

Winter Klondike is a chance to join in one of the oldest traditions in Boy Scouts history- Coming together as a Council for Scouting competition. Council gatherings provide an opportunity to match skills against others within our council. There will be fun, friendship, and fellowship. This guide is intended to help your unit prepare for the fun and excitement of this year's Hawaiian Klondike Extravaganza.

The Scout oath and law will govern the behavior of all participants during the weekend. The principles of Leave No Trace should be always practiced.

All events for the Hawaiian Klondike Derby will be based on basic Scouting skills and concepts taught and used in the rank advancement section of the handbook. They will also include fun type challenge events that require effective communication, leadership, and teamwork to successfully complete. Each patrol will be scored on the events they participate in, and awards will be handed out at the end of the event.

All participating units must provide necessary adults required to run the activity or event.

Registration: The cost per scout attending will be \$ 25 regular fee, \$ 15 early bird, \$ 35 late fee Adults: \$ 20 regular fee, \$ 10 early bird, \$ 30 late fee.

Friday January 17th:


- Arrive in evening, camp, troop time alone.

The sled race is being replaced with Hawaiian games.

Turn your sled into a **Holua Sled**. You need to take off the wheels and attach the sled to a home made surf board that must be large enough to hold 1 patrol member standing on it.

Navigate the course as a patrol with 1 member stood up on the surf board at all times. If he falls off, back to the start!

Try to win the course.

Then try your hands at a game of **Ulu Maika**. The ball has to go between the tent pegs and then the furthest is the winner. Each patrol gets 10 throws or rolls. Each patrol member must participate in turn.

Scores from Sled race placing and Ulu throw will be added together to get the overall winners for a trophy.
