The Brownsea Island Scout Camp began as a camping event on Brownsea Island in Poole Harbor, southern England, organized by Lord Robert Baden-Powell of Gillwell to test his ideas for the book "Scouting for Boys". Youth from different social backgrounds participated from August, 1 to 8, 1907 in activities designed around camping, observation, woodcraft, chivalry, lifesaving and patriotism. Recognized as the world's first Scout camp, the event is regarded as the real origin of the worldwide Scout movement. Lord Baden-Powell went on to later develop Girl Guides, Cub Scouts and Sea Scouts.
