Camping MB Pre-reqs : 3 written plan, 4b, 5e, 7b, 8d, 9

#3. Make a written plan for an overnight trek and show how to get to your camping spot by using a topographic map and one of the following:

- a. A compass
- b. A GPS receiver
- c. A smartphone with a GPS app

#4b. help a Scout patrol or a Webelos Scout unit in your area prepare for an actual overnight campout, including creating the duty roster, menu planning, equipment needs, general planning, and setting up camp.

#5e. Present yourself to your Scoutmaster with your pack for inspection. Be correctly clothed and equipped for an overnight campout.

#7b. Pack your own gear and your share of the patrol equipment and food for proper carrying. Show that your pack is right for quickly getting what is needed first, and that it has been assembled properly for comfort, weight, balance, size, and neatness.

#8d. While camping in the outdoors, cook at least one breakfast, one lunch, and one dinner for your patrol from the meals you have planned for requirement 8c. at least one of those meals must be a trail meal requiring the use of a lightweight stove. (these meals cannot be counted for the Cooking MB)

#9. Show experience in camping by doing the following:

- a. Camp a total of at least 20 nights at designated Scouting activities or events. One long-term Camping experience of up to six consecutive nights may be applied toward this requirement. Sleep each night under the sky or in a tent you have pitched. If the camp provides a tent that has already been pitched, you need not pitch your own tent.
- b. On any of these camping experiences, you must do TWO of the following, only with proper preparation and under qualified supervision.
 1. Hike up a mountain, gaining at least 1,000 vertical feet.
 2. Backpack, snowshoe, or cross-country ski for at least 4 miles.
 3. Take a bike trip of at least 15 miles or at least 4 hours.
 4. Take a nonmotorized trip on the water of at least 4 hours or 5 miles.
 5. Plan and carry out an overnight snow camping experience.
 6. Rappel down a rappel route of 30 feet or more.
- c. On any of these camping experiences, perform a conservation project approved by the landowner or land managing agency. This can be done alone or with others.

For 9b: the camp counselor for Camping MB will count the hike up Mt. Logan on Thursday evening (whether or not the scout stays the night) for 9 b #1.

The Camp Lewallen float trips on the St. Francis are long enough to count for 9 b #4.
