

Mission

The University of Scouting is the only time during the year where you can find, all in one place, the widest variety of training opportunities in all program areas. Whether you are new to the program or a veteran of many years, the University provides interesting courses for everyone.

What is the University of Scouting? Who Should Attend?

The University of Scouting is a fun filled, hands - on training event and an opportunity to network with other Scouters. This one-day training event is designed for ALL Cub Scout, Scouts BSA, Sea Scout and Venturing Leaders. In addition, we have training opportunities and courses for youth ages 10 and up – Scouts BSA and Venturers. There is also an opportunity to take Leader Specific training for your Scouting position. Parents interested in becoming more involved may also attend. If you're not sure, ask! For our littlest Cub-aged children, our FUNiversity Day Camp is available for children ages 5-10. We truly want this to be a family-oriented event.

How do I Register? What is the Cost? What's Included?

Fee includes attendance to seven courses, lunch, refillable drinks throughout the day (so bring a mug or water bottle), course handouts, and it covers administrative costs. Some courses have additional individual course fees so please see the course guide.

Coffee will be provided for breakfast. Hot drinks, coffee, water, and "bug juice" will be provided throughout the day (please bring a coffee mug to help us avoid waste). Lunch includes: 12" sub from Tony's Pizza – be sure to designate your type of sub from the choices given when you register. Chips and a Cookie are also included.

What Should I Wear and Bring?

Be prepared! University of Scouting recommends a full Uniform- if you have a name tag, wear it so others can remember you! Other than a desire to learn, you may want to bring a pen and paper for notes. Please also bring your coffee mug/water bottle to help us avoid waste.

** Scouts attending Merit Badge classes should bring all the necessary Merit Badge prerequisite work to the event. Any printed workbooks containing requirements should be checked BEFORE the event to ensure they are up to date with the most current requirements.

Degree Program FAQs

What is the University of Scouting Degree Program?

Legacy Councils Iroquois Trail and Western New York Scout Council developed and honed this program to ensure leaders, and scouts, are rewarded for furthering their knowledge and scouting experiences.

The Degree program provides a structured process by which participants can gain further knowledge and the tools necessary to become a more effective leader and role model within the Scouting community. Participation in the Degree program is entirely voluntary and adherence to the degree requirements is totally the responsibility of the participant. In return, the Degrees combine a path for increased learning with a reward system to recognize each level of achievement.

What are the requirements?

The requirements are outlined on the previous pages for each Degree.

Who can apply for the program?

The Degree Program is open to all Adult Scouters and Scouts ages 14 to 18.

How do I enroll?

Please fill out the application form in this packet and present it on the day of the event to the registration stations. All Degrees will be reviewed and evaluated on participation due to the merging of our records. Degrees will be awarded at a future date.
