In questioning if the scout completed the requirement, ask did the scout do it to the best of their ability? If yes, then a Scout BSA can sign off the requirement, if the BSA scout does not believe so, then ask the AOL to complete the task again or give further explanation. Location: Scoutcraft **Time frame:** 45 minutes

The requirements that need to be covered in this station:

- 1. Explain and show with example what the Scout Basic Essentials are.
- 2. Show how to properly pack for an overnight campout and how to carry your gear.
- 3. (not covered)
- 4. Learn how to locate camping locations. A map of Hidden Valley will be provided.
- 5. Use tinder, kindling, and fuel wood to demonstrate how to build a fire under the supervision of an adult. After allowing the fire to burn safely, safely extinguish the flames with minimal impact to the fire site.
- 6. This will be completed by the AOL's assisting in campsite set-up, leaders can sign off on this requirement.
- 7. Learn safe food handling and cleanup.
- 8. Explain what the Outdoor Code and the Leave No Trace Principles means.

ITW will provide cards for scouts with Outdoor Code & Principals printed on them.

Requirements Offered:

This station covers AOL Outdoor Adventurer requirements 1, 2, 4, 7, & 8 Requirements 5 & 6 can be covered by the scout at the campsite.

- a. Serious bleeding
- b. Heart attack or sudden cardiac arrest
- c. Stopped breathing
- d. Stroke
- e. Poisoning
- 3. Show how to help a choking victim.
- 4. Show how to treat for shock.
- 5. Demonstrate how to treat at least five of the following:
 - a. Cuts and scratches
 - b. Burns and scalds
 - c. Sunburn
 - d. Blisters on the hand or foot
 - e. Tick bites
 - f. Bites and stings of other insects
 - g. Venomous snakebite
 - h. Nosebleed
 - i. Frostbite

Attend the Sunday hike.



- 4. Find out how different trees deal with wildfire.
- 5. Learn how wildlife uses the selected tree.

The requirements that need to be covered in this station:

- 1. Review and have scouts demonstrate the Scout knife safety rules
 - a. **Stop** make sure no one else is within arm's reach
 - b. Away always cut away from your finger or other body parts
 - c. **Sharp** a sharp, clean knife is a safe knife
 - d. Store knives closed, in a sheath or knife block
- 2. Review and scouts demonstrate the knife safety circle.
- 3. Explain how scouts should care for and use a knife safely.
- 4. Have scouts demonstrate how to properly use a pocketknife.
- 5. Practice cutting fruits and or vegetables

Knot Tying

The Into the Woods Staff acknowledges that this is not officially a Cub Scout adventure, but believes this is an essential outdoor skill, promotes problem solving, teaches patience and focus and helps them to connect to a scouting tradition.

A troop that chooses this station will have to have AOL Scouts complete 2 of the following knots. The Troop may choose to deliver the lesson / materials in a creative way.

ITW will provide rope and whipping supplies .QR Codes below provide visual instruction.

Location: Field between admin building and Trading post

Time frame: 30 Minutes

Suggested Ideas for knot tying and their uses:

1. **Square Knot** - Commonly used for tying bandages or securing non weight bearing parcel.



2. Half Hitch - Securing tents/tarps and/or hanging clothing lines.



3. **Taut-line** -Free sliding knot used for hanging hammocks or securing loads to vehicles to allow for adjustment.



Knot Tying - continued

4. **Sheet Bend** - Securing critical loads or connecting two ropes/lines together.



5. **Bowline** - Tying a line around a post, tree or yourself or used as a grip to pull or rescue someone.



6. **Clove Hitch** - Starting or ending lashings, affixing objects like a carabiner to the midpoint of a rope, securing loose ends of a long rope.
