Advance Move-In and Setup Available for Pre-Registered Troops

Camp Childress is locked during the week however please note <u>troops assume all</u> <u>responsibility for property or equipment left</u> <u>unattended</u>.

The camp will be open April 11th by noon for clean-up or trailer drop off.

Campsite Reservation and Parking

Each campsite at Camp Childress will be used for 2-3 units depending on size of the site. Please be courteous of others as you set up your campsite.

The Registration Chairman will attempt to assign campsites based on **troop size**.

Campsite assignments will be made after the preregistration deadline and are subject to change.

If you have a troop trailer in camp, please move it far enough into the campsite to allow 1 vehicle to park in front of it, completely off the road and within the limits of your campsite. Limit one trailer and 1 vehicle per camping troop to remain in the campsite.

Parking for all other vehicles will be available at the southwest gate & on the north side of the field.(See map).

Special Note for Vehicles on Friday Night Check-In

A Scout Is Courteous. During Check-in on Friday night, traffic flow on Cubmaster Circle can become an issue. Traffic is to flow oneway clockwise around the camporee field. Units taking gear to their site may unload, then return the vehicle to the designated parking area. One trailer and the vehicle hauling it may remain in the campsite per unit.

Rendezvous staff will be enforcing a strict <u>unload gear then park</u> policy. The check-in tent will be at the dining hall (see map. Troops should plan on arriving as a group and then load all their gear into a single vehicle, if necessary, at the parking area.

Parking in the program areas, campsites, mess hall,, cedar lodge and camporee field is restricted to Vendors, Staff, Emergency Vehicles, and special needs.

Campsite Inspection Required Before Checkout

Pick up your packets at checkout

When a troop is ready to leave, a member of the Rendezvous staff must inspect the campsite before the unit may be dismissed. <u>All fires MUST be EXTINQUISHED before check-out.</u>

Please do not build new fire rings with rocks or other material. You may use your own above ground fire pit .






Rules for Blanket Traders

Trading blankets have become one of the most popular events at the Rendezvous and here is what you need to know to become a Blanket Trader yourself!

> No money can be exchanged - Barter only. If you are observed asking for money, your blanket and all goods will be confiscated, and you will be asked to leave the area. Your items will be returned to your Scoutmaster after he/she is notified.

> No sheath knives, throwing stars, swords (wooden or metal) or other weapons not allowed by BSA regulations or your Scoutmaster - make sure you read the last word in the underlined sentence. Your Scoutmaster can impose other restrictions as needed. If any prohibited items are observed on vour blanket vou will be asked to remove them. If they are seen as second time, they will confiscated and returned be to vour Scoutmaster after he/she is notified.

Other than these two Rules you are free to trade whatever treasures you can bring with you.



Rules for Traders

Trading blankets have become one of the most popular events at the Rendezvous and here is what you need to know to make successful trades as a Trader!

No money can be exchanged - If anyone asks you to pay money for an item, **DON'T DO IT**. This is against the rules. Go immediately to one of the traders that are dressed in Native American clothing (regalia) and point out the person who asked for money. Any blanket trader or customer caught paying for a trade with money will be asked to leave the area and their Scoutmasters will be notified.

Barter - Deal - And Deal Some More! - Bartering for something without money is an "art". <u>Trading blankets are</u> <u>not like a store</u>. Someone may want something that you don't have, but since they are stuck at their blanket and can't find it, you have the ability to go to another blanket, find that item and trade for it, then come back and trade for what you originally wanted. This is what makes trading blankets so much fun! <u>If someone says "No" to a trade, add</u> items or ask "What **would** you trade for that?" If you see something that you want to trade for... keep trying and "trading up" with other traders until you can make the trade you want!

Your Help Needed

We need help. Any scouter who is free during the morning or afternoon period who would like to help at an event station is welcome. Some areas get busy and we need a few more people to help us. For your help, you will be given a staff patch.

A 24-hour medic/information officer will be stationed at Cedar Lodge during the event.

- **CAMPFIRES** No ground fires allowed. All units must use an above ground pit when multiple units are camping at each site.
- **BSA HEALTH FORMS** Every participant (youth and adult) <u>MUST</u> have BSA Health Form A&B to turn in to the medics upon arrival at camp.
- **WEBELOS** Must have a parent or guardian accompanying them.
- **UNIT ROSTER** Leave a complete unit roster with staff at check-in.
