

Cub Scout Day Camp COVID-19 Policies

The following policies were developed under the direction of Council Physician and Health Supervisor Dr. Peter Parkin. For the Health and Safety of our Scouts and their family's compliance with these policies are required of all staff, youth, and adult participants during Cub Scout Day Camp.

- Temperature Checks: Upon arrival everyone must be checked in and have their temperature checked and recorded. Anyone who have a fever above 100.2 degrees will not be allowed to participate. If one person in a vehicle has a fever, everyone will be asked to go home. Anyone who leaves prior to the end of the day must sign out.
- Pre-Camp health screenings: Along with temperature checks, a pre-camp health screening will be completed daily for all adult and youth participants.
- Social Distancing between members of separate households of a minimum of 6 feet is required whenever possible.
- Face Coverings are required whenever members of separate households are closer than 6 feet to each other. Face coverings are required at all times in all buildings.
- No Direct Personal Contact between members of separate households.
- Program supplies and materials must be sanitized between use by individuals from separate households. Scouts will not share markers, glue bottles, craft supplies, bows, etc. without the items first being sanitized. (Each scout will have their own set of materials that are not easily cleaned for use for the week which will either be sanitized or disposed of at the end of the week)
- Hand sanitizer will be readily available. All participants are strongly encouraged to frequently sanitize their hands and are encouraged to bring their own personal supply as well if desired.
- Disinfecting Wipes will be available in the porta-potties. Participants are encouraged to wipe down touched surfaces after use.
- Bottled water will be provided. We will have a dedicated staff member handing out water upon request.
- Parents, Adult Leaders, and Staff are expected to remind Scouts of these policies and make sure they are being followed by all.
