- *Sleeping pad*
- *Ground cloth*

EATING (MESS) KIT

- *Spoon*
- *Plate*

CLEANUP (PERSONAL HYGIENE) KIT

- *Soap*
- *Toothbrush*
- *Toothpaste*
- *Dental floss*
- *Comb*
- *Washcloth*
- *Towel*

- *Notebook or paper*
- *Pencil or pen*
