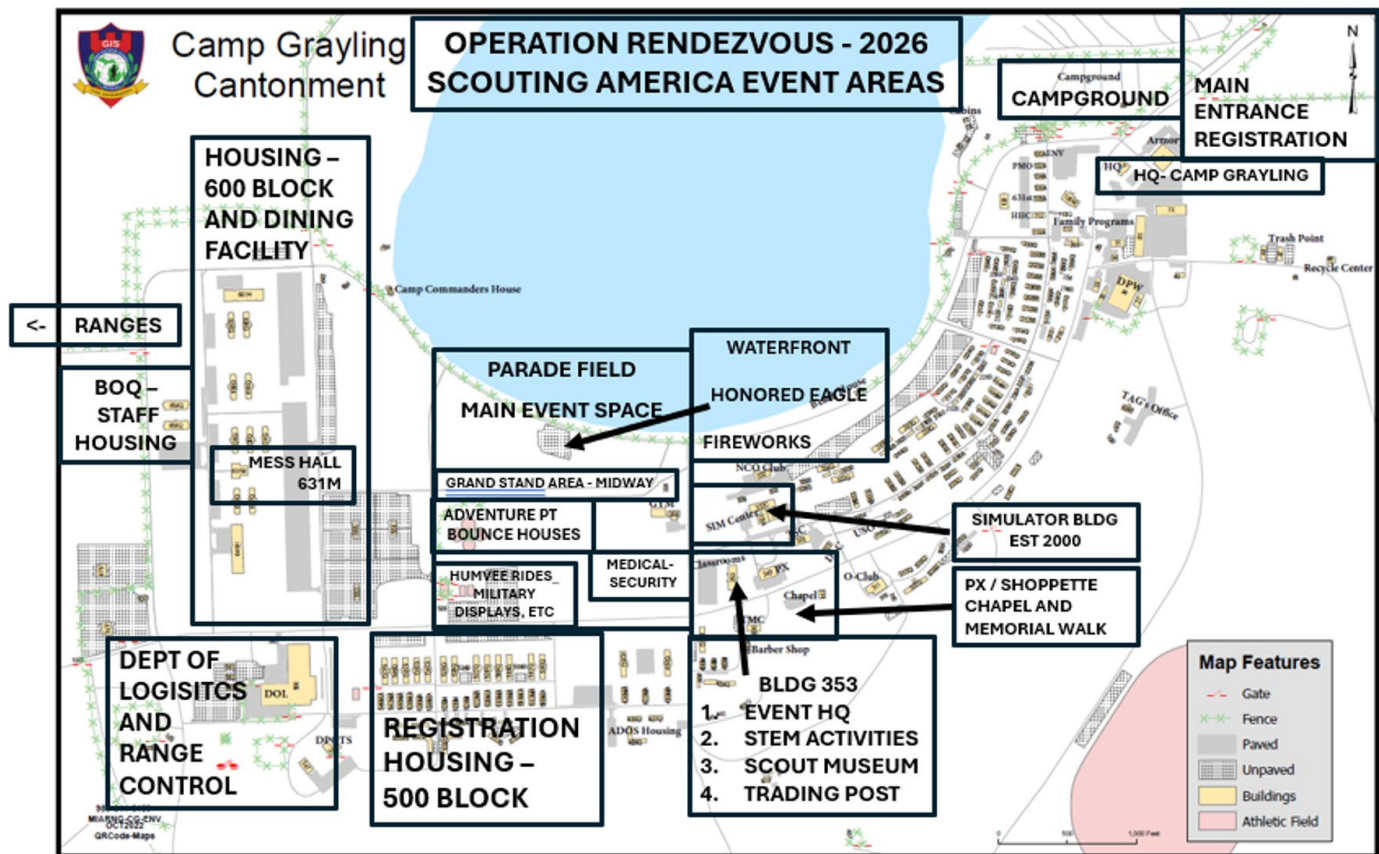
