**PLEASE NOTE!!**

Registration for this event is limited to 4<sup>th</sup> (Webelos) and 5<sup>th</sup> (AOLs) Grade Scouts. Registration for this event opens September 20, 2022. You need to have this form turned into your Den Leaders before this deadline so that they have time to complete your Pack Registration forms. We can only accept 500 Scouts and Den Leaders at this event and registration will fill quickly! Due to the limited capacity, we will **NOT** be allowing younger scouts ranked Lion to Bear, nor will we allow younger siblings to come in attendance. **This event is specifically for Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts**, and the Troops who are hosting the prospective Cub Scouting Units.

Den Leaders: Remember that space is limited and will be filled on a first come, first served basis. Please assist your Pack Registration coordinator by getting these forms to him/her as early as possible. Please remember this event is specifically for Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts, younger scouts will not be permitted to register for this event. **Pathfinder district early registration will close on October 23, 2022.** Refunds will be given on a case-by-case basis and must be approved by the District Activities Committee.

The Top Unit Leader must check in at Camp Arrowhead's Foster Lodge upon arrival to receive campsite assignment and final confirmation of registration and Health Forms A & B. Each Pack must also check out with the Headquarters Staff **before** departure, and to be physically checked out of their campsite to ensure the campsite is left within the parameters of the "Leave No Trace Principles."

## I. REGISTRATION

Participation in the November 2022 Webelos Woods is open both to Webelos and Arrow of Light scouts, corresponding troops, and parents/adult partners/leaders.

BSA policy states that Webelos camping requires two-deep leadership. Responsible adult leaders must be at least 21 years of age and current in their Youth Protection Training. **No siblings or outside friends will be allowed.**

## II. RULES AND REGULATIONS

### A. MEMBERSHIP

Scouts eligible for this year's Webelos Woods **MUST** be registered members of a **Webelos or Arrow of Light Den** and meet the requirements of Webelos or Arrow of Light Den membership as established by the Boy Scouts of America.

### B. MEDICAL FORMS A & B

**Complete and signed forms for each Den member/ Patrol Member/ Adult Sponsor/Leader in attendance.**

### C. CAMPSITES

1. Campsite locations will be given to the Unit Leader at Check-In. Campsite assignments will not be granted until the names of all Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts attending have been verified. All Medical Forms A & B will also be reviewed.
2. Campsites will be identified by Pack number. Multiple Dens within a Pack must agree amongst themselves how to share the available space. Den number or name should identify each Den area where possible.
3. Campsites will have approximately 200 square feet per Scout and adult partner registered. If large cabin tents are used, they should be used for multiple Scout or partner pairs. No adult should sleep in a tent with any scout other than his or her own child. **Den members pitching camp outside the assigned area for their unit will be asked to move.**
4. Adults will be allowed to drive into the campsite area for transporting and unloading personal and camp equipment. Once unloaded, **all vehicles must leave the campsite and park in the designated parking areas only.** Pack trailers will be allowed to remain in the campsite.

### D. LEADERSHIP

Webelos and Arrow of Light scouts will always be under the supervision of the Den Leader and other adults in attendance. The welfare of all Scouts is the joint responsibility of the Den Leader and the accompanying adults.

### E. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

**Alcoholic beverages are not permitted at scouting functions or on Ozark Trails Council property. Anyone found possessing or consuming alcoholic beverages will be required to leave the site immediately.**

### F. NON-SCOUTING EQUIPMENT

Guns, Sheath Knives, and other similar gear are not acceptable for scouting activities and are prohibited. Any equipment in this category will be held by the WEBELOS WOODS Staff and returned to the Den Leader upon checkout.

#### G. KNIVES AND AXES

***Knives may not be carried by Webelos or Arrow of Light Scouts at WEBELOS WOODS, even though they may have earned their Whittling Chip.*** As there will be little room for a proper ax yard in the Pack/Den campsites, Axes should not be used except in the Boy Scout camping area. Axes may be used **only** by adults and Boy Scouts having earned their Totin' Chips. Scouts may use knives for meal preparation or similar activities under adult supervision.

