- \$20 Regular registration for Adults & Scouts BSA, deadline is March 3rd 11:59pm.
- \$10 Regular registration for Cub Scout Day Camp, deadline is March 3rd 11:59pm. Children do not need to be registered with the BSA to attend Day Camp.
- \$25 Late registration for Adults and Scouts BSA starts March 4th until March 18th 11:59pm. Note: You still have last chance to order lunch.
- \$30 "Walk-in" registration on March 25th the day of the event. Note: No lunch is available.

Last day to make changes (add/drop courses or change lunch options) is **11:59pm on March 18**th when registration officially closes.

Included in Registration

The per person registration fee includes attendance at 8 University of Scouting courses, a patch, morning refreshments and lunch.

Pre-Registration

The anticipated attendance of this event requires advance scheduling. To ensure the best possibility of attending your desired courses, early registration is essential. Some classes sell out. Please sign up as early as possible to ensure the best experience.

Onsite Registration/Walk- ins

We will offer onsite registration the day of the event for an additional cost. Due to class availability, we cannot promise your desired classes will still be available the day of the event. Please try to avoid walking-in, and missing those courses. Lunch will not be available for walk-in participants.

Registration

During registration, leaders and adults will be asked to build your schedule for the day by selecting a course for each of the seven instructional periods (1,2,3,4,6,7,8,9) or blocks of Merit Badges (periods 1& 2, 3&4, 6&7, 8&9) for Scouts BSA. For the Cub Scout Day Camp, please register you child for the correct age group.

Event Cancellation/Refund Policy

A full refund is given if a registration is cancelled within 30 days before the event. If a registration is cancelled 2 week and 30 days before the event is given a 50% refund. Within 2 weeks of the event, a refund is at the discretion of the event coordinator or staff advisor.

Course Change & Cancel Policy

The University of Scouting reserves the right to cancel or reschedule courses in order to accommodate the largest number of Scouters & Instructors. If a change is made to a course you registered to take, you'll be contacted to have your schedule reflect the change.

Weather Cancellation:

What Should I Wear?

As we gather as a Scouting Community - All Scouts, Scouters, and Volunteers should wear their full Field Uniform (Class A) if possible. Uniforms are not required for Day Camp attendees.

What is The Midway?

We will have variety of Scouting Program Contributors along with vendors and companies that provide services or program opportunities to Scouting units on site. They will be located downstairs in the Cafeteria so be sure to check them out when you have time.

Class Schedules, Patches, and Blue Cards

An information packet for preregistered participants must be picked up at the Registration Area when you arrive. In this information packet you will find a personalized class schedule (including room assignments), and the 2023 University of Scouting patch.

Certifications and Credit for BSA Classes

Certifications and credit for official BSA training courses will be handled by the instructors of those courses.

Please make sure you have your pre-requisites done, and have let your Scoutmaster know you are planning on taking any Merit Badges. Blue Cards will be available online after the event for downloading and printing; the event site does not upload requirements automatically into Scoutbook.

University of Scouting Degrees

Due to the timing of this event with our upcoming merger between Councils, the usual University of Scouting Degree requirements, as well as patches/rockers, will be on hold for this year. We look forward to seeing you again next year as we take the time to revamp the requirements and patch design as one united Council.

Cub Scout Day Camp FAQs

We will be hosting a Day Camp for boys and girls in Kindergarten through 5th Grade during University of Scouting to help enhance the family friendly atmosphere. This Day camp is designed to give our kids a fun day of activities and adventure, while parents and siblings can enjoy attending University of Scouting courses.

Who can attend U of S Day Camp?

Any youth that is currently in Kindergarten through 5th Grade can attend Day Camp. The Day Camp is open to both Boys and Girls, and attendees do NOT have to be registered as Scouts to attend. All kids are welcome.

What is the cost of Day Camp?

We kept the cost minimal at \$10 to cover the cost of lunch. There is no additional charge for late registration for Day Camp.

What is the program?

