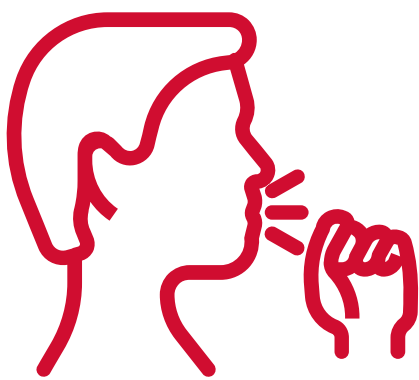


Know Before You Go

- Stay home if you have tested positive for COVID-19 or are awaiting test results.
- Stay home if you are experiencing any of the following: nausea, diarrhea, headaches with other symptoms, shortness of breath, cough, flu-like symptoms, chills, body aches, sore throat, severe fatigue, a fever of 100.4 or higher, loss of taste or smell, or repeated shaking with chills and shortness of breath.
- Individuals that are at a heightened-risk for COVID-19 should not attend camp or should consult their doctor on the risk of attending summer camp.
- For two weeks prior to camp, limit social activities to groups of no more than 15.
- Campers are encouraged to bring their own camp chair and eye protection for shooting sports (if applicable) to limit their use of these shared supplies.

Minimizing Risk at Camp

- All campers will have symptoms checked upon arrival.
- Unit leaders will screen campers daily at their campsites.
- Campers exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 or contagious disease will be required to leave camp.
- Masks are encouraged, but not required.
- All shared supplies and facilities will be disinfected regularly.
- Ample hand sanitizer will be available at activity and eating areas.
- Where possible, campers will be separated and kept in small groups.
- Visitors are permitted during dates/times assigned by each camp. Visitors should follow the same protocols as campers. Visitors are limited to outdoor areas unless hazardous weather or other needs necessitate use of indoor facilities.

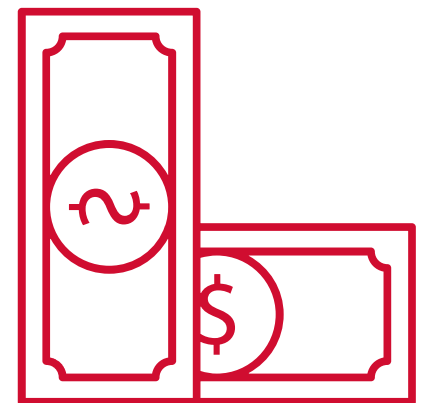


Positive Symptoms or Exposure

- Campers must notify their unit leader and camp director as soon as they experience symptoms or receive a positive test. They are required to leave camp.
- Local departments of public health are no longer issuing quarantine orders as a result of close contact with a positive case. At this time, individuals who are exposed to COVID-19 are permitted to participate in Scouting activities/camps as long as they remain symptom-free and do not test positive for COVID-19.

No-penalty Refund Policy

- Refunds will be offered to anyone who feels uncomfortable attending camp due to COVID-19 or anyone who cannot attend camp due to COVID-19.
- If a camper (youth or adult) only attends a partial session of camp due to showing symptoms of COVID-19, then the refund will be prorated based on how many days the camper attended.
- A refund will not be given if someone is asked to leave camp for not following camp policies.



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
