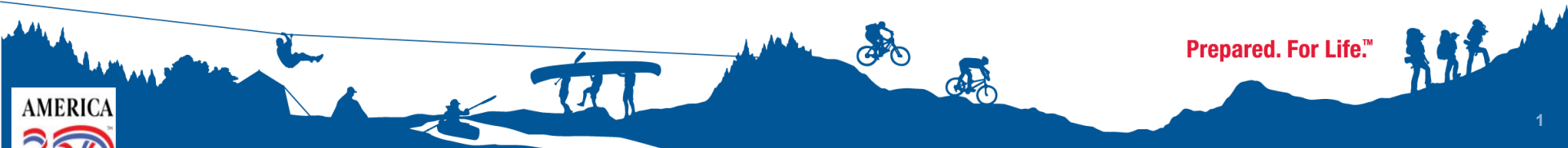




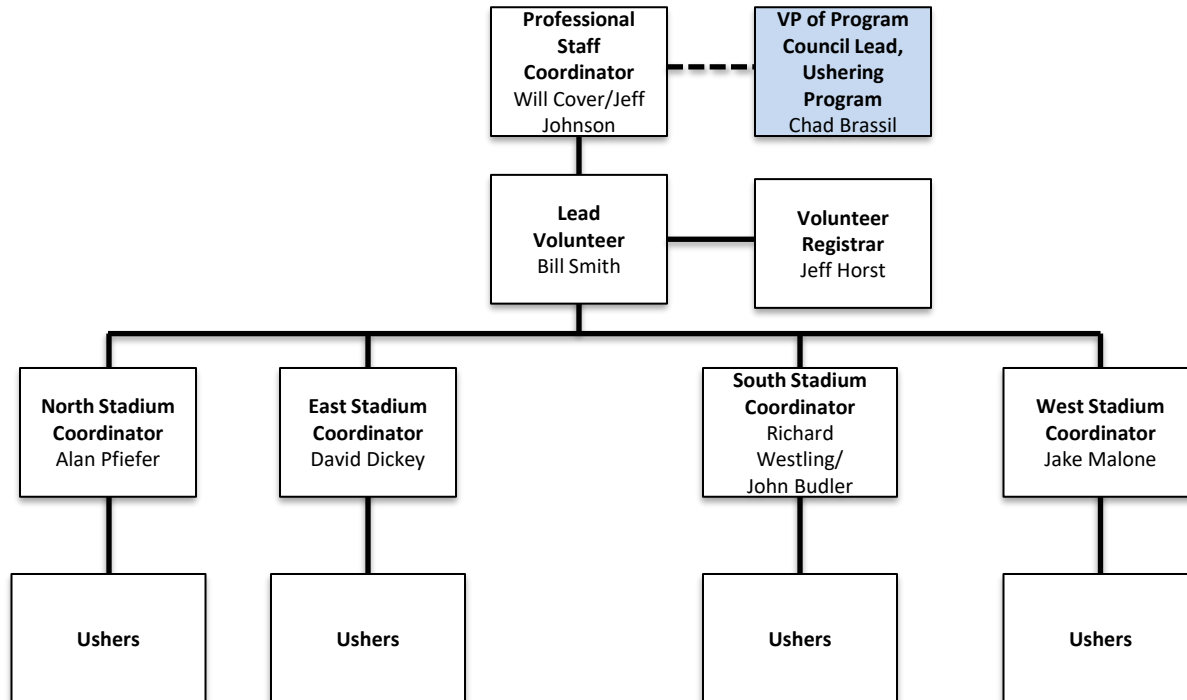
Welcome to Scout Ushering 2026!