#### H. CAMPFIRES

Wood-fueled campfires can be built in the Den Campsites but **should only be built in camp-supplied fire rings or above ground pits. NO GROUND FIRES SHOULD BE BUILT!** Fires should **ALWAYS** be attended; and should be extinguished before departing the campsite for events or the evening activities. You may use any downed wood that is around your camp site.

#### I. COOKING FIRES

Cooking fires built of charcoal should be placed in existing cleared areas if possible. No holes should be dug for fires. Metal garbage can lids, barrel bottoms, or the camp-supplied fire pits should be used to contain the charcoal fires. No cooking on ground. **NO LIQUID CHARCOAL STARTERS ARE TO BE USED! NATIONAL BSA POLICY Prohibits USE OF LIQUID FUELS!!**

#### J. LANTERNS AND STOVES

Propane-fueled lanterns and stoves may be used under adult supervision. Liquid-fueled equipment using fuels such as Coleman fuel, kerosene, or white gas must be used in accordance with the manufacturer's specification and in their original container for their specific use. See the Guide to Safe Scouting Section VI – Chemicals and Fuel Equipment. There should **NEVER** be any open flames in a tent. Tent light should be provided where necessary by flashlight or battery-powered lanterns.

#### K. GARBAGE AND TRASH

All garbage and refuse are to be accumulated in trash bags to be removed at the end of WEBELOS WOODS. **No trash is to be buried or left at Camp Arrowhead. No holes should be dug at Camp Arrowhead.**

#### L. VEHICLES

All vehicles should stay **ON THE ROADS. No vehicles are to be parked in the Campsite area at any time.** Equipment should be unloaded and loaded in the shortest possible time to allow everyone an opportunity to approach their campsite. **ANY REFUSAL TO DO SO AND YOU MAY BE ASKED TO LEAVE THE EVENT.**

#### M. DITCHING OF TENTS

No ditching (trenching) of tents will be allowed at Camp Arrowhead.

N. DAMAGES

Any damage to Staff area tents, equipment, or other items will be the financial responsibility of the Cub Scout Pack

O. TREES

Attendees are not to cut down or cut branches from any live trees. There are many young trees that have been planted in recent years so that others who follow us will have shade and protection. Please be careful of these saplings and young trees and do everything you can to protect them.

P. CHECK-OUT

**ALL DENS MUST CHECK OUT WITH THE WEBELOS WOODS DIRECTOR BEFORE DEPARTING.** Checkout **WILL INCLUDE** a campsite inspection to verify that all litter has been removed and that the site has not been damaged.

**III. GENERAL INFORMATION**

A. CHECK-IN

**CHECK-IN WILL BEGIN AT CAMP ARROWHEAD AT 4:30 P.M. ON FRIDAY, November 4, 2022. The Camp gates will not open till 4:30 p.m.** The Den Leader must present his/her BSA Medical Forms A & B and pay any outstanding fees at Check-In.

B. FIRE PROTECTION

Each Den will provide its own water bucket to extinguish its campfire before leaving the campsite.

C. WATER

Camp Arrowhead has a readily available water supply. Each Den should provide containers for transporting and containing water. Remember, each Den will need water for the fire cans. Each Scout and Adult should bring a personal water bottle, canteen, etc. for use during the program sessions

D. COOKING

Each Den and Troop must furnish its own food, ice, and cook stove, propane, firewood, or charcoal.

E. PACK/DEN FLAGS

Each Pack/Den should bring its own Pack/Den flag to post in the Pack/Den campsite. However, there will be no Pack/Den flag competition.