We are planning a day filled with fun activities that appeal to all kids ages 5-10. We will have various arts and craft stations that include slime making, writing stories, and playing with water beads. The kids will have their own Pinewood Derby and get to practice their archery skills on an indoor blow-up range. We will have the American Red Cross come to teach the kids about first aid, safety and emergency preparedness through "Prepare with Pedro" (younger children) and the "The Pillowcase Project" (older children).

Our program is designed to be flexible based on the age of our registered participants, so that we can make sure all of our activities are fun and engaging for everyone who attends.

* Note: Actual day-of activities may vary dependent upon available volunteers, supplies and schedules.

Kids Day Camp FAQ's For Youth in Grades K-5

What should our kids bring?

All kids should bring a water bottle, and wear comfortable play clothing suitable for both indoor and outdoor activities. We are Scouts, so any time we can get outside, we do it!

Lunch & Food

Day Camp Attendees will eat lunch at the same time as their parents or guardians and will eat lunch together as a group. We will have snacks available in the morning and afternoon.

Staff

Our Day Camp will be staffed with trained BSA Volunteers and Camp Staff that have extensive experience in providing a fun and safe environment for our kids. All Staff have BSA Youth Protection training, which is renewed every two years.

Youth Safety

The safety of our kids is our number one priority. We will maintain or exceed all required staff to youth ratios as defined by NY State and the BSA. Day Camp attendees and parents will have wristbands with matching numbers/colors which will be used for check in and check out procedures.

STEM Camporee FAQs

What is a STEM Camporee?

We are excited to bring back our 2nd Annual STEM Camporee this year for Scouts BSA. Wilderness First Aid (WFA) 2023

Troop, Venture and Arrow of Light leaders are all recommended to take this course especially if you plan to conduct outdoor activities such as remote camping, canoeing, long hiking excursions, etc.

Wilderness First Aid is a <u>mandatory requirement</u> for any adult leader taking their unit on a BSA High Adventure trip. Northern Tier, Philmont, Sea Base and Summit Adventure Bases all requires at least one leader of trip crew to hold a WFA certification (Philmont requires both leaders to have it).

Youth can take this course. Boy Scouts requirements: 14 years old minimum, at least First-Class rank and must have completed First Aid Merit Badge. Venture requirements: same age and must have First Aid (may be waived if take Friday's evening intense course, see info below).

- Date: Friday June 9th 7:30pm to Sunday June 11^h, 2023 3:30pm Check in time 6:00-6:30pm on Friday; Gear time to set up before 7:00pm gathering. ** 5:45pm check in required for Friday's class; Gear time to set up before 6:30pm **
- Location: Camp Sam Wood, 7772 Camp Road, Portageville, NY 14536
- Gear: Appropriate clothing for weather, sleeping bag, good hiking boots, Class A, etc. Lean-tos are limited on first come, first basis. Other participants should bring their own tent. Check with Victor Flanagan a week before the course about Covid rules.
- Prerequisite: Prior First Aid and CPR certifications (Adult); Youth, see above
- Fees/Meals: \$75 returnees / \$90 first timers / \$165 for adult & two youth (two sets per unit max) All fees include food (Saturday 3 meals, Sunday 2 meals), book, certifications

\$10 discount off above individual fees if take the First Aid Course at U of S event on Saturday March 25.

Deadline: Online Registration and Payment ends Friday June 3rd 11pm. <u>Not accepted after.</u>

This will ensure your spot in the course and ordering course book. We need ample time to order the books. <u>Space is limited</u>. Maximum course size is 20 participants.

Adult leaders should have First Aid and CPR training and certification completed from any approved agency. Those participants should brush up on First Aid and CPR concepts prior coming to the course. Those who do not, Friday evening intense course will be offered for additional \$15 on top of course fee. This course starts promptly at 6:30pm and runs for 4 hours. Starting time is paramount in order to finish in 4 hours.

Course will issue certification cards on CPR and Wilderness First Aid. Certification will be through Emergency Care & Safety Institute (ECSI). ECSI is BSA approved instructional course.
