A summer camp experience for cub scouts is both the culmination of a year-round program, and a motivator for both the scout and parents to continue with cub scouting through the next year. Every Pack should make plans now to deliver on our promise of an outdoor program. It's important to identify and make parents aware of the person who will coordinate the Pack's camping plans.

When a Scout and their family join cub scouting, they are joining an organization that values the fun and excitement of experiencing the outdoors. Each Cub Scout Pack needs to provide its Scouts with fun, safe, and positive outdoor experiences. This may be a cub scout's first organized overnight outdoor activity.

Camp Merz offers a variety of opportunities to fulfill a parents and Scouts' need for fun, excitement and adventure. They provide a natural setting to be a part of the magic of scouting in the great outdoors. We have outlined the different programs in this booklet. Our camps programs are rank (age) appropriate for your Scouts. What will we do at camp?

We offer handicrafts, nature, archery, BB guns, Sling Shots, field sports, boating, fishing, S.T.E.M, and swimming are just some of the awesome adventures we have at camp. Cub Scouts can only earn requirements for Range and Target activities at an approved site and camp is that place!

Webelos and Arrow of light campers will also offer special programs designed for Webelos and AOL to learn team building and scouting skills to help prepare them to become part of the troop. While at camp, Webelos and AOL will fulfill many of the outdoor requirements and electives. When a cub spends time at camp they will get as much program as they would get attending 62 den meetings. That's right, 62!



Leaders, use your resources to help at camp!

Did you know you do not have to be a leader in the Pack to come to camp? Any interested adult can act as a leader at camp. **You don't have to come every day;** you can make arrangements with other leaders/parents in your Pack to split up the schedule so there is always leadership for your Scouts. But we're sure you'll want to stay all weekend. Camping is a great way to spend quality time with your child. You don't need to know anything about camping. Our staff will have programs all day and most evenings for you and your cub scouts to enjoy. Think of it as a vacation in the woods that you don't have to plan! Want to be a kid again? Come to camp just for the adventure!

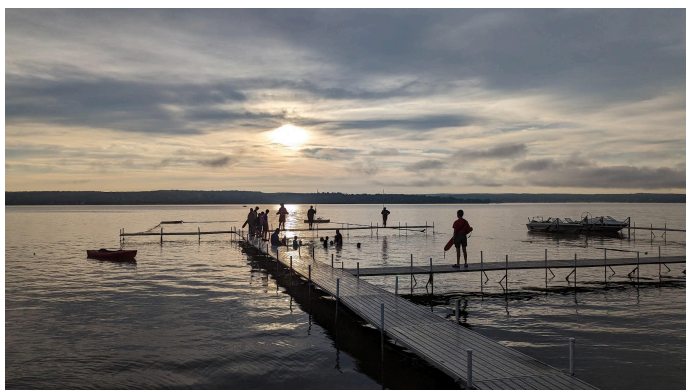


Accommodations

Each campsite has tents on platforms with metal spring cots. We will do our best to provide mattresses for leaders, but we cannot guarantee that there will be enough. We **DO NOT** provide mattresses for Scouts, it's recommended to bring cardboard or a foam pad. **Each site also has at least one picnic table and one pavilion.** Each site has a latrine building and running water. **We cannot guarantee all leaders will get individual tents or mattresses.**

About our Camp Staff...

Our resident camp staff members go through a rigorous training program prior to the start of camp. Many of our area directors, all of our program directors and camp directors attend National BSA Camp School. Our camp management teams have been working hard to make 2025 our best camping season yet. Our camp has at least one Health Officer who is a trained EMT or RN and is in camp at all times to tend to any medical needs that may arise. The safety of your Scout is our number one priority at camp.



Cub / Webelos Adventure Camp

Our Council operates a fully accredited resident camp at Camp Merz, located on Chautauqua Lake near Mayville, NY

Cub / Webelos Camp allows Cubs to experience the outdoors in a fun safe environment. Scouts get to participate in many different areas of adventure, such as swimming, boating, archery, BB gun, crafts, and sports which include soccer and volleyball and much more. Scouts work on age-appropriate programs run by our trained staff. They stay in tents and sleep on cots, and have nutritious meals provided in the dining hall during their stay.

Camp Merz is \$340, if paid in full by May 15th; after May 15th \$365.
Adult fee is \$200. One free for every 10 Scouts.

Training Opportunities:

This year all camp leaders will have the chance to do the Baloo Training. This training is a great resource for a unit as well as Scouting America guidelines says every Pack needs one (1) Baloo trained leader to take the unit camping. What a better time than at camp!

NEW Provisional Camping/ Day Camping

New this year we are offering Provisional and Day camping. If a scout can not attend with their unit we are able to have them camp with an assigned Cubmaster and assistant Cubmaster and still enjoy the fun of camping out. More of a Day camp kid, that's great! This year we are also offering Day Camp for kids. Scouts will have the opportunity to come in the morning and leave in the afternoon.

Pre-Camp Leaders Meeting and Parent Orientation

There will be pre-camp leaders' meetings on Thursday, May 8th at 6:30 PM and Saturday, May 10th at 10 AM at camp to give leaders a chance to get all the up to date information about camp programs, look at schedules, and review important information to make your stay at camp a comfortable and enjoyable experience. It is highly recommended that at least one Pack leader attends. **It is VERY important that a representative from your pack attends one of these meetings.**

Here is what the cubs should bring:

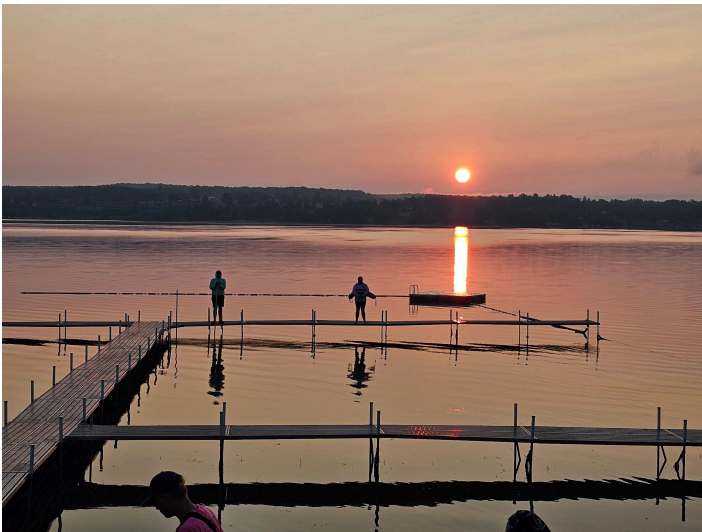
- Health Forms (Mandatory)
- Water shoes (Mandatory)
- Swimsuit
- Towel
- Toiletries
- Extra clothes
- Extra shoes
- Bug Spray (Non- Aerosol)
- Sun Screen (Non- Aerosol)
- Sleeping bag & Pillow
- Rain gear
- Flashlight

Note: Apache, Evergreen, Howard, Jubilee, Mead, Rupert and Yahn have power in site for your medical needs. Please be sure to bring your own extension cords when using in site power.

Medical Forms

Scouts and all adults attending camp **MUST** have forms signed by a physician. Please note that you **MUST** include date and year for all immunizations. If a scout will be taking any over the counter or prescription medications, the Medication Permission Form must be used. And remember you must use the NEW BSA Medical Form parts A & B.