- **Training Slides – UNL Police Department & UNL Athletic Department**
- **Scout Oath and Law (S.O.A.L.) will guide you**
- **Ushering Requirements**
 - FULL Uniform (shirt, pants/shorts, socks, belt, orange “Usher” ballcap
 - Current registration in Scouting America
 - Min. age – 12 yrs old
- **Read the Scout Ushering Guide prior to Game Day**
 - Arrive 2 – 3 hours prior. Ohio game: 11am kick-off; 8am – 9am check in. Don't be late.
 - Check in at Gate 17
 - Park on the Innovation campus and grab a shuttle to the stadium
 - Downtown construction + Parking + Shuttle = Plan Accordingly
- **Others:**
 - Stay off the field & walkway behind players' benches
 - “Be Prepared” – check the weather forecast
 - “Foul weather coats” will be check-ed out to ushers for the game (must be returned after the game)
 - Pictures – no selfies with players; no selfies in the tunnel walk.
- **Ushering “Chain of Command”**





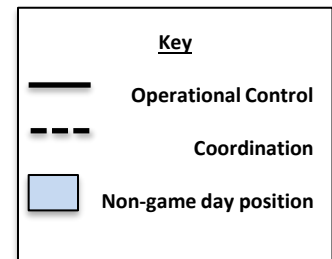
Husker Ushering – Chain of Command

- You are the face of the university (and Scouting) in these moments-
Act accordingly



Safety is Everyone's Responsibility

- Check your area for trip hazards (extension cords, hoses, loose cardboard, etc.)
- Report unattended bags/packages but do not touch or approach them
- Refer to credential boards
- People are assigned access levels for a reason
- Midwest nice does not equal Midwest safe
- POLITE but FIRM



If a fan rushes your gate, refuses to listen, or becomes physically aggressive...



- DO NOT TOUCH THEM OR TRY TO STOP THEM



- Get a detailed physical description



- Engage law enforcement if possible, radio stadium command

- If possible, follow them from a safe distance (Scouters only)

Policy and Procedure Keys



- ALWAYS check your game notes



- Don't guess, ask if you aren't sure
 - Let your event manager know if someone is giving out incorrect information or applying policy incorrectly
 - If something falls into a gray area, check with your event manager

Clear Bags



- All exceptions need to be approved by an intern or event manager
- Don't kick the can down the road.
- If you have questions, ask.
- The medical exemption is for REASONABLE cases
- You don't need a whole backpack to carry an epi-pen
- This policy is CRITICAL to the safety of our fans



Service Animals

- DO NOT ASK WHAT THEIR DISABILITY IS
- Emotional Support Animals are not allowed in athletics venues
- Only two kinds of animals can be service animals
- Always contact your event manager



Parting Thoughts

- We play for Nebraska and Nebraska DESERVES our best

-  • Don't let people drag you into their feelings: You don't have to be upset just because they are

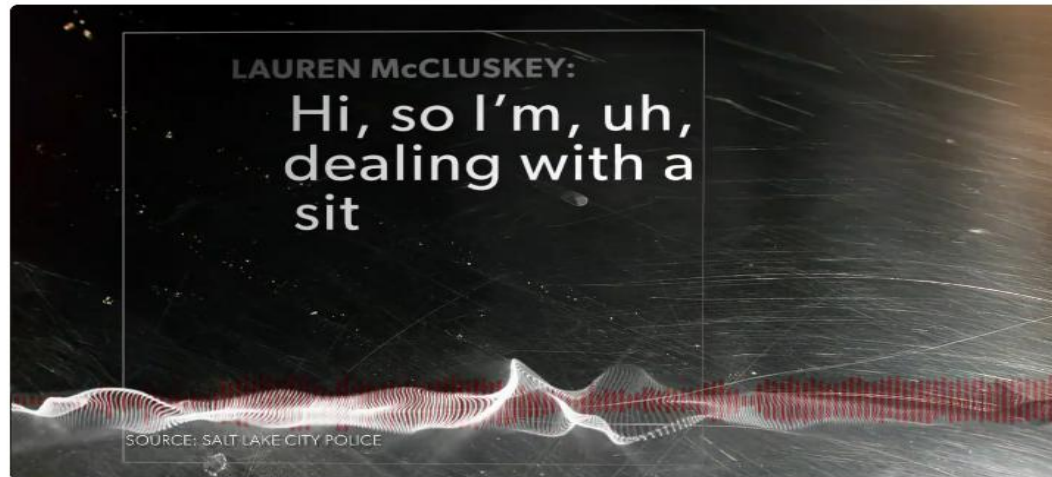

Family of murdered college athlete Lauren McCluskey settles with University of Utah for \$13.5 million

