Weekend Rules & Guidelines

Camp Code

- The Scout Oath and Scout Law serve as the camp code of conduct. Violations may result in a Scout, or an entire den, being asked to leave the event.

Campfire Program

- The Campfire program begins at 7:00 PM Saturday at the Council Ring (near the swings).
- Lions, Tigers, Wolves, Bears, and Webelos will learn a song during the day to perform at Campfire. Song sheets will be handed out during sessions.

Campsites

- Campsite assignments are handed out on the day of the event.
- Assignments are organized by pack; small packs and individual campers are grouped together.
- Campsites are assigned based on the number of tents in your group.
- Questions about your campsite? Ask Rob or Chris.

Checkout

- Clean the campsite: Gather all trash and place all waste into the designated camp dumpsters.
- Extinguish fires: Completely put out any campfires with water until cool to the touch. All wood and ashes need to be removed from the ring and thrown into the woods.
- Schedule an inspection: Arrange for a walkthrough with a Call of the Wild staff.
- Conduct the walkthrough: An adult leader and a Call of the Wild staff will jointly inspect the area.
- Strict Deadline: Your pack must finish checking out and vacate Cub World by 9:00 AM on Sunday.

Cub World

- Call of the Wild has access to most of Cub World, including the Mine and the Pirate Ship, but not to Mud Cave, Fort Hussman, or Eagle Nest.

Fires

- Ground fires are allowed but must be contained to existing fire pits.
- Fires should not be left unattended, and must be completely extinguished before going to bed or leaving camp



First Aid

- Minor First Aid (Cuts, Scraps, etc.) should be handled by parents and leaders.
- The First Aid Station is located at Emerson Center, with a trained medical office located on-site.

Garbage & Cleanup

- All trash must go into trash bags and be disposed of properly, away from the campsite.
- Each pack is responsible for taking out all its own trash. The main dumpsters are beside the Cub World parking lot and back up dumpsters at the Cub Ranger Maintenance Area.
- It is recommended that packs throw their campsite garbage in the dumpster each night to prevent critters from accessing it.

Health Forms

- Health Forms A & B are required for everyone attending and must be turned into the Registration Pavilion before or at the check-in table the morning of the event. Forms will be returned at the end.

Meals

- Lunch will be provided at the Quartermaster's Pavilion. There is no seating. Diners may bring their own chairs or take their meals back at their campsite.

LOE/BALOO Trained Leaders

- Packs are not required to have a LOE/BALOO-trained leader present because there will be at least one or more on site.

Parking

- Park in the lot in front of Cub World.

Pressurized Fuel

- Pressurized fuel lanterns and stoves are allowed but may only be used by an adult with proper training. All fuel must be stored properly and kept away from tents.

Prohibited Items

- Alcohol, illegal drugs, tobacco products, and vaping devices are strictly prohibited. Medications taken as prescribed by a licensed healthcare provider are permitted.

Transportation

- Scouts riding in vehicles must be in proper passenger seats, always wearing seat belts. Riding in truck beds or on tailgates is prohibited.

Wristbands

- Lost wristbands may be replaced at the Registration Pavilion.



Session Rules & Guidelines

Adult Participation

- Adults accompanying Cub Scouts are expected to help their Scouts remain focused during sessions. There are a lot of exciting activities, and it can be a lot to take in.
- If your group has several adults along, please volunteer to help run a session for the day — all volunteers are appreciated. Contact Rob or Chris or stop by the Registration Pavilion.

Hiking

- Each rank will participate in a hike to fulfill a belt loop requirement, with Tigers completing a shorter hike. Scouts must wear appropriate footwear, as trails are unpaved and travel through wooded areas. Physical restrictions must be disclosed at check-in.

Lions (Kindergartners) & Tigers (1st Graders)

- Each Lion and Tiger are required to have a parent or guardian with them at all activities. Parents and guardians are expected to participate in session activities alongside their Scouts.

Wolves (2nd Graders), Bears (3rd Graders), & Webelos (4th Graders)

- Wolves, Bears, and Webelos dens should be accompanied by a couple of adults to assist and help manage the scouts during activities.

- ☐ Washcloth or towel
- ☐ Soap
- ☐ Toilet paper
- ☐ Extra plastic bag or container
