Camporee Hosts

Registration & Fees

Register online at https://scoutingevent.com/326-91450-216514. Registration closes at midnight March 28th. Registration is open to all Scouts BSA Scouts and Ventures and Adults. Registration includes campsite reservation, access to all events, supplies, and camporee patch.

Cost is \$20.00 for scouts, \$5.00 for adults

Camp Headquarters

The headquarters will be the Smith Admin Building. All administrative, program, and health needs will be handled at the headquarters. Headquarters will be staffed 24 hours a day and during events in case of an emergency. All camp staff can be contacted through the camp headquarters.

Check-in Procedures

Please plan to arrive between 5-8pm. Please send one unit member to registrations at Admin/HQ with health forms and completed unit roster upon arrival at camp. A printout from the scout event registration page is sufficient. Note any changes to the roster when checking in to keep account of people at the camporee during the event. Camporee staff will direct your unit to your campsite at checkin. Notify camporee hosts at Admin/HQ of any unit member departing early from camp for any reason to maintain complete accountability of campers.

Health forms and medical staff

Every Scout and Adult attending Camporee must provide a copy of Parts A & B of the BSA health history form. Medical Staff will be available at the Health Lodge building during the camporee. ALL injuries during the camp must be reported to the camporee medial staff. The units will keep the health forms at there camp sites during the camporee. Prescription medications must be kept in a secure locked box or in a unit leader's care. All medications requiring refrigeration are the responsibility of the individual units.

Adult Leadership

A minimum of two registered adult leaders are required for all trips and outings. All adults camping overnight must be currently registered as an adult volunteer or as an adult program participant in the position(s) they are serving in and be approved by their charter partner where applicable. If your unit has only one registered adult leader in attendance, contact any of the camp hosts and we will combine troop campsites to provide the required supervision.

Campsites

Each unit will set up patrol camps in designated areas. The areas are not marked. Please be courteous to neighboring units when setting up your sites and use only the space you need.

Water and Restrooms

Drinking water will be available at hydrants around camp. Units should bring containers to carry water to their campsites. Every camper should come to Camporee with a personal water bottle.

The restrooms are Central Shower House and Dining Hall. Also, latrines around Camp Cedars may be used. Do not use hydrants or latrines for dish washing.

No **CELLPHONES** are allowed restrooms at any time.

Meals

All meals are unit functions and menus, shopping, transportation, and food storage should be performed by each troop or crew in preparation for the camporee. Units will cook and serve meals and clean up at troop campsites.

Campfires in campsites

Campfires are allowed in troop campsites only within metal fire rings. Contained charcoal fires are allowed for cooking.

Vehicle Parking

Park vehicles and trailers in designated areas. Do not park on the road to allow emergency and service vehicles access. Parking on the grass next to the road is permissible while loading or unloading. For safety reasons, do not move vehicles during the camporee to minimize vehicle traffic while scouts are about.

Check-out Procedures

You will be able to retrieve your health history forms at the Admin/HQ building when checking out. Remember a scout is clean and units are on their honors to police campsite and leave them ready for the next campout. Move any firewood in your campsite to the tree line to allow lawn mowing.

Uniform

The uniform for flag ceremonies and the campfire shows is Units Field Uniform ("Class A"). While at Camporee events, Scouts and Scouters are expected to wear the official Scout uniform or other attire Scout appropriate.

Range Active Safety Meeting

This will be on Friday night at 8:00. It is a must attend if the scout wants to shoot on Saturday, wrist bands will be issued. Please plan on attending the meeting at the HunTel Dining Hall

OA Callout

Will be held after the Campfire show. Any question please let the OA team know at the Friday night leader meeting.

Patrol Awards

Patrols completing events will earn recognition. Winners will be announced during the District Campfire Show. In addition, the award for the cooking competitions

Cooking competition

Patrols are challenged to enter a dish of their Evening Meal in the Camporee Cooking Competition. The rules for the competition are:

- 1. Scouts should prepare their best dish.
- 2. It should be a camp appropriate recipe and prepared at camp.
- 3. Recipe cards must be included when turned in. Unit number, Patrol name, ingredients, how prepared

Qualifying entries will be judged on: Taste, Recipe card turned in, Originality, Suitable for camping. Any method of cooking is acceptable for the competition (baking, boiling, broiling, pan frying, simmering, steaming, grilling, foil cooking, and use of a Dutch oven).

Campfire Show

A district-wide campfire show is on Saturday evening. Patrols may provide a skit or song for selection at Friday night SPL/ Adult Leaders' meeting - HunTel Dining Hall. Skits or Song will be of three minutes or less. All Skits and Songs must be approved by camporee staff. Skit and Songs space is limited for time, be prepared to show the skit to staff for placement if needed. The list for the campfire show will be posted in the HQ/Admin building on Saturday by 5:00pm.