Jay-Z fans were caught on video rushing an entrance to **Yankee Stadium** on Sunday night ahead of **the veteran rapper's third and final performance of three shows** at his hometown stadium, which was delayed roughly three hours as security navigated the massive crowd that had gathered outside, admitting those with tickets, as the already packed audience within the venue were told Jay-Z was waiting to take the stage until everyone who had purchased a ticket could get in.

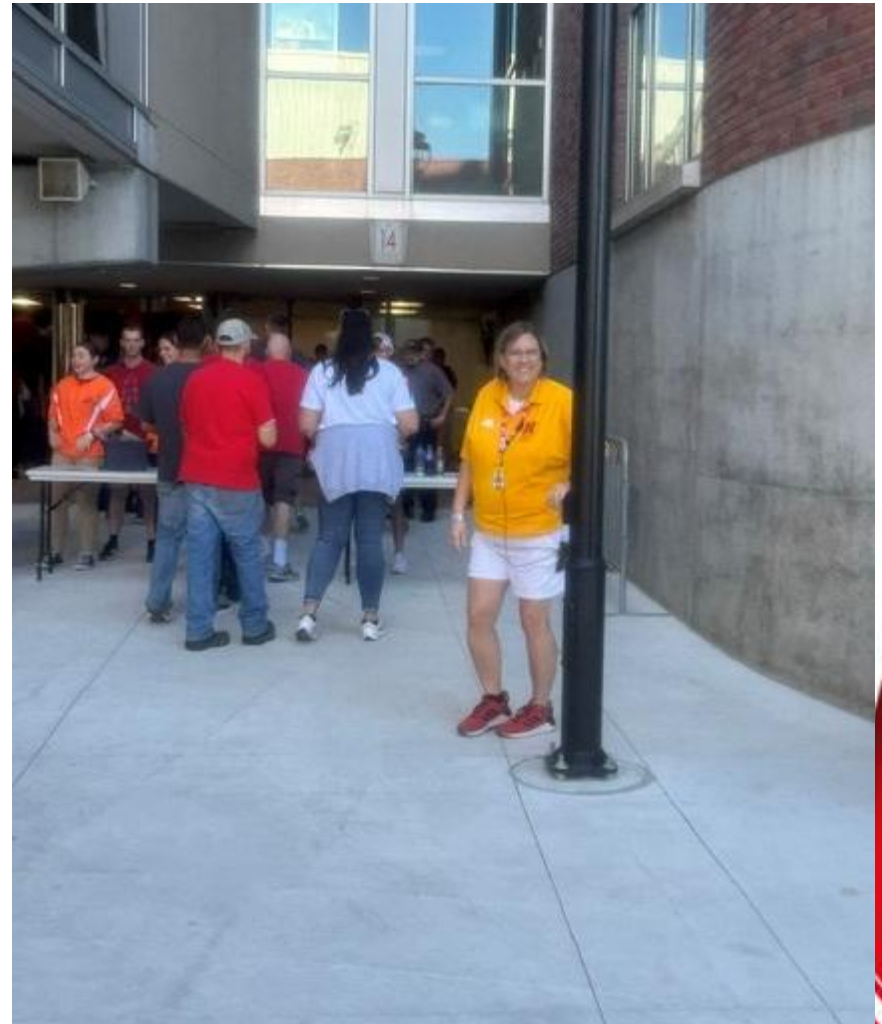

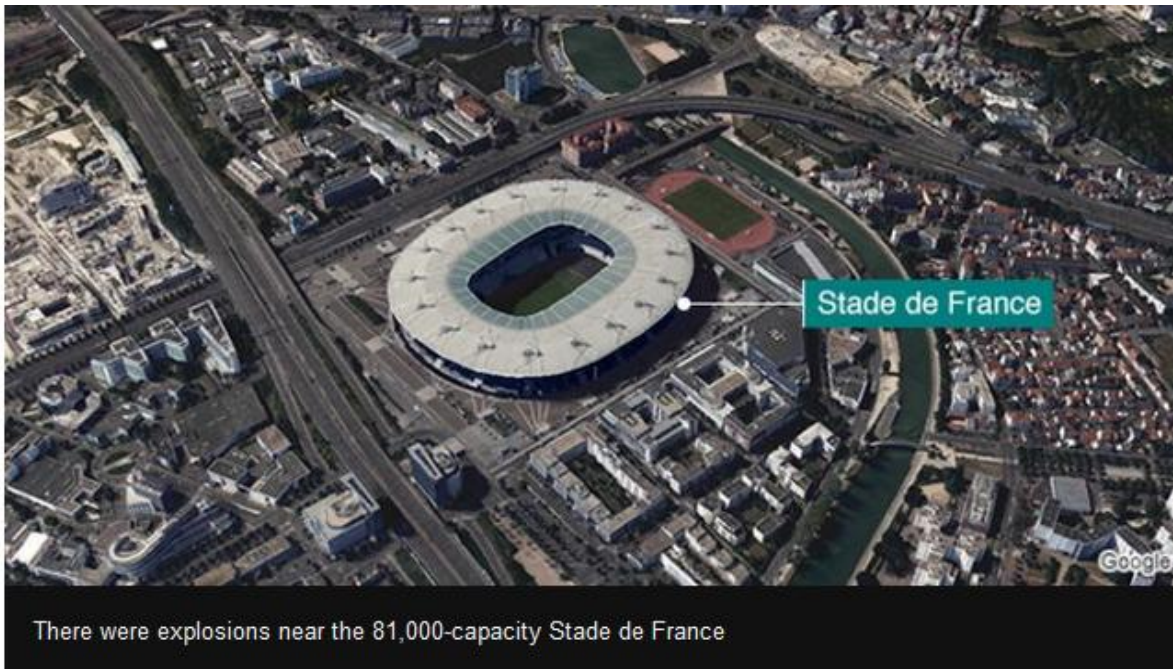

French Stadium Attack 2015



The first of three explosions occurred outside the Stade de France stadium on the northern fringe of Paris where France were playing Germany in an international football friendly.

A man wearing a suicide belt was reportedly prevented from entering the stadium after a routine security check detected the explosives. **According to the Wall Street Journal**, the man backed away from security guards and detonated the explosives.



Oklahoma Suicide Bomber

Bombing: 01 October 2005, on a park bench 173 yards from OU stadium during the second quarter of a night game against Kansas State.



Suspicious “Wandering”



Stadium Attacks

- Disrupted by observant staff
- Behavioral observations:
 - Attackers dressed inappropriately
 - Not engaged like other fans in activity
 - Appeared nervous or distracted
- Eye contact with potential attacker was disruptive
- Potential surveillance of venue beforehand



Key Points

- **Good customer service is one of our best security strategies**
 - **Especially eye contact and attention to customers**
 - **Eyes Forward!!**
- **Need to maintain consistent screening—even when busy and across event**
- **When in doubt, check it out**
- **Trust your judgment when something is out of ordinary**
- **See something, say something Now!**



Assessing Potential Trouble Spots

- We value your observations regarding:
 - Potential concerning behavior
 - Areas of recent or prior problematic behavior
 - Keep eyes on interactions between visiting fans and our fans
 - Keep fans from behind the bench areas

