PLEASE NOTE!!

Since this will be a combined event, registration is limited. Registration for this event is open. You need to have this form turned into your Den Leaders before the deadline so that they have time to complete your Pack Registration forms. We can only accept 500 Scouts and Den Leaders at this event and registration will fill quickly! Due to the limited capacity. This event is now a combined event with a Cub O’Ree.

Den Leaders: Remember that space is limited and will be filled on a first come, first served basis. Please assist your Pack Registration coordinator by getting these forms to him/her as early as possible.

Each Unit must check in at Foster’s Lodge upon entering Camp Arrowhead to receive campsite assignment and final confirmation of registration. Each Unit must also check out at Foster’s Lodge before departure to receive event patches, and to be physically checked out of their campsite to ensure the campsite is left within the parameters of the “Leave No Trace Principles.”

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I. REGISTRATION

Webelos Woods is open both to Webelos and Arrow of Light scouts, corresponding troops, and parents/adult partners/leaders.

Cub O’Ree is open to Lion Rank through Bear rank with appropriate corresponding Cub Scout, Cubmaster/Den Leader, and parent/adult ratio/per child according to BSA Safety policies and procedures.

BSA policy states that **ANY** ranked scout, or cub scout camping requires two-deep leadership. Responsible adult leaders must be at least 21 years of age and have **CURRENT** Youth Protection Training. **No siblings or outside friends will be allowed unless they are registered within the program.**

STAFF WILL NOT PROVIDE BSA MEDICAL FORMS A & B!! It is the responsibility of each Cub Scout and Troop Level Unit/ Scoutmaster/ Leader and Adult attendee to have completed the BSA Medical Forms A & B prior to arrival. Each Pack, Troop, Adult, and Leader must have the completed BSA Medical Form A & B at check-in the night of Webelos Woods/ Cub O’Ree. Den Leaders/Scoutmaster should distribute the BSA Medical Form A & B (does not require a medical exam) to the parent/guardian of the scout, Adult Attendee, and Leaders. **No Cub Scout/ Troop/ Den/Patrol/Adult/Leader will be allowed to check in without these forms!!**

Attendance is by advance registration only.

Check in at Foster’s Lodge upon arrival for camp assignment, and camp program information.

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II. RULES AND REGULATIONS

A. MEMBERSHIP

Scouts eligible for this year's Webelos Woods / Cub O’ Ree **MUST** be registered members of a membership as established by the Boy Scouts of America.

B. MEDICAL FORMS A & B

Complete and signed forms for each Den member/ Patrol Member/ Adult Sponsor/Leader in attendance.

C. CAMPSITES

1. Campsite locations will be given to the Den Leader/ Troop Leader at Check-In. Campsite assignments will not be granted until the names of all Scouts- Cub Scouts- Leadership- Parents attending have been verified. All Medical Forms A & B will also be reviewed.

2. Campsites will be identified by Pack/Troop number. Multiple Dens within a Pack must agree amongst themselves how to share the available space. Den number or name should identify each Den area where possible.

3. Campsites will have approximately 200 square feet per Scout and adult partner registered. If large cabin tents are used, they should be used for multiple Scout or partner pairs. No adult should sleep in a tent with any scout other than his or her own child. Per BSA policy. **Den members pitching camp outside the assigned area for their unit will be asked to move.**

4. Adults will be allowed to drive into the campsite area for transporting and unloading personal and camp equipment. Once unloaded, **all vehicles must leave the campsite and park in the designated parking areas only.** Pack/Troop trailers will be allowed to remain at the campsite.

D. LEADERSHIP

Cub Scouts Ranks will always be under the supervision of the Den Leader and other adults in attendance. The welfare of all Scouts is the joint responsibility of the Den Leader, Den Chief, and the accompanying adults.

Troop Scouts will remain under the supervision of their Scoutmaster, and Patrol Leadership. Following the safety guidelines outlined in BSA safety policies.

E. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES- SMOKING- VAPING- MARIJAUNA

Alcoholic beverages, smoking, vaping, and Marijauna are not permitted at scouting functions or on Ozarks Trails Council property. Anyone found possessing or consuming alcoholic beverages, or smoking regardless of the substance will be required to leave the site immediately.

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F. NON-SCOUTING EQUIPMENT

Guns, Sheath Knives, and other similar gear are not acceptable for scouting activities and are prohibited. Any equipment in this category will be held by the WEBELOS WOODS Staff and returned to the Den Leader/ Scoutmaster upon checkout.

G. KNIVES AND AXES

Knives may not be carried by Webelos or Arrow of Light Scouts/ Cub Scouts at WEBELOS WOODS/ Cub O’ Ree even though they may have earned their Whittling Chip. As there will be little room for a proper ax yard in the Pack/Den campsites. Axes should not be used except in the Boy Scout camping area. Axes may be used **only** by adults and Boy Scouts having earned their Totin' Chips. Scouts may use knives for meal preparation or similar activities under adult supervision.

H. CAMPFIRES

Wood-fueled campfires can be built on the Den/ Troop Campsites but **should only be built in camp-supplied fire rings or above ground pits. NO GROUND FIRES ALLOWED TO BE BUILT!** Fires should **ALWAYS** have an adult nearby and should be extinguished before departing the campsite for events, evening activities and upon departure. You may use any downed wood that is around your campsite.

