Important Information

All policies in this packet should be read thoroughly. They are intended to ensure a safe, fun and informed weekend.

Medical Staff:

There will be medical staff available at the medical lodge underneath the trading post. ALL INJURIES incurred during the course of the camp must be reported – this is critical for insurance reimbursement and the safety of all scouts.

Health Forms

Current health forms (parts A & B + Insurance card) MUST accompany all units to the camporee for each scout and scouter. Health forms should be kept in an accessible location by each unit.

Parking

To keep campsites open for FUN and to minimize the risk of accidents, we ask that each troop bring only one vehicle with gear to their campsites. Other vehicles should be parked in the main parking lot near the admin building.

Check-in Procedures

Please plan to arrive between 5-8 pm. Send one adult to the admin building (the building with the flagpole near the parking lot) with health forms and an updated roster to register upon arrival to camp.

Meals and Restrooms

Troops must provide their own meals and cracker barrel. Restrooms are available for youth in latrines at each campsite, at the pool shower house, the central shower house, and the south shower house. For youth protection, the restrooms in the dining hall are reserved for adults only.

Camp Headquarters

The headquarters will be at the Dining Hall. After check in, all meeting, administrative, and program needs will be handled at the headquarters. HQ will be constantly staffed during the event in case of an emergency. All camp staff can be contacted through the HQ. The medic will be set up in the med shack, underneath the trading post.

Check-out Procedures

Official check out is not required. Please leave no trace in your campsite. Trash can be left on the back deck of the dining hall, or brought to the dumpsters at the maintenance complex near the entrance of Camp Eagle.

Adult Leadership

It is the policy of the Boy Scouts of America that trips and outings may never be led by only one adult. Two registered adult leaders are required for all trips and outings. Adults must have valid (unexpired) youth protection training. If you do not have two deep leadership, contact any of the camp directors and we will combine your troop with another to provide the required leadership.