Stadium Protest Activity



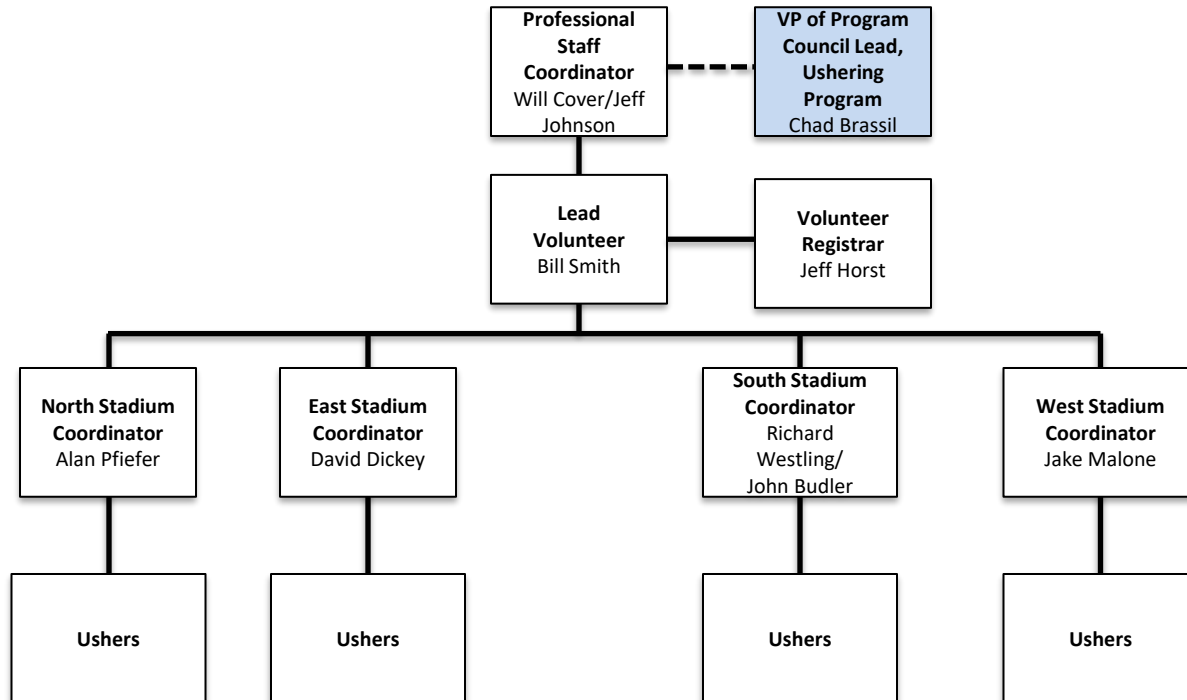
Protests/Disruptions

- Do not engage directly unless requested to do so by supervisor or need to direct away



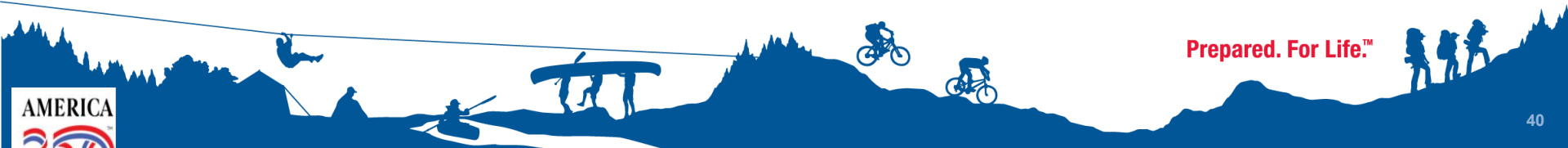
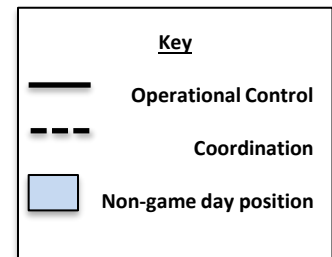
