

#### Weather

Meteorology is the study of Earth's atmosphere and its weather and the ways in which temperature, wind, and moisture act together in the environment. In addition to learning how everyday weather is predicted, Scouts can learn about extreme weather such as thunderstorms, tornadoes, and hurricanes, and how to stay safe.

9. Make one of the following instruments (and bring to the merit badge class):

wind vane anemometer rain gauge hygrometer

Keep a daily weather log for one week using information from this instrument as well as from other sources such as local radio and television stations, NOAA Weather Radio

All Hazards, and Internet sources (with your parent's permission). Record the following information at the same time every day:

wind direction and speed

temperature precipitation types of clouds

Be sure to make a note of any morning dew or frost.

In the log, also list the weather forecasts from radio or television at the same time each day and show how the weather really turned out.

10. Give a talk of at least five minutes to a group explaining the outdoor safety rules in the event of lightning, flash floods, and tornadoes. Before your talk, share your outline with your counselor for approval.

(Bring an outline of your talk to class. Be prepared to give your 5-minute talk.)

#### Geocaching

Geocaching describes a hiding place on planet Earth - a hiding place you can find using a GPS unit. A GPS (Global Positioning System) unit is an electronic tool that shows you where to go based on information it gets from satellites in space.