F. PACK/DEN SPIRIT

Each Pack/Den should have a Pack/Den Yell and the Pack/Den is welcome to demonstrate it during the events portion of Saturday. The most spirited Pack/Den with the best (not loudest) Pack/Den Yell will receive special recognition.

G. DEN EQUIPMENT

Minimum should include Tents, for all attendees, Water containers, 1<sup>st</sup> Aid Kit, Toilet Paper, Cooking Gear, Shovel, and Trash Bags. As well as anything you would instruct your scouts, leaders, and parents to bring per your pack/troop packing suggestions. The Duty Roster, and 1<sup>st</sup> Aid Kit must be readily available at each campsite in case of emergency evacuation, or injury.

H. PERSONAL EQUIPMENT

Each attendee will be responsible for packing and bringing his/her own personal gear. Please ask reach out to your Cubmaster/Scoutmaster, Den Leader/Patrol Leader for any questions you may have in regards of what to pack for camp.

I. MEALS

Supper should be eaten before coming to camp on Friday evening. A nice cracker barrel or some ooey gooey smores make for a great treat after setting up camp The Saturday morning meal should be suitable to get the Scouts through a long and tiring day. Saturday lunch should be a light meal requiring minimal preparation, as the lunch period is limited. Saturday evening's meal will be a good opportunity for the Scouts to display their culinary expertise or a meal prepared as individuals. Sunday morning should be an easy clean-up meal as to be efficient with vacating from camp on time.

J. DEN LEADER MEETING

The Top Cub Pack Leader for his/her designated representative **MUST** attend a **Den Leader's meeting on Friday evening, November 4, at 9:00 p.m.** at the Breezeway. Questions about Check-In materials received, or the schedule of activities can be resolved at this time. Any additional information on activities will also be presented at this meeting.

## **CAMPFIRE PLANNING – Bring your best Skit/Song!!**

Skits/Song cannot mention or revolve around the ideas of death, nudity, body waste, racism, drugs, prejudice options or anything that can be considered making fun of certain types of people.

*Tip #1:* Try to not use the skits or songs that are done at EVERY campfire program. It WILL bore your audience. Try newer skits or songs you can find on the internet (there are gray area one mixed in too), books, or on this website.

*Tip #2:* Have more skits than songs (but still have songs). This entertains your audience with comical jokes instead and goes further in people's minds if done correct than songs do. But still have song. Songs warm up your audience.

*Tip #3:* Treat each script with thought. Sure, they may be dumb jokes but if you don't care whether the skits flop or fly, don't expect the skits to get across.

*Tip #4:* Assign (or cast) the correct people into correct parts. Prior to the campfire, pick people based on their personality and match it with a part you think they will do justice to. Also, unless you are doing improv programs, do not cast or think of skits to fill in the next part. It wastes time and bores the audience.

*Tip #5:* Never have a skit be the opening thing besides welcome. Think of the program as you are writing a musical. The overture (or opening song) will show what the upcoming show will be (whether it is sad or jumpy). Original songs work best because it surprises your audience even if it is rewritten lyrics to the song "*Don't Stop Believing.*"

*Tip #6:* Just because it is funny that the scoutmaster fell in the latrine or that a news reporter got a story from x amount of people jumping off a bridge doesn't mean that it will pass your leaders or scoutmaster's checklist of green area. When programing a script, think each skit through to see if it has the possibility of offending someone, be immature and awkward if female staff or viewers are there, or political. Funny isn't always putting someone down; that is not the scouting way. Also, try to avoid skits that give the talk of bodily parts (yes, blood and urine), explicit war images, toilet talk, death, and politics.

*Tip #7:* If you hold auditions (which helps organize your program), hold them long prior to the campfire date. Pick people who can fit the part (I repeat) and won't mess it up.

*Tip #8:* Do not place songs that involve the audience to get up and move around the end. You are getting your audience warmed up for what? Night? The End? yay! Don't do that. Ghost stories and other haunting stories should go later into the program to give your audience something to think about when they walk away.
