Note: All participants will be in official uniform (including scout shirt and neckerchief if your unit uses them) before moving to the campsite on Sunday. Participants will have to carry all the gear they bring with them to their campsite – this is usually about 1/4 mile. Pack or duffel bag must be used for getting gear from the drop-off site to the campsite. Participants must not use suitcases, footlockers, or trunks at the campsite. Normal prescribed patrol equipment will be issued. Also, before coming, see that all badges and insignia are properly placed on uniform. DO NOT bring merit badge or OA sashes.

Uniform Expectations & Requirements

Like the Scout badge, the uniform is an emblem of Scouting. A BSA member's uniform is a sign, both to himself or herself and to others, that he or she is a person who can be trusted and depended upon if the need arises. The uniform provides BSA members with self-esteem, pride, and a sense of belonging with others who are wearing the BSA uniform appropriate to his or her BSA unit.

NYLT participants are the current and future leaders of their units. Setting a good example through proper wearing of the uniform is a sign of a leader. Consequently, participants are expected to wear a complete uniform appropriate for their BSA unit for assemblies and special occasions. Because use of the uniform is an important part of the NYLT team building experience, please try to borrow any items you are missing.

A Scout uniform (appropriate for your unit) will be worn for arrival, several course events, and flag ceremonies. For most activities, the field uniform will be used. More casual (but scouting appropriate) clothing may be worn at leisure time in each campsite or as otherwise specified.

Exceptions - Recognizing that some units do not require their youth members to have a full uniform, some exceptions will be made regarding the requirement for uniform shorts or pants. We request that participants wear shorts or pants that are <u>similar in color and fabric to the official uniform</u> (e.g., cargo or hiking shorts or pants in single colors like khaki, brown, green or gray) when the full uniform is to be worn. *Jean, sports, baggy or camo shorts or pants will not be allowed.* Please contact Course Director for Administration Ben Lorenzen (402)-881-2920 if you have questions.

SCOUT UNIFORM:

Short-sleeve uniform shirt (with insignia properly placed) appropriate to your home unit BSA shorts or pants appropriate to your home unit (preferred) (or other camping shorts or pants – see "Exceptions" above)

A BSA belt & buckle appropriate to your home unit (any Boy Scout belt – e.g., web, leather) BSA socks (official) appropriate to your home unit

NYLT hat (furnished)

Unit scarf with slide (if your unit uses one)

Hiking boots or other shoes appropriate for camping and hiking

FIELD UNIFORM:

BSA-related "T"-shirt (NYLT, camp "T"-shirt, or other BSA-related shirt, etc. – you receive 2 NYLT shirts when you arrive)

BSA shorts or pants or similar shorts or pants appropriate for camping (see exceptions above) A BSA belt & buckle appropriate to your home unit (any Boy Scout belt – e.g., web, leather) Socks appropriate for casual wear (nothing with extensive patterns or bright colors)

NYLT hat (furnished)

Hiking boots or other shoes appropriate for camping (you should bring at least two pairs of sturdy footwear with you for the course).
