Check-in will start at 5:00 pm and end at 8:00 pm. Please make sure you have the proper health forms for each participant.

SPL and Scoutmaster meeting will be at Bailey Lodge **Friday at 8:00 pm**. We will discuss the details for the following day.

The program will start on **Saturday at 8:45** with worship services followed by Flag Raising and **9:50am** and activities to follow.

Don't forget to **bring a sled**. You will need one for the sled race.

There will be a dutch oven cook-off for all scouters and Scout Masters. Your dish will be judged for a special award.

Campfire will begin at **7:00 pm Saturday night**.

There will also be **Chapter Meetings** for all of those scouts and scouters in the OA at Bailey Lodge following the campfire.

Cold Weather Camping

Cold Weather Comfort & Safety:

A key fundamental of cold weather camping and outings is to KEEP DRY. Moisture will reduce the insulating properties of almost everything. An easy acronym to remember is COLD.

C Keep yourself and your clothes Clean.

O Avoid Overheating.

L Wear clothes loose and in Layers

D Keep Dry

Important Information

The following rules were made to help us have a successful and safe camping experience. It is the responsibility of the adult in charge to see that their Scouts know and understand these rules. Anyone caught violating these rules may be asked to leave camp.

Remember to always follow the Scout Oath, the Scout Law, and the Outdoor Code.

Caution **What's going on with the lake?**

Little Grassy Lake is currently being drained to take pressure off the levee that is in need of repair. The US Army Corps of Engineers is in a seven-year restoration of the dam, levee, and lake. Marine biologists are excited to be able to build fish habitats from the bottom up. So when completed, the lake hopes to be the best and abundant lake for fishing in the region. It gives us a unique opportunity to see geological formations that have been unseen for almost a century. Make sure there is Adult supervision if your units go down to explore the lake. Please leave anything dangerous where it lies and notify camp officials.

Registration & Fees

The cost will be \$15Y/\$10A per person. This includes a patch, camp fees, activity supplies, etc. Registration will be done online. A link will be provided on your district Facebook page.

Forms:

You must have the following forms with you at the time of check-in at Fall Camporee:

- Unit Roster (included in Klondike Leader Guide)
- Two (2) copies of the Annual Health and Medical Record (AHMR) (Part A, B1 and B2) for each participant.

The Camporee Health Officer will keep one copy, and the unit shall keep the other copy in their possession.

- If there are any participant restrictions noted in Part A, this should be brought to the attention of the Fall Camporee Staff during check-in (all restrictions should be discussed).
- All participants (including youth) must also sign Part A.
- Immunizations must be noted on the AHMR.
- There will NOT be any blank copies of the Annual Health and Medical Record available at check-in. Anyone without the AHMR will be asked to Leave.

Youth Protection Requirements:

All adults must be current with their Youth Protection training to attend the camporee. The District Executive and/or Fall Camporee staff will be verifying this prior to the event. Anyone not current will be asked to leave immediately.

Cost:

Cost shown is per person:

\$15.00 registration for youth and \$10 for adults. This does not include your food. Registration closes on 1-11-2026, at 11:59 p.m.

All participants must be registered in Scouts BSA, Venturing, Sea Scouts or Explorers. Visitors will NOT be allowed at this event unless previous arrangements have been made with the Property Lead and/or District Executive.

Check-in & Check-out

Check-in will be at Bailey Lodge and must be completed by an adult in charge. You will need to turn in your health forms at this time. NO scouts or adults will be permitted to go to the campsite until checked in. Garbage will be picked up Saturday evening by a staff member. A staff member will inspect the troop's campsite before check-out. Troops are asked to take trash to the dumpster. Don't forget to pick up your health forms.

Vehicles in Camp

No vehicles will be permitted in camp except a single vehicle towing a troop trailer. Individuals requiring handicapped access are asked to register their vehicle upon arrival. All vehicles will be removed from the camping area and parked in the parking lot for the duration of the Camporee.

Speed limit is 5 mph. No passengers in the back of an open truck or trailer. Only vehicles with passes are allowed beyond the parking area. Vehicle towing trailers must be removed to the parking lot. Only handicapped individual's vehicles are allowed in campsites with appropriate documentation and camp vehicle pass.

Campsites

Please be courteous to other people in the camp and observe campsite cleanliness and quiet hours. Each troop will be expected to keep the latrines clean. Troop leaders are responsible for monitoring functionality of the facilities and notifying camp staff if assistance is needed.

Campfires

Fires are only allowed in the fire ring at each campsite. Follow the "Leave NO Trace" principles. **No fires may be unattended.** All liquid fuels and propane must be used under adult supervision.

Lights Out

Scouts are not allowed out of their campsite after lights out, except to go to and from the latrine. Make sure your scouts are quiet after lights out.

Saturday Activities

See event schedule for further details. There will be a campfire program. Make sure your unit has a skit and/or song prepared.

Meals

The units are responsible for their own breakfast (7 am - 8:30 am), lunch (11:00 am - 1:00 pm), and dinner (5:30 pm-7:00 pm)

Health & Safety

The **buddy system should be used at all times**. A responsible adult (21 or older) must be in camp at all times. **Two Deep Leadership is strictly observed**. You are responsible for your scouts.

Pets, fireworks, alcoholic beverages, non-prescription drugs, and firearms are not permitted in camp.

All troops are responsible for minor First Aid for their troop members. Major injuries requiring trained medical attention should be reported immediately to camp staff at the Health Lodge.

Please have proper health forms for each participant.

Please make sure all of your scouts are educated on how to dress properly for the cold weather. Also, all shoes must be closed toed.

