Ripley Rendezvous is for Scouts BSA, Venturers, and Explorers. Webelos in 5th grade who will transfer into a Scouts BSA Troop as of June 1, 2020, are eligible to participate in this event. <u>No Cub Scouts may participate in this event.</u>

Camp Ripley is an Active Military Training Facility. Should anyone find explosives or ammunition, <u>DO NOT PICK IT UP!</u> Contact Ripley staff to arrange for proper disposal.

Event Information

Check-in: 5:30-8:30 PM at Building 5-8. If you arrive later, you will still be able to check-in. Please send one leader to check in for your unit. The rest of your unit is welcome to check out the scout shop and concessions while you wait. Trading Post/Concession Bldg.: Building 5-2

Required: All adults that are driving need to bring their valid driver's license to pass Camp Ripley gate.

Required: All adults must have a valid ID. It will be checked against our roster by Camp Ripley staff.

Be patient with the check-in at the gate and while you are waiting to check-in. Camp Ripley staff will be doing their best to ensure that the post remains secure during our check-in process and during the weekend event. It's a big deal. <u>Be sure to remain respectful and patient.</u>

Parking is limited. Only bring the vehicles and gear that your unit will need.

On Saturday, porta-johns will be available down range.

Meals will be provided including Saturday breakfast, lunch, and dinner. And, Sunday continental breakfast.

Scouts and leaders with <u>special dietary needs</u>, will need to provide their own meals.

Program Information

Due to COVID policy influences and the current situation in our world, all participants will receive a $\frac{1}{2}$ day of each program.

Adventure Program: Shooting Sports include, 20 gauge shot guns, .22 rifles, and archery.

Scout OPS Program: Confidence course, obstacle course, and leadership reaction course.

Religious Services: We will be offering both a Catholic Mass and Non-denominational service on Saturday late afternoon.

Friday Evening Welcome Campfire: Saturday Evening Campfire:

No open fires will be allowed due to safety concerns other than the official event campfire by event staff

Leader and Scout Information

All BSA Youth Protection policies will be followed during this event. It is required that at least one adult from each unit has been Youth Protection trained. Any incidents should be reported immediately to your Council's Scout Executive or, if unavailable, contact Event Headquarters at 5-1 for instructions and support.

Two-Deep Leadership is mandatory for all units. The recommended leader to youth ratio is 1:5. Units will maintain unit integrity during the weekend **Health forms** (parts A and B) are required for all participants. Please bring two copies of each health form. You should always keep a copy with the unit/individual and have a set for your unit as a back-up.

Event patches will be giving to the unit leaders at checkout on Sunday after the "Good Turn".

Uniforms and Clothing

Scouts and leaders are required to wear their uniforms:

- At the Saturday Night Campfire.

Unit t-shirts or other troop activity clothing may be worn during program activities.

First Aid

- A staffed, 24-hour First Aid Station will be available at Building 5-1, and on call.
- There will be first aid stations in all program areas. First Aid station numbers will be given out at check in and again during opening ceremony announcements.

Motor Vehicle/Parking/Pedestrian Safety

Chief.

- Do not block roadways or sidewalks when parking.
- It is against post policy to use your phone while driving. Camp Ripley has unmarked vehicles and will issue tickets.

Barracks Chiefs and leaders will monitor facilities.

Restrooms and Wash Stations

- Never ride in the bed of a truck.
- No skateboards, inline skates, bikes or scooters.
- Stay off roadways, only cross at designated areas.
- Always walk facing traffic.
- Carry a flashlight at night.
- Give emergency vehicles the right-of-way.
- Stay in your designated Scouting areas.

Lost and Found

Camp Ripley and Ripley Rendezvous personnel will not be responsible for lost or stolen items.

- A Lost and Found will be located at Building 5-1.
- Persons seeking lost items should report to Building 5-1 to describe the missing item.
- To guard against loss of valuables:
 - 1) Mark all personal items with name, council, and unit number.
 - 2) Store equipment in a locked container when not in use.

Policy on Smoking, Alcohol, and Drugs
