

## Q & A

Q. Does everyone get a T-shirt and a Patch?

A. Everyone who was registered by Sunday April 8 will get a t-shirt (that is the day we have to submit our order) everyone will get a patch. Registration for Everyone Closes on April 16th. No late registrations will be accepted.

Q. Do we need a park sticker on our vehicles?

A. No the Arbor Lodge State Historical Park is under the jurisdiction of the Arbor Day Farms and does not require the Nebraska State Park Entry permit.

Q. What is our Service Project?

A. Your Project has now been assigned and is attached.

Q What about Meals and Fires?

A Lunch on Saturday is provided by the Big idea, all Other meals are the troops responsibility, Propane Cooking Fires/Camp Stoves/ Elevated Charcoal Grills will be allowed, Wood fire pits elevated or ground will not be allowed. There is Potable Water on site but it is recommended that you arrive with your water jugs filled. Wash/Waste water strainer/dump stations will be located at the portable latrine sites next to the trash cans.

Q. Can we have out troop trailer in our campsite?

A. Unfortunately no. Like so many of our Big Idea Sites, the grounds of the Arbor Lodge Historical Park are not designed and do not usually allow overnight camping. We are being allowed to camp overnight via special permit and as such must be willing to adapt to a low impact/leave no trace concept. Roads within the park will allow you to get your Troop gear close to the open spaces where we will be camping. Gear will need to be unloaded from your trailer and carried in to your troop s allotted camp space. Trailers will then need to be moved to a parking area some distance from the actual camp.

Q. What about our spring district camporee Traditions? Golden Skillet, Silver shovel, Campsite Awards etc.?

A. The camping and program activity portions of the event are your District Spring camporee. Districts will be camping in their own camp areas and will be supervised by their own Volunteer Camping Committees and Activities Volunteers/Commissioners/Camp masters. The various awards presentations of the Districts are scheduled to be a part of the evening campfire program.

Q. What are the Program Activates planned for our Scouts?

A. Program time begins with a lunch followed by presentation of our Awesome guest Speaker Mr. Steven Jackson, followed by a Living History Exposition, Tomahawk Range, Tours of the Arbor Lodge and open program for scouts at the Arbor Day Farms Tree Adventure, presentations from State Foresters (Start your Forestry MB) Evening will have us all back in camp for a Troop meal and then an all encampment closing campfire with district awards as well as other special presentations to our event partners and hosts, as well as a special presentation of a William T. Hornaday Award to a member of the Cornhusker Council.