Sessions

Session 1:

Shelter Building - Scouts will have on their sled the materials to build an emergency shelter that will fit everyone in their patrol. Tents or other ready-made shelters are not acceptable. Materials could include tarps, rope, tent stakes, etc.

Session 2:

Fire Building Instruction and egg boil. We have seen varying degrees of aptitude in fire-building competitions in our prior camporees. We will teach a session on proper fire building techniques, especially in inclement weather. The scouts will then get to build a fire to boil an egg. The patrol should bring a pot or mess kit in which to cook their egg.

Session 3:

First-Aid Challenge - Scouts will have to provide first aid for winter related scenarios like: frostbite, hypothermia, burns, broken bones, transporting someone who can't walk, someone who has fallen through ice, and others.

Session 4:

Sled Zipline - Scouts will have to get their sled and equipment over an obstacle using a zipline. Scouts will **NOT** be crossing the zipline themselves, just their sled and equipment.

Sled Contents:

Your sled should have the following contents: First Aid Kit, blanket or sleeping bag, rope, tarp, cook pot or mess kit, dry tinder, matches in some sort of waterproofing, wood cutting tool with proper guard,

Sled Race

Sleds and scouts who will be pulling the sled will meet at Akela's Lodge at 4pm. The Leaders will meet at the Parade Grounds where the race will conclude. The scouts will be racing to the Troop Lodge.

Dutch Oven Cook-Off

Calling all Scoutmasters and scouters, this one's for you! Your challenge is to come up with the best dutch oven dish. Bring your entry to the parade grounds for flag lowering. There will be 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place awards.

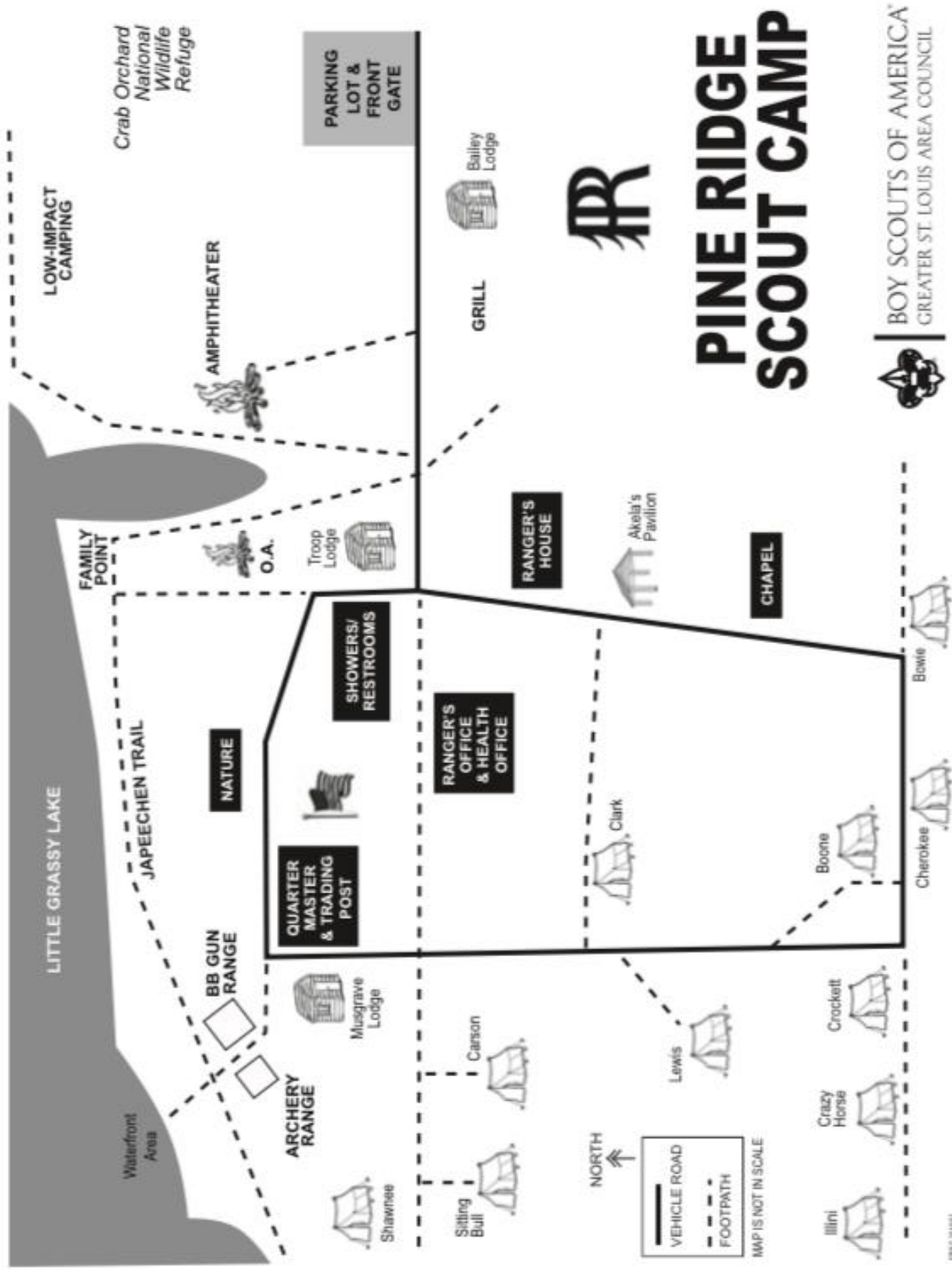
Campfire
