CAMPING

Scheduled activities will conclude at 4:00p, but units are welcome to camp overnight on Saturday on their own.

WHO CAN ATTEND

Registered Cub Scouts, leaders, and parents. Any non-scout youth in grades K-5 must have a parent with them for the entire event.

ADULT LEADERS

In accordance with Youth Protection Policies, each unit MUST provide a minimum of two-deep leadership for the event.

REFUND POLICY

Fees for most district and council activities are transferable to other Scouts within the unit. Partial refunds may be approved for all activities/events/camping programs including Cub Scout Family Weekends, Cub Scout Day Camps, Summer Resident Camps, MAC High Adventure Contingents, National Youth Leadership Training, Wood Badge, Powder Horn, and Exploring Programs. If approved, the refundable amount will be returned using the original method of payment, if possible. Refunds will not be considered for requests made more than two weeks from the conclusion of the activity/event/camp. There will be no refunds under \$10.00. **Refunds will only be considered if one of the following circumstances applies and will not exceed 80% of the fees paid.**

Sickness or Injury (requires a physician's note)

Death in immediate family (requires copy of obituary)

Relocation outside of Mid-America Council borders (requires copy of new BSA registration or military orders)

DAMAGE TO COUNCIL EQUIPMENT
