



2026 Day Camp: Dinosaurs Skills Camp!

Are you ready for Cub Scout Day Camp? Then have your Cub Scout grab their gear and join us for an awesome adventure! Scouts will participate in many types of activities including Dinosaur survival skills, fossils digs, leather, hiking, BB guns, and all-around fun.

How Do I Register My Scout?

Cub Scout Day Camp provides fun and adventure June 3rd-6th. Black Otter District Day Camp is supported by trained volunteer leadership, held at Kuhlman Ranch. Located near the Pictograph Cave in Billings, MT.

Day Camp youth participants are limited to registered Cub Scouts members. When selecting RANK in your registration, you should use the den that the Scout will be entering for the 2026-2027 school year.

Tiger (entering 1st grade) Must have guardian attend with them. Does not count as a volunteer.

Wolf (entering 2nd grade)

Bear (entering 3rd grade)

Webelos (entering the 4th grade)

Arrow of Light (entering 5th grade)

The registration fee for Cub Scout Day camp is \$55. Fees include T-shirt, activity patch, program supplies, DAFFY's and snacks. However, additional T-shirts may be purchased for Tiger parents, volunteers, or youth who may like an additional shirt for \$20. For adults volunteering in stations or as Walk Around Leaders, you will be given a camp t-shirt, patch, DAFFY's, and a thank you gift. **When registering please note the deadline for T-shirts, as registration after this date will result in receiving a camp-colored bandana.**

Volunteer Opportunities

Adult volunteers are needed to serve as Walk Around Leaders and as Station Volunteers every day of the camp. Station volunteers will work with the camp administration team to determine where they best fit to help run a station. Station volunteers attend camp for FREE. Station Volunteers must be current SYT and must attend training prior to camp. Station volunteers do not need to be registered. You will not be walking with your Scout. Walk Round Leaders take on the responsibility of a den and lead them from station to station. Walk Around Leaders must be a registered Scouter with a current SYT and must attend training prior to camp. To help us ensure that we remain an accredited camp and for the safety of the youth, each Pack is required to send 2 registered adults on Wednesday and Thursday AND 2 registered adults on Friday and Saturday.

Health Forms

Scouting America has established minimum standards for providing medical information prior to participating in various activities. Parts A and B are to be completed by all those attending camp. It is recommended to make a copy of your health forms and your insurance card, rather than submit your original. They will not be returned at the completion of Day Camp, unless picked up on your last day of camp. Please submit your medical Forms A and B to the Scout Office by May 27th. The Scout Office is located at 1310 24th St. West, Billings MT.

What Should All Attendants Bring to Camp?

Please make sure to label all gear

Hat

Long pants

Closed toed shoes

Camp shirt or bandana

Sunscreen-This will be handed into the Camp Medic each day of camp.

Bug Repellent- This will be handed into the Camp Medic each day of camp.

Refillable Water Bottle

Lunch -please make sure to NOT include sodas or energy drinks as they attract wildlife such as yellow jackets.

Personal gear in a daypack

Sweater or jacket

Rain gear

Medication- must be in their original container with their name. These are to be handed into the Camp Medic, each day of camp. EPI Pens and Inhalers will remain with the Scout but will be checked each day to make sure they have it.

Cub Scout Day Camp is a Valuable Activity for Many Reasons

- Provides continuation of the Cub Scout program during the summer.
- Provides opportunities for fellowship, fun, and meeting new Scouts.
- Counts towards your Summertime Fun Adventure.
- Completion of BB Guns Adventure Elective (this can only be completed at District Events)
- Offers character development, citizenship training, and personal fitness.
- Meets individual needs and interests by offering a meaningful and educational Scouting program.
- Helps to recruit new Scouts in the den and pack during the summer.
- Promotes fun and adventure with a purpose.

Adult Volunteers

To help us ensure the safety of our scouts, each Pack is required to send at least 2 registered adults (one being a female, if any youth attending are females) at each camp. Therefore, a Pack would need 2 registered adults for Wednesday and Thursday AND 2 registered adults for Friday and Saturday. These adults will need to stay all day. Please note that adults who are attending with their Tiger Scout DO NOT count towards this ratio. Also, more adults may volunteer as well, but the minimum is 2 adults per camp. For good practice it is recommended to have 1 registered adult volunteer for every 3 youth that sign up. This is the easiest way to meet these guidelines.

In order to verify that each adult is registered with BSA, we are asking for your current Member ID # & the date of your SYT certificate. These can be found in your My.Scouting profile or in Scoutbook.

Per Guide to Safe Scouting: (Effective September 1, 2023)

Two registered adult leaders 21 years of age or over are required at all Scouting activities, including all meetings. There must be a registered female adult leader 21 years of age or over in every unit serving females. A registered female adult leader 21 years of age or over must be present for any activity involving female youth or female adult program participants. Notwithstanding the minimum leader requirements, age and program-appropriate supervision must always be provided.

Adult volunteers must be registered in the unit they are serving. Registration as a merit badge counselor position does not meet this requirement.

Overnight

An overnight option is available ONLY for Webelos and AOLs. A parent or guardian must attend with them. The cost is \$30 for a Scout and one guardian. An additional guardian, Webelos, or AOL is an additional \$15 per person. A scout may NOT share a tent with another family. All guardians attending the overnight must submit a Medical Form side A and B before staying. Campfire entertainment, dinner, breakfast, and Scout Service will be provided. While the Cub Scout program is family driven, it is not conducive to allow scouts from any other rank to camp with their older siblings and thus would not be permitted.

What to Bring for the Overnight

Due to wildlife in the area all food, drinks, and coolers need to be stored in vehicles.

Tent

Bedding

Camp chair

Sleepwear

Toiletries

Hat

Water bottle

Bug spray

Sunscreen

Jacket

Flashlight

Change of clothes

Any medication will need to be in its original contain and check in with the Camp Medic.

Please make sure to label your equipment.

FAQ

DAFFY's are handed out after each station and stand for **D**aily **A**ffirmation **F**or **F**antastic **Y**outh.

Camp is located South of Billings on the way to the Pictograph Caves.

The overnight starts Friday evening and goes until Saturday morning.

During closing campfires families and friends are invited to attend and watch their Scout perform their skit and cheer.
