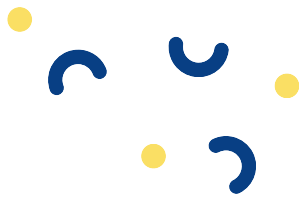

Join us for a magical evening at the campfire with Tribe of Lone Bear, featuring:

- **Music and Dancing:** Experience authentic outdoor traditions



This immersive experience will transport Scouts into the rich history and traditions of outdoor adventure while building confidence and group participation.

CAMPING POLICIES

ALL PARTICIPANTS ARE REQUIRED TO ADHERE TO THE RULES, POLICIES, AND REGULATIONS OF SCOUTING AMERICA.



1. Pack and Troop Camping Sites

Troops will camp on the West Side. Packs will camp on the East Side. Packs and Troops can not camp together due to the new Scouting America policy.

2. Buddy System

Scouts must always use the buddy system—no one should be alone.

3. Health & Safety

A nurse or EMT will be on-site all weekend. Submit completed medical forms (Parts A & B) at check-in. Report injuries or illnesses immediately.

4. Fire Safety

Fires are allowed only in designated fire rings or grills. Never leave fires unattended; keep water or an extinguisher nearby. Adult supervision required for fire-building.

5. Tobacco-Free Campus

This campus strictly prohibits the use of tobacco and alcohol.

6. Restrooms

Restrooms are located near the pool. Adults must use the facilities clearly labeled 'Adults Men's and Women's'. Youth must use the facilities labeled 'Youth Men and Women'. Please note: Adults are not permitted in youth restrooms, and youth are not permitted in adult restrooms.

7. Trash & Clean-Up

Dispose of trash in designated barrels and leave campsites cleaner than you found them. Follow Leave No Trace principles. Store food in sealed containers to avoid attracting wildlife.

8. Wildlife & Nature

Do not feed or approach wildlife. Stay on marked trails and respect the environment.

9. Quiet Hours

Quiet hours are from 9:30 PM to 6:00 AM.

10. Prohibited Items

No alcohol, tobacco, fireworks, weapons, or pets (except service animals).

11. Weather Preparedness

Camp runs rain or shine—pack rain gear and extra layers.

12. Parking

Park only in designated areas; vehicles must be moved after unloading. CHECK IN UPON ARRIVAL AND BEFORE LEAVING.

13. Respect & Behavior

Show respect to others; bullying or inappropriate behavior will not be tolerated.

14. Emergency Procedures

Follow staff instructions during emergencies and assemble in designated areas.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What is Webelos Woods?

A: Webelos Woods is designed to provide Scouts, den leaders, and parents with resources to complete requirements for Webelos/AOL adventure badges in an outdoor setting. Each badge will be taught by experienced leaders, and specialty programs will enhance the Scouts' experience with new skills and fun activities.

Q: How can I register?

A: Registration is available through the Ozark Trails Council website. Please communicate with your pack leadership for registration details.

Q: Are families expected to camp?

A: Yes, parents and families are expected and encouraged to camp with their Scouts on Webelos and Arrow of Light campouts, as these events are designed for the Scouts to attend with their parents or guardians. While a registered adult leader must be present for these camping events, the primary camping participants are the youth Scout members and their families.

Q: What is the cost to attend?

A: *Youth:* \$25 *Adults:* \$15

Q: What is included in the cost?

A: The fee covers program materials and access to camping. Meals are NOT included.

Q: What is the check-in process?

A: Check-in begins Friday, October 24th, at 4:00 PM at Camp Arrowhead. All participants must check in with the health team and provide completed medical forms (Parts A & B).

Q: Can my Scout attend for Saturday only?

A: Yes, day-only participation is allowed. Check-in for day participants is Saturday morning from 8:00 AM. THERE IS NO PRICE DIFFERENCE.

Q: What should we pack?

- *For the Day:* Water bottle, rain gear, pen/paper, comfortable outdoor clothing, hiking or athletic shoes, lunch, and food to cook for a panel of judges for our tailgate event.

• *For Overnight Camping:* tent, sleeping bag, flashlight, toiletries, and any other necessary camp supplies.
