**Packs will participate in Western activities of fun and learning. Bring your Cowboy skills for a morning of fun and comradery**

**Cost:** The registration fee is \$7 per scout. Early bird fee is \$5 by September 14. Adults are no charge. Registration closes on September 18. Registration is online in the Daniel Webster Calendar. Credit cards and e-checks are accepted online. Cash will not be accepted on the day of the event. Each registered scout will receive a patch with two patches for unit leaders.

**Safety:** All provisions of the Guide to Safe Scouting will be followed at: [www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/gss/toc/](http://www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/gss/toc/). Unit leaders are responsible for using the buddy system, including rules for mixed gender units.

**Medical:** Units must bring BSA Med Form, Parts A & B filled out. They will not be collected but need access in case of a medical emergency. Please report any injuries to district staff present. First responders will be called in case of medical emergencies.

**Weather:** In the event of extreme weather (thunderstorm) staff will do their best to guide you to a safe area. Unit leaders are responsible for the safety of the scouts in their care. Forecasted bad weather might cause the chuckwagon to be canceled.

**Vehicles:** Park vehicles in the designated parking area. Do not drive onto the athletic fields.

**Wagon Design:** Wagons should be home made with a suggested Conestoga wagon design. A commercial wagon is acceptable if the pack can not make or have access to a wagon. Wagons will be scored for design, decoration, and items from inventory list. Homemade wagons will start with a higher score.

**Wagon Crew:** Wagons should be staffed and pulled by scouts. The wagon crew should be more than 4 and less than 8 scouts. It is suggested to have a wagon leader check in at stations. Special needs scouts should notify staff for any needed accommodations.

**Be Prepared:** All scouts must be properly clothed for the weather. If a scout is not properly clothed or does not have proper footwear (no bare feet, flip flops, open toed sandals) they will be asked not to participate. A raincoat should be brought if there is a chance of rain. Scouts should bring liquids to prevent dehydration.

**Adult Involvement:** This event is staffed by adult volunteers from units and districts. **Each participating unit is asked to contribute toward the effort to make this the best event possible.**

**On the course:** Once the event starts, wagons will move clockwise through the stations. Adults are not allowed to coach or assist scouts. Adults are with the group to monitor the health and safety of the wagon crew. If the crew has a leader, that scout should check in when arriving at the next station. Crews will be given a starting station at check in. Some stations may be competitive while others are purely fun.

**Check In:** Packs will check in at arrival. Hand in their wagon roster and payment if not prepaid. The group will receive a map, schedule of events, and scorecard.

**Scores** will be given on Best Wagon, Scout Spirit, Teamwork, Completing all activities, and times in the competitive events.

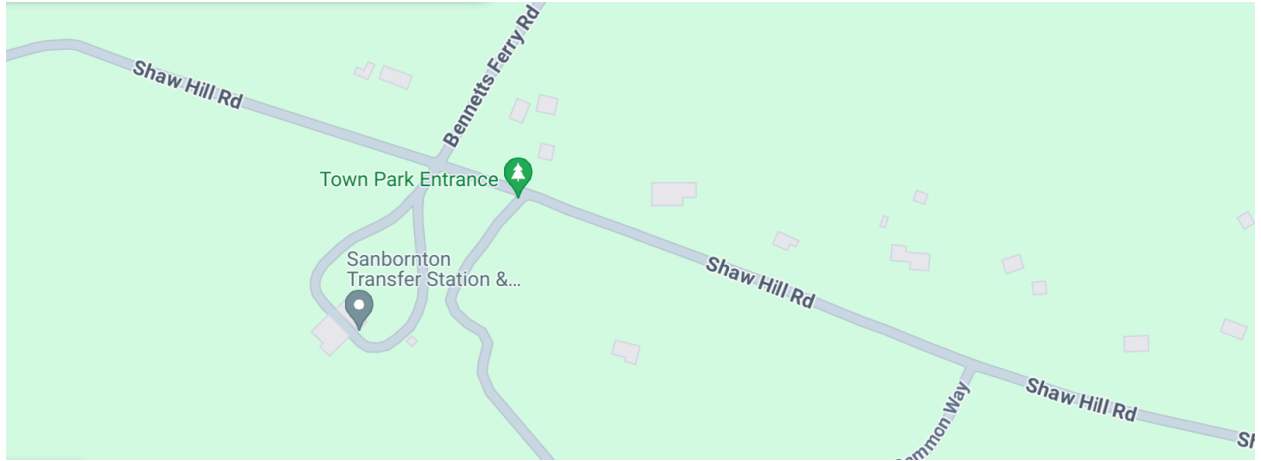

- Full Water Bottle per Scout

- Class A or B scout shirt per Scout

- Pack Flag – great way to demonstrate SCOUT SPIRIT!

- 36” Rope per Scout
- Compass – the type with a baseplate to orient onto a map.
