WHO CAN ATTEND

Everyone is welcome! Cub Scouts, Scouts, Venturers, Explorers, Sea Scouts, adult volunteers, Scouting families, and the general public are invited to attend. Come with your unit or as a family.

Some activities will be limited to youth of certain ages. Children not yet enrolled in kindergarten are welcome to attend but will not be able to participate in any of the age-restricted activities. Parents are directly responsible for the care and supervision of their children. Guests not registered in a Scouting program are only permitted to visit Saturday, April 26, cannot camp overnight, and will submit a Non-Scout Guest Hold-Harmless agreement upon arrival.

Leadership and Youth Protection Guidelines: All participants must adhere to Scouting America's youth protection guidelines, including providing adequate adult supervision and appropriate camping accommodations. REGISTRATION

Cost: \$30 per youth / \$15 per adult

- Scouts and Scouters: Registered members of Scouting programs can attend on Saturday or camp for the weekend! The price is the same for both.
- Non-Scout Guests: Guests not registered in Scouting programs are welcome too, but can only attend on Saturday and no overnight camping is permitted.

WHAT TO BRING

ESSENTIAL PACKING LIST

Campers should pack wisely and lightly. Check the weather before you pack, and try to limit electronics, as most campsites lack electricity and there will be no charging stations available.

BRING

- For overnight campers: tent, sleeping bag, camping gear, change of clothes, toiletries
- Meals, cooking gear, plates, and utensils
- Closed-toed, closed-heel walking shoes
- · Re-usable water bottle
- Flashlights or headlamps with extra batteries
- Sunscreen
- Rain gear (Activities will be rain or shine!)
- Non-aerosol insect repellent
- · Any necessary medications
- Scouting America members must bring Annual Health and Medical Record (parts A and B)

DO NOT BRING

- Alcohol or drugs
- Fireworks
- Bikes, skateboards, ATVs
- Firearms
- Pets

IMPORTANT INFO.

EMERGENCY INFORMATION

The Camp Health Officer will be on site for the entire weekend. The First Aid Station is located in the Administration Building. All program areas will have contact information for the health officer if assistance is needed.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

- All youth and adults registered in Scouting programs must bring their Annual Health and Medical Record (Parts A & B) but keep it with leaders, parents, or themselves—event staff won't collect forms. Inform staff of any health concerns at check-in.
- Unit leaders and families should handle basic first aid, as they would on any campout. First aid stations will be available for additional needs.
- Non-Scout guests don't need a health form but must participate only in suitable activities and submit a Non-Scout Guest Hold-Harmless Agreement upon arrival.
- Additional parental consent forms or waivers may be required for certain activities.

WEATHER

Adventure Summit 25 will proceed rain or shine. We'll monitor the weather closely and collaborate with event staff to ensure safety

REFUND POLICY

We understand that plans can change unexpectedly. However, due to the nature of events at our campgrounds and the commitments we must make in advance, we are unable to offer refunds once registration is complete. We appreciate your understanding and encourage you to contact us if you have any questions or concerns.

EVENT SCHEDULE

A final event schedule will be distributed at check-in. A draft is included at the end of this guide.

LOGISTICS INFO

PARKING & CHECK-IN INFORMATION

After arriving at Rhodes France Scout Reservation, proceed to the left of the camp sign to the parking lot. Vehicles not towing trailers should park in the lot upon arrival. Vehicles pulling trailers should continue on the road to near the registration building and park along the road.

For vehicles with trailers - check-in at the Registration Building for further instructions.
 You'll be able to pull the trailer back to the campsite and drop it there. The vehicle pulling the trailer will then need to come back to the parking lot.

After units have parked - at least 1 adult leader from each unit will need to proceed to the registration building to check-in. This person should know who all is on site and ready to be checked in. The leader will receive a packet containing wrist bands, schedules, and other information.

Health forms are not needed at check-in, but leaders must notify the staff of any individuals with conditions that the staff should be aware of. Any Range and Target Permission forms, Climbing Permission forms, and Non-Scout Hold-Harmless agreements (if applicable) should be turned in at check-in.

After checking in you'll be able to proceed to your campsite to set up.

CAMPING INFORMATION

Units will be camping in the campsites at Rhodes France. Below are some simple camping rules to follow:

- You will most likely be sharing the campsite with other units remember to be Friendly, Courteous, and Kind when sharing.
- Campsites should be returned to the state they were in when you arrived. Any trash should be disposed of in the dumpsters in the parking lot. Fire Rings should be cleaned.
- Participants may use latrines in the campsites. There are porta pots available in a few locations as well. Flushing facilities are available in the Shower House behind the Administration Building.
- All units must have proper adult leadership and follow all YPT Guidelines.
