No Show/Cancellation Fee

- No refunds after May 1, 2020, deadline except in a limited number of circumstances where a partial refund may be granted. All refunds are at the council's discretion. Fees are transferable to another Scout in your unit that is replacing the youth no longer able to attend.
 - A partial refund may be granted if the registered participant has an illness preventing participation in the event and has a signed statement from a medical doctor or healthcare practitioner. The written statement from the doctor and a written request for a refund must be provided to the council within 7 days of the camp. – **75% refund**
 - A partial refund may be granted in the event of the death of an immediate family member. The council will consider any other death, which may affect the participant, on a case by case basis. A written request for a refund must be provided to the council within 7 days of the event. – **75% refund**
 - A partial refund may be granted if the participant needs to attend summer school and those dates conflict with the event. A note from the school is required along with a written request for a refund within 7 days of the event. – **50% refund**

Site Fee:

- \$100 refundable up to March 1, 2020.
- 2020 Campsite Reservations open on-line June 24, 2019 for Twin Valley Council troops and for out of council troops camping at Cuyuna in 2019 and August 15, 2019 for all out of council troops not camping at Cuyuna in 2019.

Campsite Reservation Policy

1. Twin Valley Council units and any out of council unit that is camping at Camp Cuyuna during the current season can reserve their next year's campsite starting on the Monday after fathers-day of each year for a \$100. This fee is refundable until March 1 of the following year.
2. Out of council troops not attending Camp Cuyuna in the current year can reserve a campsite the Monday after camp closes for the summer for a \$100. This fee is refundable until March 1 of the following year.
3. Reservations will open and be competed electronically on the Twin Valley Council's website with the following guidelines:

- Each campsite has been assigned a maximum number of patrols (8) and number of people that can fit in each site:

- You will be asked to estimate the number of youth, adults, and patrols you will bring to camp the following season. This number will be asked to confirm by March 1 of the camp year with a small deposit (\$20 per youth). This deposit will be refundable until the early-bird deadline the first Friday in May when all early-bird registrations are due.

- Multiple units will be able to register for a campsite until all patrol sites are filled. This is to accommodate linked troops and to accommodate multiple troops wanting the same campsite in a given week. (For example, if Troop A has 15 people and reserving Apache, they will take 2 patrol

sites leaving 3 patrol sites for 24 people available for another unit.)