I. COOKING FIRES

Cooking fires built of charcoal should be placed in existing cleared areas if possible. No holes should be dug for fires. Metal garbage can lids, barrel bottoms, or the camp-supplied fire pits should be used to contain the charcoal fires. No cooking on the ground. **NO LIQUID CHARCOAL STARTERS ARE TO BE USED! OZARKS TRAILS COUNCIL POLICY Prohibits USE OF LIQUID FUELS!!**

J. LANTERNS AND STOVES

Propane-fueled lanterns and stoves may be used under adult supervision. There should **NEVER** be any open flames in a tent. Tent light should be provided where necessary by flashlights or battery-powered lanterns.

K. GARBAGE AND TRASH

All garbage and refuse are to be accumulated in trash bags to be removed at the end of WEBELOS WOODS/ Cub O’ Ree. **No trash is to be buried or left at campsites in Camp Arrowhead. No holes should be dug at Camp Arrowhead to bury trash or human excrement (there are sufficient outhouses, and bathrooms available to use).**

L. VEHICLES

All vehicles should stay **ON THE ROADS. No vehicles are to be parked in the Campsite area at any time.** Equipment should be unloaded and loaded in the shortest possible time to allow everyone an opportunity to approach their campsite. **ANY REFUSAL TO DO SO AND YOU MAY BE ASKED TO LEAVE THE EVENT.**

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M. DITCHING OF TENTS

No ditching (trenching) of tents will be allowed at Camp Arrowhead.

N. DAMAGES

Any damage to Staff area tents, equipment, or other items will be the financial responsibility of the Unit(s) assigned to that campsite during the event.

O. TREES

Attendees are not to cut down or cut branches from any live trees. There are many young trees that have been planted in recent years so that others who follow us will have shade and protection. Please be careful of these saplings and young trees and do everything you can to protect them. **ANY SCOUTS FOUND DAMAGING OR DEFACING ANY TREES WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE THIS EVENT.**

P. CHECK-OUT

ALL UNITS MUST Check-out with the Webelos Woods/ Cub O’ Ree Camp Director before departing. Checkout **WILL INCLUDE** a campsite inspection to verify that all litter has been removed and that the site has not been damaged. Patches will be received once check-out is completed.

III. GENERAL INFORMATION

A. CHECK-IN

CHECK-IN WILL BEGIN AT CAMP ARROWHEAD AT 4:00 P.M. ON FRIDAY, November 8, 2024. The Camp gates will not open till 4:00 p.m. The Unit Leader must present BSA Medical Forms A & B, Roster of everyone in the unit attending, and pay any outstanding fees at Check-In.

B. FIRE PROTECTION

Each Unit will provide its own water bucket to extinguish its campfire before leaving the campsite.

C. WATER

Camp Arrowhead has a readily available water supply. Each unit should provide containers for transporting and containing water. Remember, each unit will need water for the fire cans. Each Scout and Adult should bring a personal water bottle, canteen, etc. for use during the program sessions.

D. COOKING

Each unit must furnish its own food, ice, cook stove, propane, firewood, and/or charcoal. **NO FOOD IS PROVIDED FOR THIS EVENT** by Staff.

E. PACK/DEN/PATROL FLAGS

Each Pack/Den/Patrol should bring its own Pack/Den/Patrol flag to post in the Pack/Den/Patrol campsite. However, there will be no Pack/Den/Patrol flag competition.

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F. PACK/DEN/PATROL SPIRIT

Each Pack/Den/Unit should have a Pack/Den/Patrol Yell and the Pack/Den/Patrol is welcome to demonstrate it during the events portion of Saturday. The most spirited Pack/Den/Patrol with the best (not loudest) Pack/Den/Patrol Yell will receive special recognition.

G. PACK/DEN/PATROL EQUIPMENT

The minimum should include Tents, for all attendees, Water containers, First Aid Kit, Toilet Paper, Cooking Gear, Shovel, and Trash Bags. As well as anything you would instruct your scouts, leaders, and parents to bring per your pack/troop packing suggestions. The Duty Roster, and First Aid Kit must be readily available at each campsite in case of emergency evacuation, or injury.

H. PERSONAL EQUIPMENT

Each attendee will be responsible for packing and bringing his/her own personal gear. Please reach out to your Cubmaster/Scoutmaster, Den Leader/Patrol Leader for any questions you may have in regard to what you should pack for camp.

I. MEALS

Dinner should be eaten before coming to camp on Friday evening. A nice cracker barrel or some ooey gooey s'mores make for a great treat after setting up camp. The Saturday morning meal should be suitable to get the Scouts through a long and tiring day. Saturday lunch should be a light meal requiring minimal preparation, as the lunch period is limited. Saturday evening's meal will be a good opportunity for the Scouts to display their culinary expertise or a meal prepared as individuals. Sunday morning should be an easy clean-up meal to be efficient with vacationing from camp on time.

J. UNIT LEADER/PLC MEETING

The Unit Leader/PLC **MUST** attend a **meeting on Friday evening, November 8, at 9:15 p.m.** at Foster's Lodge. Questions about Check-In materials received, or the schedule of activities can be resolved at this time. Any additional information on activities will also be presented at this meeting.
