Staff: \$35		Staffing the majority of the weekend, and camping/ eating as staff.

Step 2: Google Form- Campsite Request

This form is only completed once per unit. It will ask which camp you would like to camp in, and then ask for a campsite preference. There is a "no preference" option. The last question is for units that know they will have unregistered Cub Scout parents with them as we have to mark those campsites differently.


